Match background

Paris Saint-Germain won their last home game 3-0 against SL Benfica and, having triumphed 5-0 at RSC Anderlecht last time out, are looking for a fourth emphatic victory from as many games this season.

- Paris got off to a flying start in Group C, winning 4-1 away to Olympiacos FC before defeating Benfica and Anderlecht, Zlatan Ibrahimović becoming the tenth player to score four goals in a UEFA Champions League match with his haul in Brussels.
- That was Anderlecht's third straight loss; a 2-0 reverse in Lisbon and 3-0 defeat at home to Olympiacos mean they are also searching for their first goal.

Previous meetings

- The game in Belgium was the first meeting between the teams for 21 years. They played out two draws when facing each other in the 1992/93 UEFA Cup third round, 0-0 in Paris and 1-1 in Brussels that took Paris through on away goals.
- Paris earned their biggest-ever European win against Belgian opponents, defeating KAA Gent 7-1 at home in the 2001 Intertoto Cup semi-final having drawn 0-0 away.
- They also beat KSV Waterschei 2-0 in the 1982/83 European Cup Winners' Cup quarter-final but went down 3-0 away.
- Paris's results against Belgian sides are W3 D3 L1.
- Anderlecht's last visit to France ended in a 5-1 defeat to Olympique Lyonnais and an eventual 8-2 aggregate defeat in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League play-off round.
- It was a rare setback for the Belgian side when travelling to face Ligue 1 teams. Also discounting the 1992 game against Paris, their other six away games have resulted in two wins, three draws and one defeat, also at Lyon (1-0) in the 2003/04 UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Anderlecht's results against French sides are W6 D7 L4.

Match background

- Paris, in the group stage for the sixth time, reached the quarter-finals last year where they drew 2-2 at home to FC Barcelona and 1-1 in Spain, going out on away goals.
- They started with a 4-1 home win against FC Dynamo Kyiv and also overcame GNK Dinamo Zagreb (4-0) and FC Porto (2-1). In the round of 16 the French champions won 2-1 at Valencia CF, the home leg ending 1-1.
- In their tenth UEFA Champions League participation, Anderlecht will want to avoid a repeat of last season's campaign when they finished bottom of their group. They suffered the same fate in their other five group stage campaigns since progressing to the last 16 in 2000/01.
- In those six seasons the Belgian side have won just four fixtures and have not tasted victory away since a 1-0 success at Real Betis Balompié in their last match of the 2005/06 group stage.
- Their subsequent seven games on their travels in the competition proper have produced four draws and three defeats.

Team ties

- Demy de Zeeuw and Gregory van der Wiel were team-mates at AFC Ajax between 2009 and 2011.
- John van den Brom was ADO Den Haag's coach when they beat Van der Wiel's Ajax 3-2 at home and 1-0 away in 2010/11.
- Fabrice N'Sakala played for ES Troyes AC from 2008 to 2013.
- Cheikhou Kouyaté's Senegal beat Edinson Cavani's Uruguay 2-0 at Wembley in the group stage at the 2012 Olympic Games.
- Aleksandar Mitrović laid on the only goal of the final against Adrien Rabiot's France to help Serbia lift the UEFA European Under-19 Championship in Marijampole, Lithuania on 1 August.
- Franck Acheampong's Ghana faced Lucas Digne's France in Group A of the FIFA Under-20 World Cup in June 2013 and again in the semi-final. France won the first game 3-1 and the second 2-1, going on to take the title.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Zlatan Ibrahimović became the tenth player to score four goals in a UEFA Champions League game when Paris won 5-0 at Anderlecht on matchday three – the French club's biggest away win in Europe. Only one player has scored five goals: Lionel Messi in FC Barcelona's 7-1 win at home against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012.
- Paris have scored 95 goals in the European Cup.
- Thiago Motta and Real Madrid CF's Ángel Di María have made a competition high four assists each. Gregory van der Wiel and Ezequiel Lavezzi have been credited with three apiece.
- Thiago Motta has attempted (388) and completed (350) more passes than anyone else in this year's competition. Marco Verratti is second with 322/293.
- Laurent Blanc's charges have attempted (2,477) and completed (2,135) the most passes in the competition.
- Van der Wiel is a booking away from a suspension after picking up two yellow cards.

General information

- Jérémy Ménez scored in Friday's 4-0 win against FC Lorient, his first goal since the effort that sealed the title for Paris in May. It was the capital club's first home victory over Lorient since 2008.
- Ibrahimović, rested with a knee problem on Friday, has scored ten goals in his last six appearances.
- Edinson Cavani has scored in each of his last five appearances for club and country, seven goals in all.
- Paris have not lost since 2 March when they went down 1-0 at Stade de Reims, though they were defeated on penalties by Évian Thonon Gaillard FC in April's French Cup quarter-finals. The Reims reverse was also the last time the Paris club failed to score.
- Thiago Silva went off with a strained hamstring 15 minutes into the 1-1 draw at home to AS Monaco FC on 22 September, his 29th birthday, and has not played since.
- Cavani, Ibrahimović and Thiago Silva have been nominated for the 2014 FIFA Ballon d'Or, which will be announced on 13 January.

