Match background

Manchester City FC will hope it proves third time lucky as they embark on their third UEFA Champions League campaign away to Group D rivals FC Viktoria Plzeň.

- City's two previous campaigns both ended in disappointment as they finished third in their group in 2011/12 and bottom last season, when they did not manage a single victory. However, they will hope for better under Manuel Pellegrini, who replaced Roberto Mancini as manager in the summer and has enjoyed long runs in the competition with both Villarreal CF and Málaga CF, guiding the former to the 2005/06 semi-finals and the latter to the quarter-finals last term.
- City will start as favourites but Pavel Vrba's Plzeň have won ten of their last 11 European outings at the Štruncovy Sady Stadión.

Match background

- While City qualified automatically for the group stage as runners-up in the 2012/13 Premier League, Plzeň had to come through three qualifying rounds – and did so with flying colours. The Czech title winners won all six matches as they overcame Bosnia and Herzegovina's FK Željezničar 6-4 on aggregate, Estonia's JK Nõmme Kalju 10-2 (agg) and NK Maribor of Slovenia 4-1 (agg).
- Plzeň also enjoyed a strong campaign in the UEFA Europa League last season, winning a group that included holders Club Atlético de Madrid and then defeating SSC Napoli before a 2-1 aggregate loss to Fenerbahçe SK in the round of 16. Prior to their 1-0 home reverse against Fenerbahçe they had posted seven straight home wins in Europe.
- City, by contrast, are looking to improve on a poor away record in the UEFA Champions League. They took no points on their travels in last term's group stage, while in 2011/12 they recorded one victory – at Villarreal – and two defeats.
- City have started both their previous campaigns on the back foot, taking just one point in total from their first two fixtures in 2011/12 and 2012/13.
- The Czech club's only previous group stage campaign came in 2011/12 when they finished third in a group containing FC Barcelona, AC Milan and FC BATE Borisov. At home, they lost to Barcelona but held Milan and BATE.
- For City, this is a first visit to the Czech Republic while Plzeň are facing English opponents for the first time in UEFA competition. The Štruncovy Sady Stadión did once host Grimsby Town FC for a friendly match in 1959, when Spartak Plzeň – as the home side was then known – earned a 3-3 draw.

Team ties

- Pellegrini's Villarreal side won in the Czech Republic in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup group stage when beating FK Mladá Boleslav 2-1. Václav Procházka was in the beaten home team.
- David Silva played in the Spain side that beat Daniel Kolář's Czech Republic 2-0 in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in Prague in October 2011. Jesús Navas featured in Spain's 2-1 home win in March the same year but no Plzeň players were involved.
- Marián Čišovský was in the FC Timișoara team beaten 1-0 at home by City in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League play-off first leg, lining up against Joe Hart, Pablo Zabaleta, Vincent Kompany, Joleon Lescott, Yaya Touré and Silva. In the previous season's UEFA Champions League third qualifying round, he had helped Timișoara overcome Fernando's FC Shakhtar Donetsk on away goals.
- Pavel Horváth, David Limberský and Kolář played in the AC Sparta Praha side beaten 5-0 on aggregate by an Arsenal FC team that included Gaël Clichy in the 2007/08 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round.
- Roman Hubník, František Rajtoral and Kolář played in the Czech Republic's 0-0 draw with James Milner's England in Arnhem in their opening group game at the 2007 UEFA European Under-21 Championship.
- Stevan Jovetič played for Montenegro in their UEFA EURO 2012 play-off defeat against a Czech Republic side featuring Kolář.
- Edin Džeko played in the Czech top flight in 2005/06 and 2006/07, scoring 16 times in 43 league appearances for FK Teplice. He played three games against Plzeň, losing two and drawing one. At the Štruncovy sady, he scored in a 3-3 draw in March 2006 but was less successful in a 2-0 defeat there five months later.
- Kompany helped RSC Anderlecht beat SK Slavia Praha home and away in the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League third round qualifying round.
- Limberský had a loan spell at Tottenham Hotspur FC between January and May 2005 but did not make a first-team appearance.

- Horváth played in England in SK Slavia Praha's 3-0 first-leg defeat at Leeds United AFC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup quarter-finals.
- Jack Rodwell scored twice against Tomáš Hořava's SK Sigma Olomouc to help Everton FC beat the Czech side 6-2 on aggregate in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League play-offs.

Plzeň

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Plzeň won all six games in UEFA Champions League qualifying, repeating the feat of their only previous group stage campaign in 2011/12.
- Central defender Marián Čišovský scored five goals across the three rounds making him the top scorer of the qualification phase alongside FC Zenit's Roman Shirokov.
- Plzeň are yet to win a group stage game at home in the UEFA Champions League, recording two draws (1-1 v FC BATE Borisov and 2-2 v AC Milan) and a 4-0 loss to FC Barcelona in 2011/12.
- This will be the first time the Štruncovy Sady Stadión will stage UEFA Champions League football. The side played their home games at the Stadion Eden, home of SK Slavia Praha, during their previous campaign.
- Plzeň have conceded 47 goals in UEFA competition.

