Match background

Bayer 04 Leverkusen are the visitors to Old Trafford for the first European fixture of David Moyes's reign as Manchester United FC manager.

- For United this is their 18th consecutive UEFA Champions League campaign but for Moyes, it is his first taste of the group stage of a competition that the English title holders won twice under his predecessor, Sir Alex Ferguson.
- This is also the first UEFA Champions League fixture as a coach for Leverkusen's Sami Hyypiä, a winner as a player with Liverpool FC in 2005.

Previous meetings

- Leverkusen overcame United on away goals when the clubs met for the first time in the 2001/02 semi-finals.
- That tie began with a 2-2 first-leg draw at Old Trafford, United leading twice through a Boris Živković own goal (29) and Ruud van Nistelrooy penalty (67) and Leverkusen responding through Michael Ballack (62) and Oliver Neuville (75). Neuville's 45th-minute equaliser back in Germany cancelled out a Roy Keane goal (28), earning Klaus Toppmöller's Leverkusen a 1-1 draw on the night and victory on away goals.
- Ryan Giggs is the only survivor in either squad of that 2002 meeting at Old Trafford while Phil Neville, now United's first-team coach, was an 18th-minute substitute for his brother Gary. Giggs played in the return leg too, with Phil Neville an unused substitute. Dimitar Berbatov, a future United player, featured in both games for Leverkusen.
- United avenged that defeat by beating Leverkusen home and away in the next season's first group stage. Giggs and Neville played in United's 2-1 away success in September 2002, Van Nistelrooy (31, 44) scoring twice before Berbatov (52) pulled a goal back.
- United then prevailed 2-0 back at Old Trafford, Juan Sebastian Verón (42) and Van Nistelrooy (69) scoring after Jan Šimák's early penalty miss for the visitors. United advanced to the second group stage as section winners, with Leverkusen in second place.

- The lineups for that last encounter in Manchester were:

Match background

- This is United's first European fixture without Sir Alex at the helm since 20 March 1985 when Ron Atkinson's side went out of the UEFA Cup in a quarter-final tie against eventual runners-up Videoton FC in Hungary, losing 1-0 on the night and 5-4 on penalties after a 1-1 aggregate draw.
- At home in last season's UEFA Champions League, United beat Galatasaray AŞ and SC Braga but lost their last two such fixtures, to CFR 1907 Cluj and Real Madrid CF, the latter result confirming their elimination in the round of 16. The English title holders have won only three of their last nine home fixtures in UEFA competition and have lost four of the last six.
- United's last home encounter with German opposition brought a 4-1 victory over FC Schalke 04 in the 2010/11 UEFA Champions League semi-finals, a result that secured a 6-1 aggregate triumph. That was their fifth straight home win against visitors from the Bundesliga – Leverkusen were the last to avoid defeat, in 2001/02 – and their overall record is W7 D3 L2.
- Leverkusen won twice on their travels in last season's UEFA Europa League – at Rosenborg BK and SK Rapid Wien – but also lost at FC Metalist Kharkiv and SL Benfica. The latter defeat, 2-1 in Lisbon, ensured their exit in the round of 32.
- This is Leverkusen's UEFA Champions League third group stage appearance since they faced United in 2002/03. On both subsequent occasions – 2004/05 and 2011/12 – they qualified for the last 16. In the second of those campaigns they were grouped with Chelsea FC, losing 2-0 in London in September 2011 but winning 2-1 at home two months later, Eren Derdiyok (73) and Manuel Friedrich (90) scoring.
- Leverkusen are still seeking a first win in England where their record reads W0 D2 L6.
- United won their second European Cup with a 2-1 victory over FC Bayern München in the 1998/99 final in Barcelona.

Team ties

- Moyes played three matches in the European Champion Clubs' Cup for Celtic FC in 1981 and 1982. As Everton FC manager he contested a third qualifying round tie against Villarreal CF in 2005/06, a 4-2 aggregate defeat.

