## Match background

---

Olympiacos FC tackle French opponents in the UEFA Champions League group stage for the third season in a row and, against Paris Saint-Germain FC, they will be looking to improve on a losing start to each of the last two campaigns.

### Previous meetings

- The sides are facing each other for the first time and it is the first time PSG have tackled a Greek side in the UEFA Champions League.
- The Greek champions have a long history against French opposition and were paired with Montpellier Hérault SC last season, Olympique de Marseille the previous year and FC Girondins de Bordeaux in the 2009/10 round of 16.
- In 26 games Olympiacos have a record of W10 D3 L13 (W6 D2 L5 at home). Last season they beat Montpellier 3-1 at home and 2-1 away, Kostas Mitroglou scoring in both games.
- That home win ended a run of four successive losses inflicted on Olympiacos by French visitors. One of those came the previous season against Marseille (0-1) although victory by the same scoreline in the reverse fixture ended a run of seven successive defeats, home and away, against Ligue 1 clubs.
- PSG are unbeaten in all seven of their contests against Greek sides, winning six and drawing one, and are yet to concede a goal. They last visited Greece for a 2006/07 UEFA Cup round of 32 tie against AEK Athens FC, winning 2-0 and the home leg by the same score a week later.

### Match background

- Olympiacos are in their 15th participation, with their best achievement a run to the 1998/99 quarter-finals.
- Last season they finished third in Group B. After losing 2-1 at home to FC Schalke 04 on matchday one they won their two other home games, against Montpellier and against Arsenal FC, the latter victory extending their run of home success to seven wins in nine group games.
- Olympiacos also finished third in their group in 2011/12 when they again lost their matchday one home fixture, against Marseille.
- In the UEFA Champions League for the sixth time, last year PSG finished top of their group and progressed to the quarter-finals where they drew 2-2 at home to FC Barcelona and 1-1 in Spain, losing on away goals. They started the campaign with a 4-1 home win against FC Dynamo Kyiv and on their travels lost 1-0 at FC Porto before beating both GNK Dinamo Zagreb and Dynamo 2-0.
- The French champions also won away in the round of 16, 2-1 at Valencia CF, with the home leg ending 1-1.

### Team ties

- Laurent Blanc and Michel faced each other when France and Spain met in a UEFA EURO '92 qualifier in Paris on 20 February 1991. Blanc scored France's final goal in a 3-1 win.
- Blanc and Olympiacos' former player and current strategic adviser Christian Karembeu were members of the France team that won the 1998 FIFA World Cup and UEFA Euro 2000.
- Blanc started all four of Manchester United FC's UEFA Champions League first group stage games against Olympiacos in 2001/02 and 2002/03, all ending in United victories. Blanc scored the opening goal in a 3-2 win in Piraeus on 23 October 2002.
- Several Olympiacos players have had spells at French clubs: Paulo Machado (AS Saint-Étienne and Toulouse FC), Javier Saviola (AS Monaco FC), Carl Medjani (St-Étienne, FC Lorient, FC Metz, AC Ajaccio and Monaco), Joel Campbell (Lorient), Gaëtan Bong (Metz, Tours FC and Valenciennes FC), Delvin Ndinga (AJ Auxerre and Monaco) and Sambou Yatabaré (SM Caen, Monaco and SC Bastia).
- Machado and Thiago Silva were team-mates at FC Porto in 2004/05 while Machado played with Blaise Matuidi at St-Étienne in 2008/09.
- Saviola and Thiago Motta were team-mates at FC Barcelona for three seasons from 2001.
- Medjani and Christophe Jallet were together at Lorient in 2006/07.
- Medjani scored Ajaccio's goal in a 3-1 Ligue 1 loss to PSG in October 2011.
- Gaëtan Bong scored in Valenciennes' 2-2 draw against PSG at Parc de Princes on 5 May 2010.
- Zlatan Ibrahimović scored Sweden's first goal in a 2-0 victory over Greece in a UEFA EURO 2008 group fixture in Salzburg.

#### UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Olympiacos have conceded 195 goals in the European Champion Clubs' Cup.
- The Greek champions are 25 games without a draw in UEFA competition, winning 13 and losing 12 since their UEFA Champions League meeting at AZ Alkmaar ended goalless on 24 November 2009.
- Only eight players registered by Olympiacos for last season's group stage feature this time round: Balázs Megyeri, José Holebas, Giannis Maniatis, Kostas Mitroglou, David Fuster, Dimitris Siovas, Kostas Manolas and Paulo Machado.

