Match background

Real Madrid CF begin their home campaign in the UEFA Champions League with the visit of FC København, who have never defeated Spanish opponents in eight attempts.

- While the Danish champions began Group B in promising fashion by holding Juventus to a 1-1 draw, Madrid – seeking a tenth European Champion Clubs' Cup – started with a 6-1 win at Galatasaray AŞ in which Cristiano Ronaldo scored a hat-trick.

Previous meetings

- The teams have never met and Madrid have not faced Danish opposition since 1994/95.
- The UEFA Cup third round tie proved something of a surprise with the Spanish giants going down 2-0 at home to Odense BK after winning the away leg 3-2. The fact that Madrid had won all four previous home games against Danish visitors, scoring 23 goals with only one against, underlines the size of Odense's achievement.
- In eight games against Spanish sides København have drawn four and lost four; on their travels their results are D2 L2.
- Their last assignment came in their most recent UEFA Champions League campaign, in 2010/11. Paired with FC Barcelona in the group stage, they lost 2-0 away and drew 1-1 at home.

Match background

- Madrid were Group D runners-up last season behind Borussia Dortmund, who ended their campaign when the teams met again in the semi-finals with a 4-3 aggregate victory thanks mainly to a 4-1 first-leg win in Germany. It was the third successive season Madrid had been knocked out in the last four.
- They began at home with a 3-2 home win against Manchester City FC and also beat AFC Ajax 4-1 at the Santiago Bernabéu with a 2-2 draw against Dortmund in between.
- In the round of 16 the Merengues were held 1-1 at home by Manchester United FC, winning 2-1 away. A 3-0 home win over Galatasaray AŞ in the quarter-final set them up for a 24th semi-final and a 3-2 defeat in Istanbul ensured they got there.
- Three years ago Ståle Solbakken's København finished second in their group behind Barcelona and in their other away games won 2-0 at Panathinaikos FC and lost 1-0 at FC Rubin Kazan. In the round of 16 they lost 2-0 at home to a Chelsea FC team managed by current Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti, drawing 0-0 in London.
- On their travels in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage the Danish champions lost 1-0 away at FC Steaua Bucureşti, drew 0-0 at VfB Stuttgart and won 2-1 at Molde FK.

Team ties

- During his first spell as København coach, Solbakken oversaw four European games against Spanish opposition. His record against Valencia CF, FC Barcelona and Club Atlético de Madrid reads W0 D2 L2.
- Xabi Alonso scored twice in Spain's 3-0 friendly victory against Denmark at Parken on 20 August 2008. Iker Casillas, Sergio Ramos and Lars Jacobsen all featured.
- Ronaldo scored in both Portugal's UEFA EURO 2012 qualifiers against Denmark. He earned them a 3-1 win in Porto on 8 October 2010 – a game which also featured Pepe, Fábio Coentrão and Jacobsen – before a 2-1 loss at Parken 12 months later.
- Kris Stadsgaard played for Málaga CF between 2010 and 2012, making 25 appearances and scoring his only goal in a 4-1 home defeat by Madrid on 16 October 2010.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Madrid's six goals in their opening fixture was more than any other club. All six came from inside the penalty area.
- Madrid had 13 shots on goal in their first game, the joint highest total along with FC Bayern München and Juventus. Cristiano Ronaldo alone had seven shots on target, more than any other player.
- Ronaldo was the 12-goal top scorer in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League. He has found the net 24 times in his last 20 matches in the competition, registering 53 times in all.

General information

- Carlo Ancelotti's seven-match unbeaten start as Madrid boss ended on Saturday with a 1-0 derby defeat at home to Club Atlético de Madrid.
- Bale sustained a left thigh strain while warming up for the Getafe game and missed the 2-1 win at Elche FC three days later but returned as a substitute on Saturday.
- Ronaldo has scored 12 goals in his last seven outings for club and country, though only one in the first 43 minutes of games. Two in the 4-1 win against Getafe CF on 22 September, took him past Hugo Sánchez (208) on the club's all-time scorers' list. Only Ferenc Puskás, Santillana, Alfredo di Stéfano and Raúl González (303) are ahead of him.
- Making his first appearance for Madrid since breaking a finger on 23 January, Iker Casillas was substituted after 15 minutes against Galatasaray with a bruised side. Xabi Alonso has not played since suffering a broken foot in August.
- On 15 September, Ronaldo signed a three-year contract that ties him to Madrid until 2018.

København

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- The last time København were in the UEFA Champions League, in 2010/11, they delivered the best performance by a Danish team, reaching the round of 16 where they were eliminated by Chelsea FC.
- This is København's 150th game in UEFA competition.

