

Match background

SL Benfica and RSC Anderlecht meet for the first time in nine seasons as they get proceedings in Group C of the UEFA Champions League under way, although it is a tie from 31 seasons ago that will stir the most significant memories.

• Although both clubs have won three of their eight meetings, the Belgian side had the upper hand the last time they played and also when the teams faced off in the 1983 UEFA Cup final.

Previous meetings

- The teams last met in the 2004/05 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round when Benfica won 1-0 in Lisbon Zlatko Zahovič scoring the only goal in the 13th minute but then lost 3-0 away. Olivier Deschacht, Anthony Vanden Borre and Anderlecht assistant coach Besnik Hasi all played in the games, as did Luisão.
- The teams for the encounter at the Estádio do Sport Lisboa e Benfica on 10 August 2004 were: **Benfica:** Quesnel, Argel, Almeida, Petit, Zahovič (Aguiar 60), Dos Santos, Simão, Miguel, Šokota (Karadas 72), Rocha, Pereira.

Anderlecht: Zítka, Deschacht, Żewłakow (Vanden Borre 83), Lovre, Kompany, Baseggio, Hasi, Wilhelmsson, Dindane, Traoré, Mpenza (Yashchuk 77).

- In eight meetings each side has posted three home wins and two draws (one home, one away). In the 1987/88 European Cup quarter-finals Benfica's 2-0 home win saw them through despite a 1-0 reverse in the return.
- In the 1983 UEFA Cup final Anderlecht defended their 1-0 home win with a 1-1 draw in Lisbon.
- · Benfica assistant coach Minervino Pietra and the club's technical secretary Shéu Han both played in that final.
- In nine games against other Belgian sides Benfica have only succumbed once, winning six and drawing two. Anderlecht will be looking for their first win in Portugal in a competitive fixture. In a total of nine visits they have lost six and drawn three.

Match background

- Benfica, in their ninth participation, finished third in their group last season. They began with a 0-0 draw away to Celtic FC and at home lost 2-0 to FC Barcelona before beating FC Spartak Moskva 2-0 and Celtic 2-1.
- The Portuguese side subsequently entered the UEFA Europa League and won all four home games en route to the final, where they lost 2-1 to Chelsea FC. Óscar Cardozo's penalty drew Benfica level following Fernando Torres' opener only for Branislav Ivanović to head a winner in the last minute of added time.
- In their tenth UEFA Champions League participation Anderlecht's aim will be to improve on recent performances. They finished bottom of Group C last season and suffered the same fate in their other five group stage campaigns since progressing to the last 16 in 2000/01.
- In those six seasons the Belgian side have won just four fixtures and have not tasted victory away since a 1-0 success at Real Betis Balompié in their last match of the 2005/06 group stage.
- Their subsequent six games on their travels in the competition proper have produced four draws and two defeats. Their last two fixtures on matchday one both ended in draws.

Team ties

- Lazar Marković and Aleksandar Mitrović are products of FK Partizan's youth system and team-mates in the Serbian national team.
- Stefan Mitrović played in Belgium for KV Kortrijk in 2012/13, although he did not play against Anderlecht.
- Miralem Sulejmani scored both goals in AFC Ajax's 2-0 win against Anderlecht in a UEFA Europa League round of 32 second leg tie at Amsterdam ArenA on 24 February 2011.

International duty

- Benfica had seven players on senior duty during the recent international break: Maxi Pereira (Uruguay), Nemanja Matić, Marković, Sulejmani, Fejsa, Djuričić (Serbia) and Rúben Amorim (Portugal).
- Matić was sent off as Serbia drew 1-1 with Croatia on 6 September, Sulejmani coming on to set up the hosts' goal before going off injured. Four days later Marković, one of three Benfica players in the Serbia starting XI alongside Fejsa and Djuričić, scored in the 3-0 win in Wales.

General information

- Ezequiel Garay scored twice on Saturday in a 3-1 win against FC Paços de Ferreira, the side that finished third in Portugal last term; he had only struck three in 54 previous Liga appearances.
- Siqueira and Fejsa made their competitive debuts against Paços de Ferreira; Amorim limped off during the first half with a knee injury.
- Eduardo Salvio has not been registered for the UEFA Champions League after tearing knee ligaments in the 1-1 draw against Sporting Clube de Portugal on 31 August. He is expected to be out until the new year.
- Nicolás Gaitán picked up a thigh injury in the same game, while Sílvio is yet to make his debut due to a knee problem.
- Jorge Jesus is in his fifth season in charge and is Benfica's longest-serving coach since Otto Glória (1954-59).
- Benfica lost 2-1 at CS Marítimo on the opening day of the season and have now gone a record nine years without winning in round one. Giovanni Trapattoni was at the helm that last time they managed it.
- Benfica were heading to back-to-back defeats in their second outing of 2013/14 on 25 August when added-time goals from Lazar Marković and Lima earned a 2-1 victory over Gil Vicente FC.
- Benfica went into the last month of 2012/13 as unbeaten Liga leaders and through to the finals of the UEFA Europa League and the Portuguese Cup; they ended the season trophyless.
- In July the club opened a new museum, the Museu Cosme Damião. Named after one of the club's founders, it covers three floors and contains more than 900 pieces of silverware picked up during Benfica's 109-year existence.