- Moyes' only previous encounter with German opposition was a 2-0 win at 1. FC Nürnberg in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup group stage.
- Hyypiä spent a decade at Liverpool from 1999 to 2009, making 318 Premier League appearances.
- The Finn scored his first goal in English football in Liverpool's 3-2 home loss to United in September 1999 and earned his only red card as a Liverpool player in a 4-0 defeat at Old Trafford in April 2003. Hyypiä's last away game as a Liverpool player was a 4-1 triumph at United in March 2009, leaving him with a record at Old Trafford of W4 D0 L5. He was also in the Liverpool side that beat United 2-0 in the 2003 League Cup final.
- Moyes and Hyypiä were involved in ten Merseyside derby fixtures against each other as Everton manager and Liverpool player respectively. Hyypia won five times with Moyes prevailing twice.
- Shinji Kagawa hit the only goal in Borussia Dortmund's 1-0 win against Leverkusen in February 2012. Overall his record against Leverkusen was W1 D1 L1.
- Derdiyok scored in Switzerland's 2-1 friendly defeat in February 2008 against an England side including Rooney, Rio Ferdinand and Ashley Young.
- Nani and Emir Spahić were both on the scoresheet when the former's Portugal beat the latter's Bosnia and Herzegovina 6-2 in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifying play-off in Lisbon.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- David Moyes is set to take charge of United in Europe for the first time. Nobody but Sir Alex Ferguson has led them in continental competition since Ron Atkinson guided them to the UEFA Cup quarter-finals in 1984/85.
- This is United's 19th UEFA Champions League campaign, one more than FC Barcelona, Real Madrid CF and FC Porto.
- It is also United's 18th successive season in the competition, one more than Madrid.
- Nani serves a one-game ban on matchday one following his red card in last season's round of 16 second leg against Real Madrid CF.

International duty

- The international break saw 12 United players called up for senior duty: Chris Smalling, Michael Carrick, Ashley Young, Tom Cleverley, Danny Welbeck (England), Patrice Evra (France), Nani (Portugal), Fellaini (Belgium), Robin van Persie (Netherlands), Antonio Valencia (Ecuador), Shinji Kagawa (Japan) and Javier Hernández (Mexico).
- Van Persie scored three in two games for the Dutch, including both in the win in Andorra that sealed FIFA World Cup qualification.
- Wayne Rooney was initially called up by England but was ruled out after suffering a gash to his head in training.

General information

- Rooney, wearing a headband to protect the severe gash on his forehead, scored his first goal of the season direct from a free-kick as United beat Crystal Palace AFC 2-0 on Saturday. It was Moyes's first win at Old Trafford in 12 attempts (10 as Everton manager). Fellaini made his debut for the English champions.
- Moyes matched Sir Alex's record of one win, one draw and one defeat from his opening three league matches but Saturday's victory improved on his predecessor's fourth-game loss.
- Van Persie topped the Premier league scoring charts for the second successive year last season, following up his 30 goals for Arsenal FC in 2011/12 with 26 last term. It is the first time a player has been top scorer in consecutive seasons since Thierry Henry topped the charts from 2003/04 to 2005/06.
- Welbeck hit just one league goal last season but doubled that tally in the first game of the new campaign, scoring twice in the 4-1 win at Swansea City AFC.

- Seven Leverkusen players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Lars Bender, Sidney Sam (Germany), Robbie Kruse (Australia), Son Heung-Min (South Korea), Sebastian Boenisch (Poland), Emir Spahić (Bosnia and Herzegovina) and Ömer Toprak (Turkey).
- Bender joined up with the Germany team but did not play in 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifying wins against Austria and the Faroe Islands due to a muscle injury.

- Son scored two goals for South Korea in a 4-1 friendly win against Haiti on 6 September.

General information

- Stefan Kiessling struck two second-half goals as Leverkusen beat ten-man VfL Wolfsburg 3-1 on Saturday. Kiessling is the highest scorer in the Bundesliga in 2013 with 17 goals.
- Before losing 2-0 at FC Schalke 04 on 31 August, Leverkusen had won their first three games, their best start in ten years. The defeat brought to an end a club record run of eight consecutive Bundesliga wins.
- Dominik Kohr (knee) and Niklas Lomb (ankle) were both injured on 6 August in training and are ruled out of matchday one.
- On 26 July Leverkusen announced that last season's 26-goal Bundesliga top scorer Kiessling had extended his contract until 2017.

- Moyes started out with Celtic but spent much of his playing career as an centre-back in England and Scotland's lower leagues.
- The tall Scot appeared more for Preston than for any other club, and it was with the north-west English team that Moyes – ever the keen student of the game – first tested his managerial potential between 1998 and 2002.
- Became regarded as one of the country's most promising young managers, taking Preston from the third tier to the brink of promotion to the Premier League before accepting the Everton job in March 2002.
- Succeeding Walter Smith, he breathed new life into Everton immediately, his first full season seeing Wayne Rooney's emergence and a first top-half finish since 1996. The Blues went on to finish fourth in the Premier League in 2004/05 but missed out on a place in the UEFA Champions League group stage after a qualifying loss to Villarreal CF.
- Moyes subsequently led an Everton team featuring astute signings such as Tim Cahill, Mikel Arteta and Phil Jagielka to three further European qualifications and the 2009 FA Cup final, yet silverware eluded him in his 11 years at Goodison Park. In May 2013, not long after turning 50, Moyes was named as Sir Alex Ferguson's successor as Manchester United manager.