General information

- Ståle Solbakken suffered his first defeat since returning as coach on 21 August as a 3-2 loss at Brøndby IF on Saturday left them in the bottom three. Pierre Bengtsson was sent off with 11 minutes remaining.
- The Lions recorded their first home win since mid-March when they rallied from a goal down to beat Odense BK 2-1 on 22 September. Johan Wiland was replaced by Jakob Busk Jensen early on after a blow to the wrist.
- Adi has scored 13 goals in as many appearances in 2013/14, ten in seven for Trenčín and three since moving to København in August.
- Wiland was not involved three days later in a 4-2 win at Hvidovre IF in the Danish Cup third round, a result shaped by César Santin's 34-second opener and Pourié's first FCK goal.
- København made their worst start to a league campaign this season, losing their first three games and having to wait until round seven before recording a win.
- The 4-1 victory at Viborg FF on 1 September ended a 12-match winless run for FCK, who picked up just four points from their last six outings in 2012/13. The form saw Ariël Jacobs sacked five games into the campaign.

Head coach

Real Madrid CF: Carlo Ancelotti

Date of birth: 10 June 1959

Nationality: Italian

Playing career: Parma FC, AS Roma, AC Milan

Coaching career: AC Reggiana, Parma FC, Juventus, AC Milan, Chelsea FC, Paris Saint-Germain FC, Real Madrid CF

- One of only six people to have lifted the European Champion Clubs' Cup as both a player and coach. A combative midfielder, he helped Roma win the 1983 Serie A title and four Italian Cups before joining Milan in 1986 where he added two more league championships, as well as back-to-back European Cup triumphs in 1989 and 1990.
- Began coaching in 1995 with a year at Reggiana, earning them promotion from Serie B, before two seasons at Parma. Replaced Marcello Lippi at Juventus in February 1999 and returned to San Siro as coach of Milan in 2001.
- During eight seasons in charge, won the UEFA Champions League in 2003 and 2007, but lost the 2005 final on penalties to Liverpool FC after leading 3-0. Milan also won a Serie A title, a Coppa Italia and the 2007 FIFA Club World Cup.
- Resigned on 31 May 2009 and was named as Chelsea's new manager the following day. His first season in London ended with the club winning the league and cup double for the first time. Dismissed at the end of his second campaign, Ancelotti took charge of PSG in December 2011.
- In his one full season in the French capital, 2012/13, Ancelotti steered PSG to their first Ligue 1 title in 19 years before leaving to take over at Madrid on a three-year contract.

FC København: Ståle Solbakken

Date of birth: 27 February 1968

Nationality: Norwegian

Playing career: Grue IL, Ham-Kam Fotball, Lillestrøm SK, Wimbledon FC, Aalborg BK, FC København

Coaching career: Ham-Kam Fotball, FC København (twice), 1. FC Köln, Wolverhampton Wanderers FC

- Discovered at lower-league Grue, Solbakken represented Ham-Kam but made his mark as one of Norway's finest midfielders at Lillestrøm between 1994 and 1997, earning the first of his 58 caps for Norway before an ill-starred move to English side Wimbledon.
- A five-month Premier League spell ended with a switch to Denmark's AaB in 1998, where he got his career back on track, starring in the 1998/99 title success. He represented Norway at the 1998 FIFA World Cup and UEFA EURO 2000 prior to joining København for 2000/01.
- His København playing career lasted just 14 league games before Solbakken suffered a heart attack in training on 13 March 2001; he was revived in an ambulance 12 minutes later.
- With a pacemaker fitted he went into coaching with Ham-Kam before unexpectedly being named as Hans Backe's successor at København in 2005 by club chairman Flemming Østergaard, who has Solbakken's playing shirt hanging in his office.
- The first of five title successes in his first season vindicated the decision, Solbakken also leading the club to the 2006/07 and 2010/11 UEFA Champions League group stage – reaching the round of 16 in the latter campaign – and the 2008/09 Danish Cup. After short, unsuccessful spells at Köln and Wolves, returned to København in August 2013 following Ariël Jacobs' dismissal.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

