### **Match background**

Both Galatasaray AŞ and FC København will be trying to put their first win on the board in Group B when the teams meet in Istanbul on matchday three.

• Galatasaray recovered from their 6-1 home defeat against Real Madrid CF by holding Juventus to a 2-2 draw in Roberto Mancini's first game since taking over as coach. The Danish champions began with a 1-1 home draw against Juve before losing 4-0 in Madrid.

#### **Previous meetings**

- The teams are meeting in an official game for the first time and it is also Galatasaray's first experience of facing opponents from Denmark.
- København, who are in their third UEFA Champions League campaign, have met only one Turkish team, lining up against Trabzonspor AŞ in the 1991/92 UEFA Cup third round. They drew 1-1 away after a 1-0 win in Copenhagen.

#### Match background

- Galatasaray are embarking on their second successive UEFA Champions League campaign having not played in the competition since 2006/07 before last season.
- At home in last season's group stage they lost to SC Braga, drew with CFR 1907 Cluj and beat Manchester United FC. With wins in their last three group fixtures they qualified for the knockout rounds and overcame FC Schalke 04 in the round of 16, drawing at home before winning away. In the quarter-finals the Turkish champions lost 3-0 away to Madrid before edging the home leg 3-2.
- Three years ago København finished second in their group behind FC Barcelona and on their travels won 2-0 at Panathinaikos FC, losing by the same score at Barcelona and 1-0 at FC Rubin Kazan. In the round of 16 they lost 2-0 at home to Chelsea FC, drawing 0-0 in the London return.
- On their travels in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage, the Danish champions lost 1-0 away at FC Steaua Bucureşti, drew 0-0 at VfB Stuttgart and won 2-1 at Molde FK.

#### **Team ties**

- København's Parken Stadium was the venue for Galatasaray's finest hour when they beat Arsenal FC 4-1 on penalties in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup final after a goalless 120 minutes. Assistant coach Ümit Davala was in the winning team.
- Albert Riera struck Spain's final goal in a 3-1 win over Denmark in Aarhus in a UEFA EURO 2008 qualifier on 13 October 2007.
- Riera and Olof Mellberg were team-mates at Olympiacos FC in 2010/11, winning the Greek title.
- Bruma scored the penalty winner for Portugal against Denmark in a UEFA European Under-19 Championship elite round game in Barcelos on 9 June 2013 to ensure Portugal went through to the finals as group winners.
- Galatasaray's goalkeeping coach Cláudio Taffarel kept goal for Brazil in a 3-2 win over Denmark in a 1998 FIFA World Cup quarter-final played in Nantes on 3 July 1998.

#### **UEFA** milestones and competition statistics

• Matchday three is Galatasaray's 250th game in UEFA competition.

#### **General information**

- Wesley Sneijder scored twice on Saturday, the second seven minutes from time, as Galatasaray won 2-1 against a Kardemir Karabükspor side who had Sébastien Puygrenier sent off on 56 minutes.
- Hamit Altıntop has not featured since August because of a back problem. Galatasaray reserve goalkeeper Eray İscan, who underwent knee surgery in September, has resumed training.
- Galatasaray parted company with Fatih Terim on 24 September. Assistant coach Hasan Şaş oversaw a 1-1 draw before Roberto Mancini was appointed on a three-year contract on 30 September.
- Mancini's first Süper Lig match ended in a 2-1 defeat at Akhisar Belediyespor on 6 October. With Selçuk İnan and Felipe Melo suspended and Semih Kaya and Engin Baytar carrying knocks, Yekta Kurtuluş and Ceyhun Gülselam made their first league starts of the season in midfield.
- Cimbom's haul of seven points from their first six games was their worst start to a campaign since 1989/90.
- The Turkish champions were leading Beşiktaş JK 2-1 in added time on 22 September when the derby was abandoned because of crowd problems.
- Tugay Kerimoğlu, who won five titles with Galatasaray between 1987 and 1999, has been appointed assistant to Mancini. Bülent Ünder, Terim's assistant between 1996 and 2000, is the club's new head of youth development.

#### International duty

- Nine Galatasaray players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Burak Yılmaz, Umut Bulut, Selçuk İnan, Semih Kaya (Turkey), Didier Drogba (Ivory Coast), Aurélien Chedjou, Dany Nounkeu (Cameroon), Sneijder (Netherlands), Fernando Muslera (Uruguay).
- Burak extended his national-record run of scoring to five successive competitive matches as Turkey beat Estonia 2-0 on 11 October, with Umut also on target. Burak failed to find the net four days later in a 2-0 defeat by the Netherlands, however, when Sneijder struck for the visitors.
- Drogba opened the scoring from the penalty spot as the Ivory Coast beat Senegal 3-1 in the first leg of their FIFA World Cup play-off.