- Thirteen Olympiacos players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Manolas, Siovas, Maniatis, Holebas, Mitroglou (Greece), Balázs Megyeri (Hungary), Bong (Cameroon), Yatabaré (Mali), Ndinga (Congo), Weiss (Slovakia), Medjani (Algeria), Campbell (Costa Rica) and Roy Carroll (Northern Ireland).
- Holebas was sent off as Greece beat Liechtenstein 1-0 on 6 September, Mitroglou scoring the only goal in Vaduz.
- Campbell scored Costa Rica's third goal in a 3-1 victory over the United States on 6 September, his side sealing a 2014 FIFA World Cup spot four days later by holding Jamaica.
- Medjani and Yatabaré faced each other as Algeria beat Mali 1-0 on 10 September.

#### General information

- Mitroglou has scored back-to-back hat-tricks for Olympiacos, following his three-goal haul in the 5-0 win at Levadiakos FC on 1 September – the first of his career – with another on Saturday against Skoda Xanthi FC.
- Bong (right ankle) and Salino (leg muscle) were both taken off against Xanthi after picking up knocks in the first half. Yatabaré made his league debut in the second period.
- The Levadiakos win was the first time the Piraeus outfit have hit five away from home in over six years.
- Olympiacos have won four out of four this season.
- Seven players made their Greek Super League debuts for Olympiacos in their opening day 1-0 win against Kalloni on 19 August.
- Six of Olympiacos' 12 goals this season have been scored by substitutes and seven have come from set pieces.
- Avraam Papadopoulos is nearing his comeback from the knee injury that means he has not played since April.

- Ibrahimović scored inside 27 seconds last Tuesday as Sweden won 1-0 in Kazakhstan in FIFA World Cup qualifying.
- Cavani (Uruguay 2-0 Colombia) and Thiago Silva (Brazil 3-1 Portugal, Boston) also scored last Tuesday.
- Thiago Motta was a late substitute as Italy booked their place at Brazil 2014 with victory over the Czech Republic on Tuesday, when Lavezzi's Argentina also qualified.

#### **General information**

- It took PSG three games to record their first league win of 2013/14, a 2-0 victory at FC Nantes on 25 August. That is an improvement on last term, when they kicked off with three successive draws.
- Lucas scored his first goal for the club on Friday in a 2-0 victory over Laurent Blanc's former side FC Girondins de Bordeaux.
- PSG have registered just twice before half-time this season.
- Blanc arrived this summer to replace Carlo Ancelotti, who left to take the helm of Real Madrid CF after leading PSG to their first Ligue 1 title in 19 years.

---

**Date of birth:** 23 March 1963

**Nationality:** Spanish

**Playing career:** Real Madrid CF, Atlético Celaya

**Coaching career:** Rayo Vallecano de Madrid, Real Madrid Castilla, Getafe CF, Sevilla FC, Olympiacos FC

- Joined Real Madrid aged 13, rising through the club's ranks before winning the second division championship with 'B' side Real Madrid Castilla. Subsequently stepped up to the first team and would later become one of five key home-grown players known as La Quinta del Buitre, or The Vulture (Emilio Butragueño) and Co.
- The right-sided midfielder played in 559 official games for the capital outfit with whom he won – among other titles– six Ligas and back-to-back UEFA Cups (1985, 1986). Michel also represented Spain at youth, Under-21 and senior level, scoring 21 goals in 66 appearances for La Roja between 1985 and 1992.
- Led Rayo Vallecano to fifth place in the Spanish third tier in his first stint as coach in 2005. Subsequently headed back to Madrid to take charge of Castilla, yet it was at Getafe where his reputation as a tactician grew, helping the club to avoid relegation on the last day of the 2009/10 campaign.
- Enjoyed a brief stint at Sevilla before deciding to pursue a career outside Spain. In February 2013, he was appointed by Olympiacos, taking over from UEFA EURO 2004-winning goalkeeper Antonis Nikopolidis, who had stepped in as interim coach a month earlier when the Piraeus club fired Leonardo Jardim.
- Shortly after his appointment, Olympiacos failed to make it past the UEFA Europa League round of 32, succumbing to Levante UD. They were well on their way to their 40th league title, though, the first of Michel's coaching career, while they also secured the domestic double by beating Asteras Tripolis FC in the Greek Cup final.

- The defender's 20-year club career brought a French Cup win with Montpellier in 1990, a 1996 league and cup double with Auxerre, the 1997 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup with Barcelona and a Premier League title with United just before retirement in 2003.
- Nicknamed Le Président on account of his authority, elegance and leadership. Famous for 'good luck' kiss on goalkeeper Fabien Barthez's bald head before kick-offs, he won the 1998 FIFA World Cup on home soil after scoring France's golden goal winner against Paraguay in the last 16, but missed the Paris final after being sent off in the semi-final.
- Helped France win UEFA EURO 2000, scoring against Denmark in the group stage, before retiring from international football that year with 97 caps and 16 goals.
- Spent four years gaining coaching qualifications before taking charge of Bordeaux in June 2007. His team finished second in his first season and won a championship and League Cup double in 2009. Guided Bordeaux to the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals before succeeding Raymond Domenech as France coach that summer.
- Blanc's France lost their first two games but then went 23 matches unbeaten prior to two losses at UEFA EURO 2012, the second in the quarter-finals against Spain. He subsequently left his post as national coach but returned to management when stepping into Carlo Ancelotti's shoes at PSG in June 2013.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