Bayer 04 Leverkusen: Sami Hyypiä

Date of birth: 7 October 1973

Nationality: Finnish

Playing career: Myllykosken Pallo-47, Willem II, Liverpool FC, Bayer 04 Leverkusen

Coaching career: Finland (assistant), Bayer 04 Leverkusen

- Twice a Finnish Cup winner with MyPa, he made his international debut a month after his 21st birthday before joining Willem II in 1995. In 1999 the defender sealed a €4.8m switch to Liverpool, where he won a cup treble in 2000/01 (FA Cup, League Cup and UEFA Cup), adding the UEFA Super Cup and FA Community Shield weeks later.
- In 2004/05 he played every minute of the final as Liverpool came from 3-0 down to beat AC Milan on penalties in the UEFA Champions League showpiece in Istanbul. He was an unused substitute two years later when the Italian side got their revenge.
- After 459 games for Liverpool (and a 100th cap for Finland), the towering centre-back signed for Leverkusen in 2009 and the next year he was named Finnish footballer of the year for the ninth time.
- In May 2011, Hyypiä retired and took a role on the coaching staff of the Finnish national team before returning to Leverkusen the following April as joint coach with Sascha Lewandowski.
- Leverkusen finished third in the Bundesliga in his first season, repeating the feat in 2012/13 before Lewandowski stepped back to a youth coaching position, leaving Hyypiä in sole charge.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