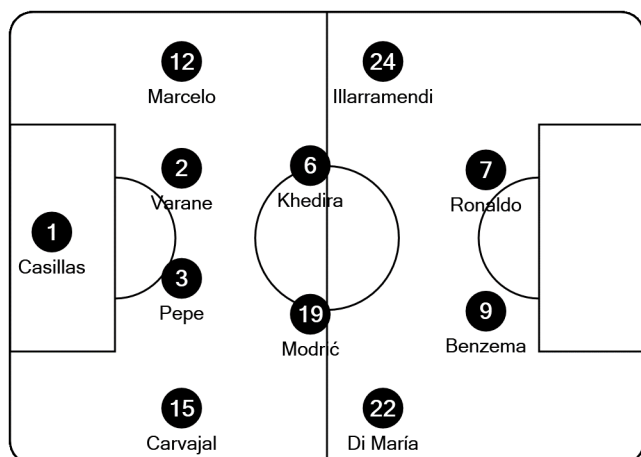

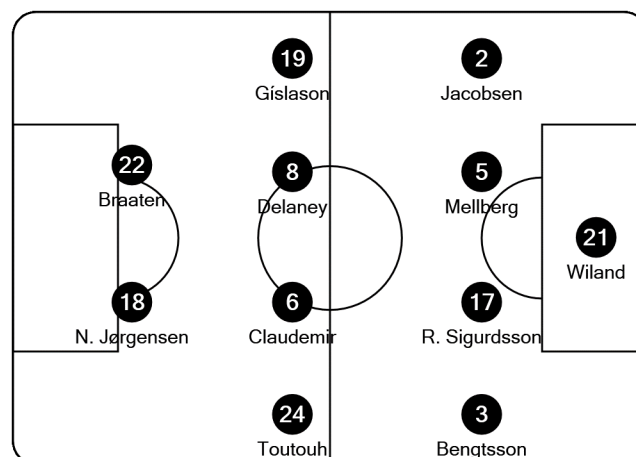

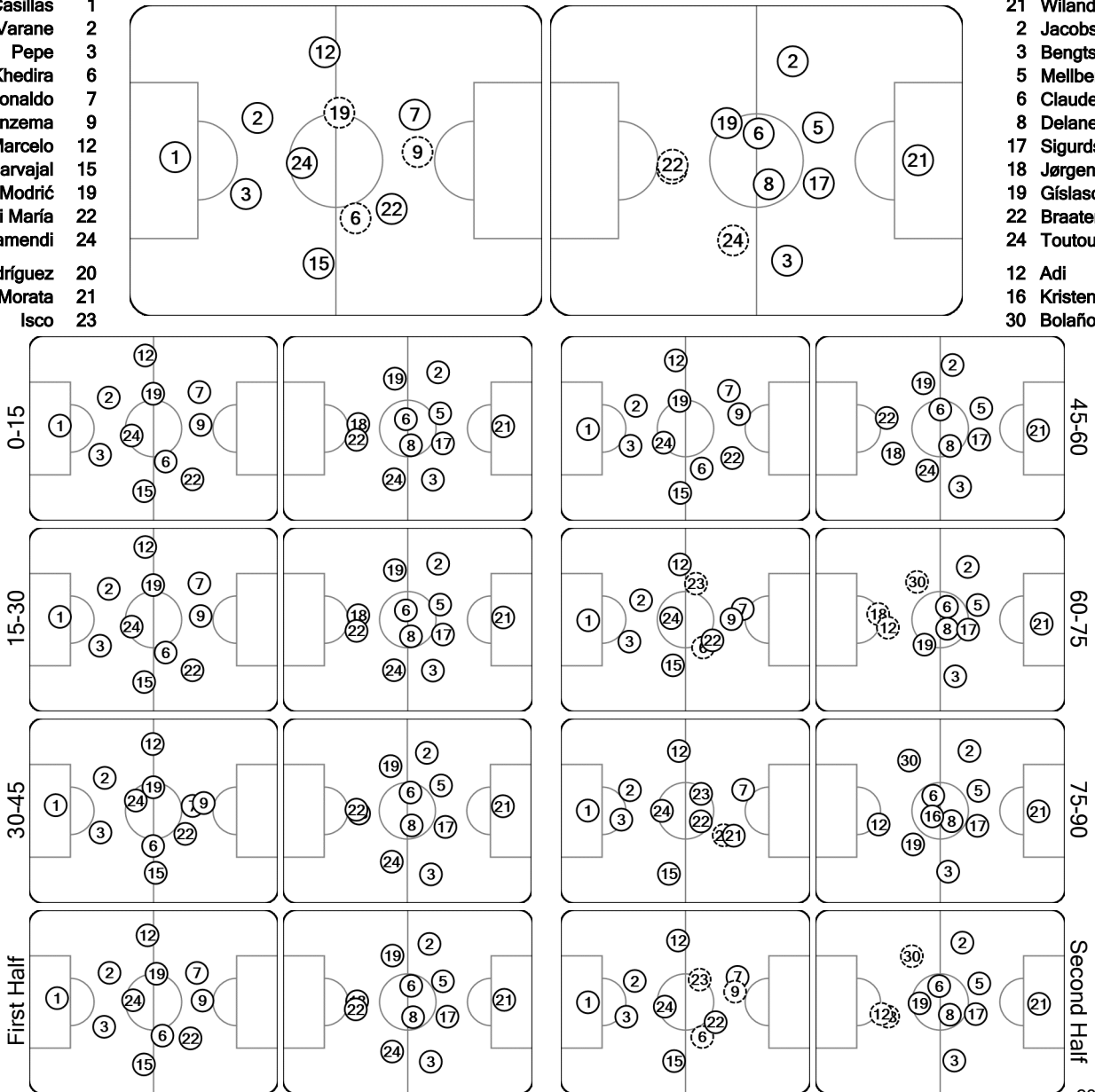