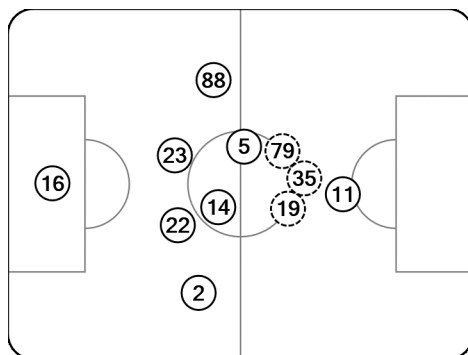

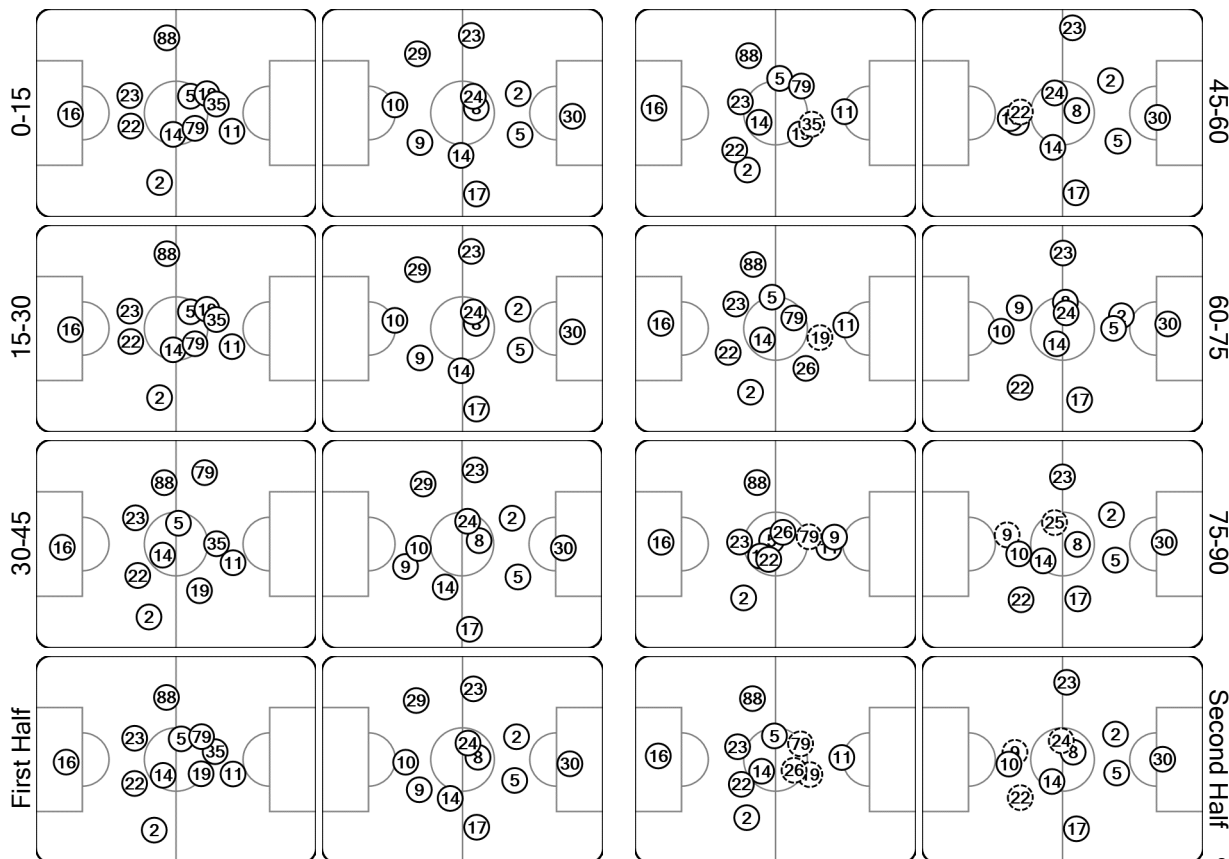
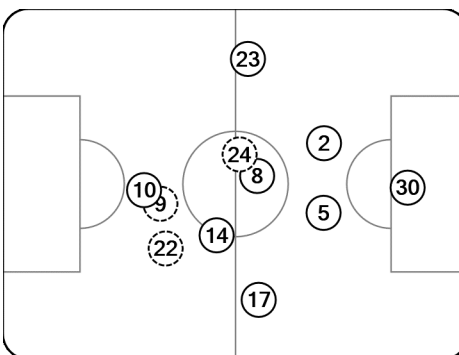