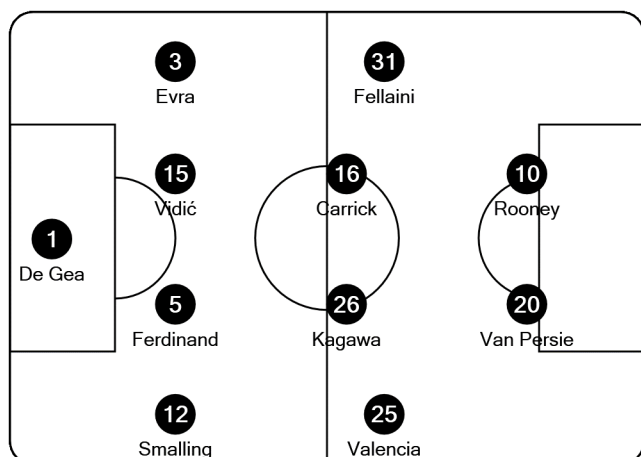

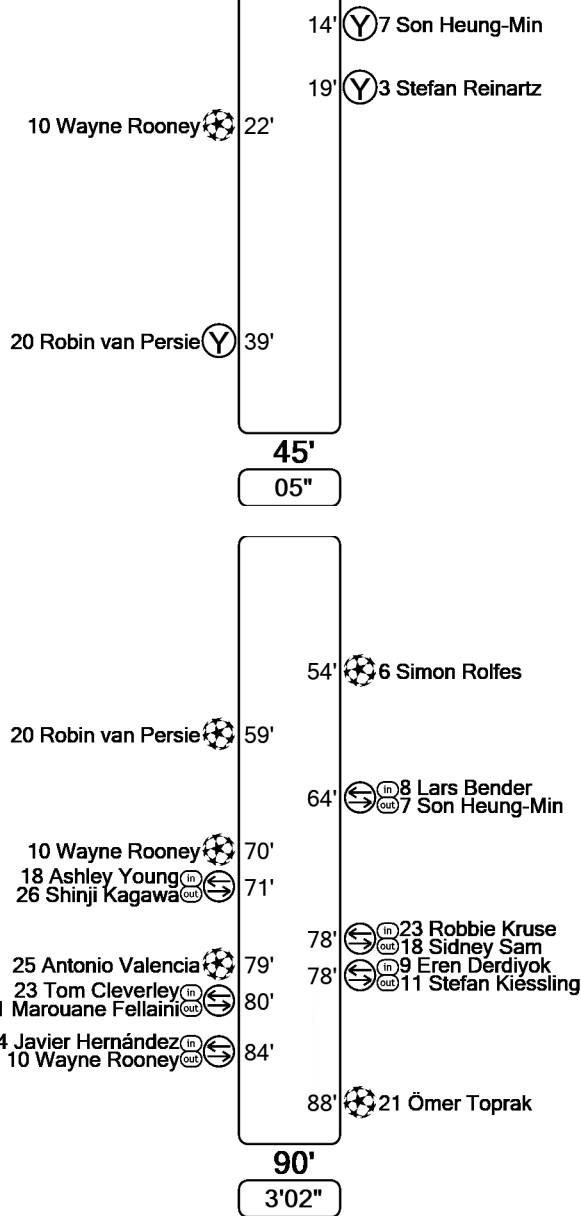

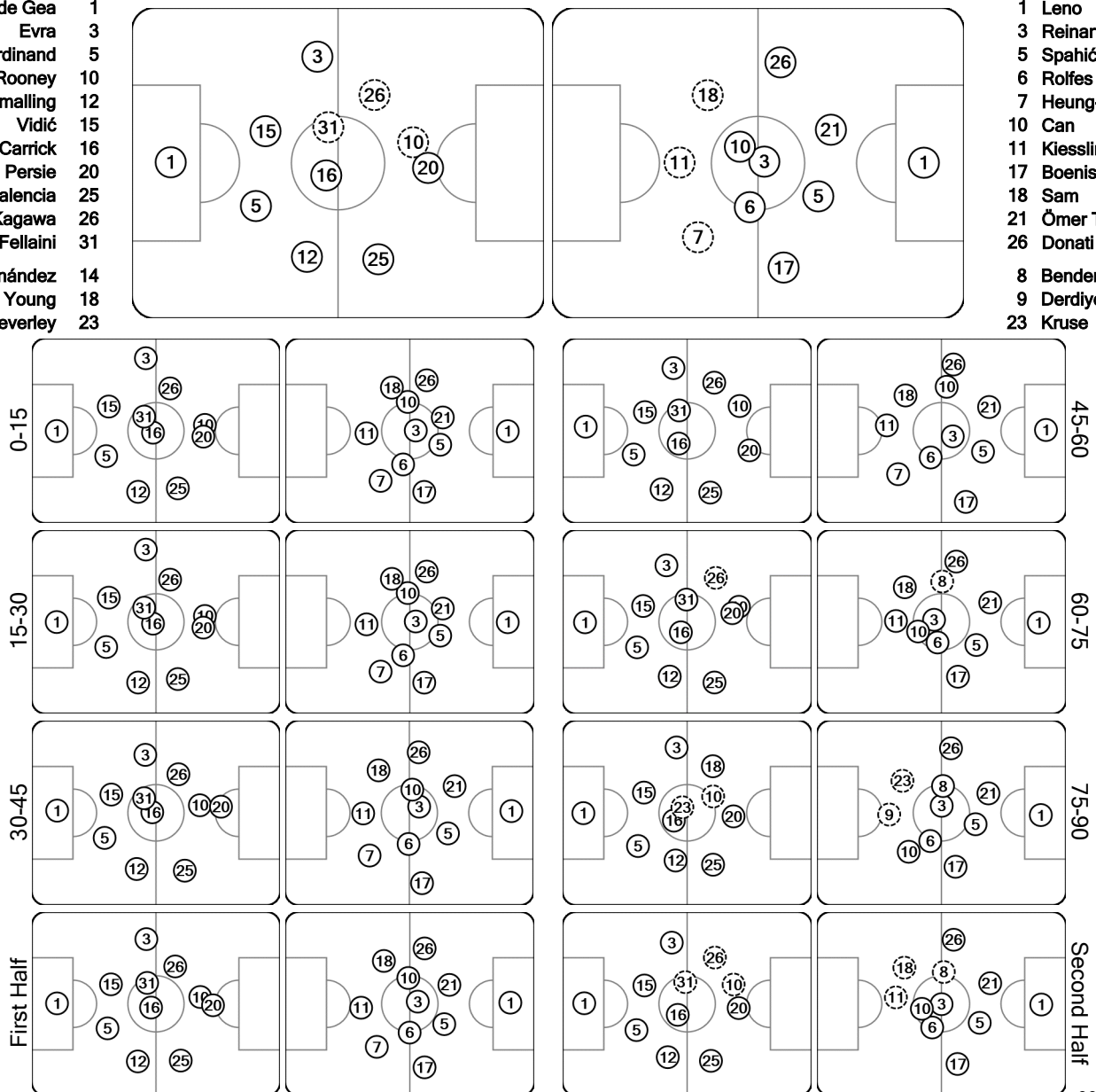