#### København

#### **UEFA** milestones and competition statistics

- The last time København were in the UEFA Champions League, in 2010/11, they delivered the best performance by a Danish team, reaching the round of 16 where they were eliminated by Chelsea FC.
- Ståle Solbakken, who returned as coach on 21 August, has overseen all 16 of FCK's UEFA Champions League games to date.

#### **General information**

- København were 3-0 winners at home to Aalborg BK on Sunday, their first clean sheet in 18 games in all competitions since a 0-0 draw with Brøndby IF in May.
- Adi has scored 13 goals in 15 appearances in 2013/14, ten in seven for FK AS Trenčín and three since moving to København in August.
- København made their worst start to a league campaign this season, losing their first three games and having to wait until round seven before recording a win.
- The 4-1 victory at Viborg FF on 1 September ended a 12-match winless run for FCK, who picked up just four points from their last six outings in 2012/13. The form saw Ariël Jacobs sacked five games into the campaign.
- The Lions recorded their first home win since mid-March when they rallied from a goal down to beat Odense BK 2-1 on 22 September.

#### International duty

- København had seven players on senior duty during the international break: Lars Jacobsen (Denmark), Johan Wiland, Pierre Bengtsson (Sweden), Daniel Braaten (Norway), Ragnar Sigurdsson, Rúrik Gíslason (Iceland), Cristian Bolaños (Costa Rica).
- · Sigurdsson and Gíslason featured as Iceland beat Cyprus and then drew 1-1 with Norway to seal second spot in

FIFA World Cup qualifying Group E and a play-off place. Braaten scored for the Norwegians.

### Head coach

### Galatasaray AŞ: Roberto Mancini

Date of birth: 27 November 1964

Nationality: Italian

Playing career: Bologna FC, UC Sampdoria, SS Lazio, Leicester City FC

Coaching career: ACF Fiorentina, SS Lazio, FC Internazionale Milano, Manchester City FC, Galatasaray AŞ

- Spent the majority of his playing career in Italy, winning Serie A titles and UEFA Cup Winners' Cups with both Sampdoria and Lazio as well as six editions of the Coppa Italia, four with Sampdoria and two with Lazio. Capped 36 times by Italy, the forward was a bronze medallist at the 1990 FIFA World Cup.
- Started his coaching career as assistant to Sven-Göran Eriksson at Lazio before replacing Fatih Terim at Fiorentina in 2001. After leading the Viola to the Coppa Italia, he returned to Lazio and repeated that feat as well as steering the Roman club into the UEFA Champions League and to the UEFA Cup semi-finals in 2002/03.
- Became coach of Inter in July 2004, replacing Alberto Zaccheroni one day after terminating his contract with Lazio; led the Nerazzurri to Coppa Italia glory in his debut season, Inter's first domestic honour since the 1989 Scudetto. After Juventus were stripped of their 2005/06 title and AC Milan suffered a points penalty, Inter were finally crowned champions of Italy again. Mancini repeated that success in 2006/07.
- Left Inter in May 2008 despite winning another title and replaced Mark Hughes as manager of Manchester City midway through the 2009/10 Premier League season. City finished fifth in his first campaign, third in his second when they also lifted the FA Cup and dramatically won the top flight for the first time in 44 years on the final day of his third.
- City finished second the following season, but Mancini was sacked two days after losing to Wigan Athletic FC in the 2013 FA Cup final. Mancini replaced Terim again that September, signing a three-year deal with Galatasaray.

### FC København: Ståle Solbakken

Date of birth: 27 February 1968

**Nationality:** Norwegian

**Playing career:** Grue IL, Ham-Kam Fotball, Lillestrøm SK, Wimbledon FC, Aalborg BK, FC København **Coaching career:** Ham-Kam Fotball, FC København (twice), 1. FC Köln, Wolverhampton Wanderers FC

- Discovered at lower-league Grue, Solbakken represented Ham-Kam but made his mark as one of Norway's finest midfielders at Lillestrøm between 1994 and 1997, earning the first of his 58 caps for Norway before an ill-starred move to English side Wimbledon.
- A five-month Premier League spell ended with a switch to Denmark's AaB in 1998, where he got his career back on track, starring in the 1998/99 title success. He represented Norway at the 1998 FIFA World Cup and UEFA EURO 2000 prior to joining København for 2000/01.
- His København playing career lasted just 14 league games before Solbakken suffered a heart attack in training on 13 March 2001; he was revived in an ambulance 12 minutes later.
- With a pacemaker fitted he went into coaching with Ham-Kam before unexpectedly being named as Hans Backe's successor at København in 2005 by club chairman Flemming Østergaard, who has Solbakken's playing shirt hanging in his office.
- The first of five title successes in his first season vindicated the decision, Solbakken also leading the club to the 2006/07 and 2010/11 UEFA Champions League group stage reaching the round of 16 in the latter campaign and the 2008/09 Danish Cup. After short, unsuccessful spells at Köln and Wolves, returned to København in August 2013 following Ariël Jacobs' dismissal.

### **Competition facts**

#### **UEFA Champions League: Did you know?**

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.