Anderlecht

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Yuri Tielemans became the third youngest player to grace the UEFA Champions League when, aged 16 years and 148 days, he played 90 minutes at home to Olympiacos FC on matchday two.
- Anderlecht scored four times in the group stage last season, with only one-goal GNK Dinamo Zagreb netting fewer. They are yet to register this term.
- Anderlecht have not won in seven UEFA Champions League group stage games away from home, since a 1-0 victory at Real Betis Balompié in December 2005.
- Anderlecht have finished bottom in each of their last five UEFA Champions League group stage campaigns, since progressing to the second group stage in 2000/01.
- Massimo Bruno and Fabrice N'Sakala are both a booking away from a suspension after picking up two yellow cards.

General information

- Sacha Kljestan has scored seven league goals this season; his previous best was five.
- Matías Suárez, who has scored six league goals this season, suffered torn knee ligaments during the 1-1 home draw with R. Standard de Liège on 27 October and could miss the rest of the season. Guillaume Gillet sustained an open wound to his left knee in the same match and is expected to be out for several weeks.
- Silvio Proto has not featured since injuring his right ankle in the warm-up ahead of matchday two. Ronald Vargas has been out since undergoing surgery on his left knee in July.
- Eighteen points from ten games represented the club's worst start to a league campaign in 15 years.
- The 4-0 loss at Club Brugge KV on 22 September was Anderlecht's biggest league defeat since 3 October 2010 and a 5-1 reverse against Standard.

- The defender's 20-year club career brought a French Cup win with Montpellier in 1990, a 1996 league and cup double with Auxerre, the 1997 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup with Barcelona and a Premier League title with United just before retirement in 2003.
- Nicknamed Le Président on account of his authority, elegance and leadership. Famous for 'good luck' kiss on goalkeeper Fabien Barthez's bald head before kick-offs, he won the 1998 FIFA World Cup on home soil after scoring France's golden goal winner against Paraguay in the last 16, but missed the Paris final after being sent off in the semi-final.
- Helped France win UEFA EURO 2000, scoring against Denmark in the group stage, before retiring from international football that year with 97 caps and 16 goals.
- Spent four years gaining coaching qualifications before taking charge of Bordeaux in June 2007. His team finished second in his first season and won a championship and League Cup double in 2009. Guided Bordeaux to the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals before succeeding Raymond Domenech as France coach that summer.
- Blanc's France lost their first two games but then went 23 matches unbeaten prior to two losses at UEFA EURO 2012, the second in the quarter-finals against Spain. He subsequently left his post as national coach but returned to management when stepping into Carlo Ancelotti's shoes at Paris in June 2013.

Date of birth: 4 October 1966

Nationality: Dutch

Playing career: Vitesse (twice), AFC Ajax, Istanbulspor AŞ, De Graafschap

Coaching career: AGOVV Apeldoorn, ADO Den Haag, Vitesse, RSC Anderlecht

- Signed his first professional contract with Vitesse in 1986, spending seven seasons with the Arnhem side and scoring 80 goals. The midfielder, who won two Netherlands caps, earned a move to Ajax and was part of the squad that lifted the 1995 UEFA Champions League, although he played no part in the final.
- Tried his luck in Turkey at Istanbulspor in 1995/96 but lasted one season before returning for five more years with Vitesse, hanging up his boots in 2003 after a short spell at De Graafschap.
- Returned to Ajax as second-team coach, becoming head of youth development in 2005. Took the reins at second-tier AGOVV two years later and guided the club to the promotion play-offs in his final season.
- Earned a promotion of his own in 2010, being named Den Haag coach, and he duly took the club into Europe for the first time in 23 years. In June 2011 Vitesse convinced Van den Brom to make a heart-warming return and he rewarded their faith by leading the club into the UEFA Europa League via the end-of-season play-offs.
- Left for Anderlecht in May 2012, making an immediate impression by winning the Belgian Super Cup and masterminding Anderlecht's return to the UEFA Champions League group stage after a six-season hiatus. Things got even better when he ended his first season in Brussels holding the league championship trophy.