Anderlecht

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Anderlecht have conceded 447 goals in UEFA competition.
- Anderlecht scored four times in the group stage last season, with only one-goal GNK Dinamo Zagreb netting fewer.
- The 1-0 home win against FC Zenit in last season's competition was the Belgian club's first UEFA Champions League home win in nine years, since defeating Olympique Lyonnais 1-0 In the 2003/04 group stage.
- Last season's appearance was the first in the competition since 2006/07.

International duty

- There were seven Anderlecht players called up for senior duty during the international break: Guillaume Gillet (Belgium), Mitrović, Milivojević (Serbia), Andy Najar (Honduras), Cheikhou Kouyaté (Senegal), Acheampong (Ghana) and Chancel Mbamba (Democratic Republic of Congo).
- Mitrović headed in the equaliser in the 66th minute to earn a 1-1 draw for Serbia against neighbours Croatia, but his country's hopes of making the 2014 FIFA World Cup nonetheless ended.
- Acheampong put Ghana ahead in the friendly against Japan on 10 September though they eventually lost 3-1.

General information

- Anderlecht have scored 24 goals in their last six games, including five unanswered on Saturday as they beat KV Mechelen, their biggest win of 2013.
- Mitrović marked his first start for the club with two goals on Saturday. He began 2013/14 with three in three for Partizan before moving to Belgium, and was also on target for Croatia on 6 September.
- Sacha Kljestan was also on target with his fourth league goal of the campaign, already matching his best ever return in four seasons at the club set in 2011/12.
- Ronald Vargas underwent surgery on his left knee in July and is expected to be out until early November.
- Only Gillet has played the full 630 minutes of the first seven league matches: five wins and two losses.
- Matías Suárez signed a new contract until 30 June 2017 in July. He has scored six league goals this term, already more than his injury-hit 2012/13 haul of three.

- A midfielder at Sporting, Jesus enjoyed a long if low-key career with a number of smaller Portuguese sides before moving into coaching with fourth division Amora after hanging up his boots in 1989, leading them to a title.
- More success followed at Felgueiras, whom he led from the third division to the Liga in successive seasons, though they were relegated in their third campaign under his command in 1995/96.
- Further Liga experience came at hometown side Estrela da Amadora, Setúbal and Guimarães, though he endured another relegation with Moreirense in 2004/05. In 2006/07, he guided Belenenses to fifth place and the Portuguese Cup final, where despite losing to Sporting they earned a place in the UEFA Cup.
- Even better followed at Braga in 2008/09 as he guided them to UEFA Intertoto Cup success and subsequently the UEFA Cup round of 16. A fifth-place Liga finish prompted Benfica to lure him back to Lisbon in 2009 and Jesus rewarded their faith with the league title and League Cup in his debut campaign.
- After completing a hat-trick of Portuguese League Cup triumphs in 2012, Jesus's Benfica came tantalisingly close to an even bigger hat-trick in 2013, only to finish runners-up in both the Portuguese Liga and Cup and lose the UEFA Europa League final to Chelsea FC. Despite that disappointment, he signed a two-year contract extension in June 2013.

RSC Anderlecht: John van den Brom

- Signed his first professional contract with Vitesse in 1986, spending seven seasons with the Arnhem side and scoring 80 goals. The midfielder, who won two Netherlands caps, earned a move to Ajax and was part of the squad that lifted the 1995 UEFA Champions League, although he played no part in the final.
- Tried his luck in Turkey at İstanbulspor in 1995/96 but lasted one season before returning for five more years with Vitesse, hanging up his boots in 2003 after a short spell at De Graafschap.
- Returned to Ajax as second-team coach, becoming head of youth development in 2005. Took the reins at second-tier AGOVV two years later and guided the club to the promotion play-offs in his final season.
- Earned a promotion of his own in 2010, being named Den Haag coach and he duly took the club into Europe for the first time in 23 years. In June 2011 Vitesse convinced Van den Brom to make a heart-warming return and he rewarded their faith by leading the club into the UEFA Europa League via the end-of-season play-offs.
- Left for Anderlecht in May 2012, making an immediate impression by winning the Belgian Super Cup and masterminding Anderlecht's return to the UEFA Champions League group stage after a five-year hiatus. Things got even better when he ended his first season in Brussels holding the league championship trophy.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.