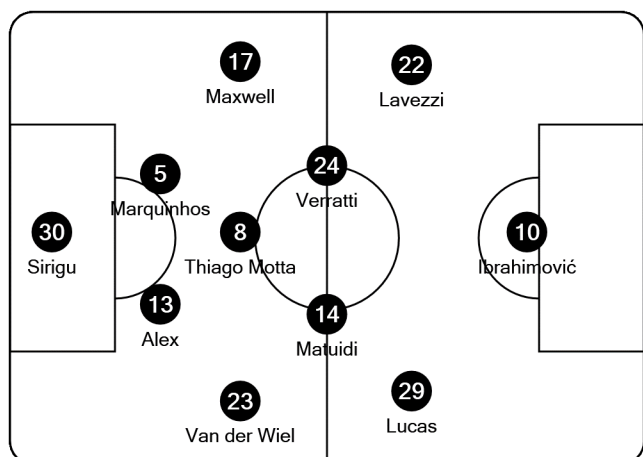

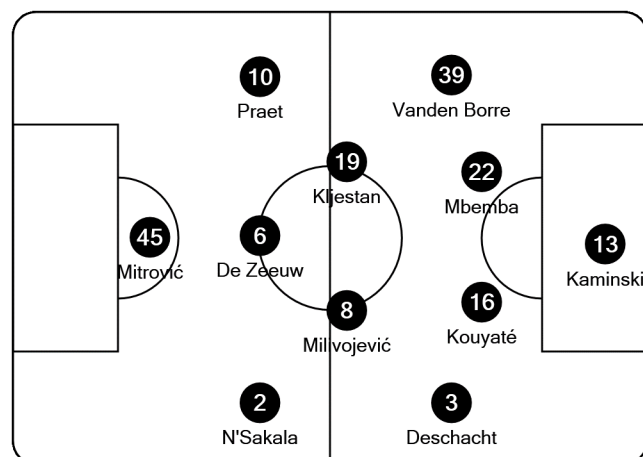

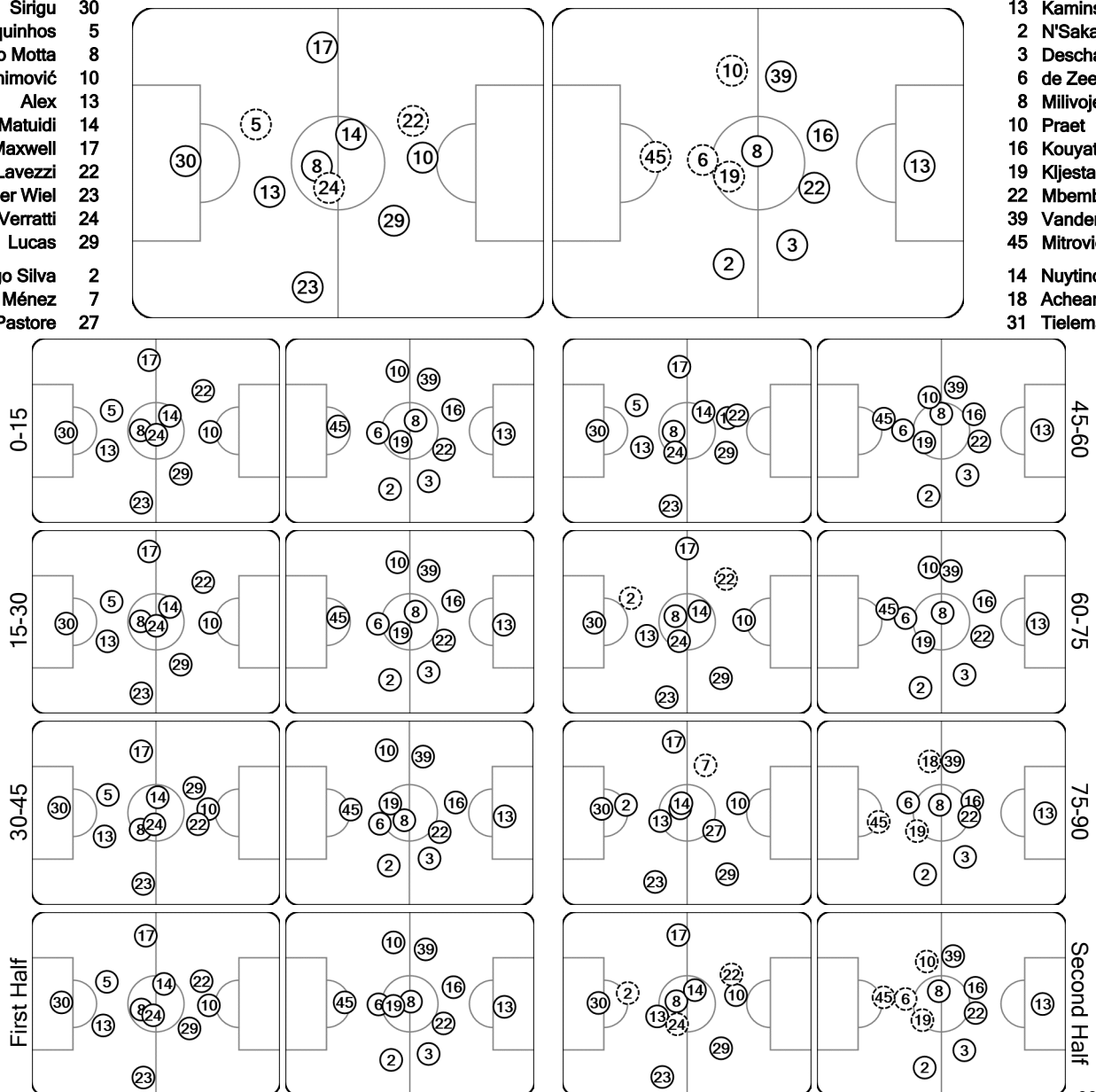