International duty

- Six Plzeň players were called up for senior duty during international break: Tomáš Hořava, David Limberský, Václav Procházka, Daniel Kolář (Czech Republic), Michal Ďuriš and Matuš Kozáčik (Slovakia).
- The club's four representatives with the Czech national side experienced a tough international break, suffering 2-1 losses to Armenia and Italy. Kolář suffered more than the rest, receiving a red card in the match in Turin after coming on as a substitute.

General information

- Kolář has scored in each of his three league appearances this season, including the opener in Friday's 1-1 draw away to third-placed FC Slovan Liberec.
- Plzeň are unbeaten after eight rounds of the Czech First League, recording six wins and draws against the other two teams in the top three: Liberec and AC Sparta Praha.
- Čišovský has missed the last three league games due to a calf injury.

- There were 15 City players on duty for their countries during the international break: Joe Hart, James Milner (England), Aleksandar Kolarov, Matija Nastasić (Serbia), Gaël Clichy, Samir Nasri (France), Javi García, Navas, David Silva, Negredo (Spain), Edin Džeko (Bosnia and Herzegovina), Jovetić (Montenegro), Pablo Zabaleta, Sergio Agüero (Argentina) and Yaya Touré (Ivory Coast).
- Negredo came off the bench to score and seal Spain's 2-0 win in Finland on 6 September which leaves them on track to qualify for the World Cup. Navas scored a late equaliser four days later in a 2-2 friendly draw with Chile.
- Last Tuesday, Kolarov struck in Serbia's 3-0 win against Wales and Nasri against Belarus, a 4-2 comeback victory helping move France level on points with Spain in Group I having played a game more.
- Argentina secured qualification for Brazil with a 5-2 win in Paraguay which Zabaleta and Agüero both started, the latter scoring the visitors' second.

General information

- Only six players from across the French, Spanish, Italian, English and German top divisions scored more league

goals than summer signing Negredo's 25 in 2012/13, while Navas created more chances from open play than any other player in the Liga last season.

- Demichelis was ruled out for six weeks with a knee injury just four days after joining the club and is set to miss the first two matchdays. Captain Vincent Kompany has not featured since injuring his groin at the end of August.
- Zabaleta made more tackles than any other defender in the Premier League last season.

- The defender was part of the Czechoslovakia side that reached the final of the 1982 UEFA European Under-18 Championship and also appeared at the FIFA U-20 World Cup the following year; the Czechs lost in the quarter-finals to a Brazil team including Bebeto and Dunga.
- His club career did not hit the same highs, Vrba making a handful of appearances for Cheb and Baník before finishing his playing days in the lower leagues with hometown club Přerov.
- Returned to Baník as a youth coach and also went back to the U20 World Cup, taking charge of the Czech Republic in the 2003 edition. Became assistant at Baník and, despite a 7-0 loss to SK Slavia Praha in his first match in temporary charge in May 2003, the next season ended with the league title.
- That summer crossed the border into Slovakia, winning a championship as head coach of Žilina in 2007, by which time he was also working as assistant to Ján Kocián with the country's national side.
- Moved on to Plzeň in 2008, winning the Czech Cup in his second season – when he was voted the country's coach of the year – and the league in 2011. Led the club into the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time in 2011/12 and repeated the trick two years later following another title in 2013.

Manchester City FC: Manuel Pellegrini

Coaching career: CF Universidad de Chile, CD Palestino (three times), Chile Under-20, CD O'Higgins, CD Universidad Católica, LDU de Quito, CA San Lorenzo de Almagro, CA River Plate, Villarreal CF, Real Madrid CF, Málaga CF, Manchester City FC

- The former centre-back began his coaching career in 1988 with the sole club of his playing days, Universidad de Chile, before spending the next 16 years working with sides in Chile, Ecuador and Argentina.
- Took over at Villarreal in 2004, guiding them to third place in the Liga in his debut season and securing a place in the UEFA Champions League for the first time. His side also reached the quarter-finals of the UEFA Cup.
- The following campaign, Villarreal defied all expectations by reaching the UEFA Champions League semi-finals, where they lost 1-0 on aggregate to Arsenal FC. Guided the club to second place in the 2007/08 Liga, a club record, and the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals the following season, again being knocked out by Arsenal.
- Signed a two-year contract with Real Madrid on 2 June 2009, the club winning a then record 96 points in the Liga but still finishing second behind FC Barcelona, prompting Pellegrini's dismissal in May 2010
- That November he succeeded Jesualdo Ferreira as coach of Málaga and in the following campaign oversaw a fourth-placed league finish, the club's best ever. In an echo of his feats with Villarreal, he then took the Andalusian team through UEFA Champions League qualifying and all the way to the quarter-finals. In summer 2013, joined Manchester City on a three-year deal to replace Roberto Mancini.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

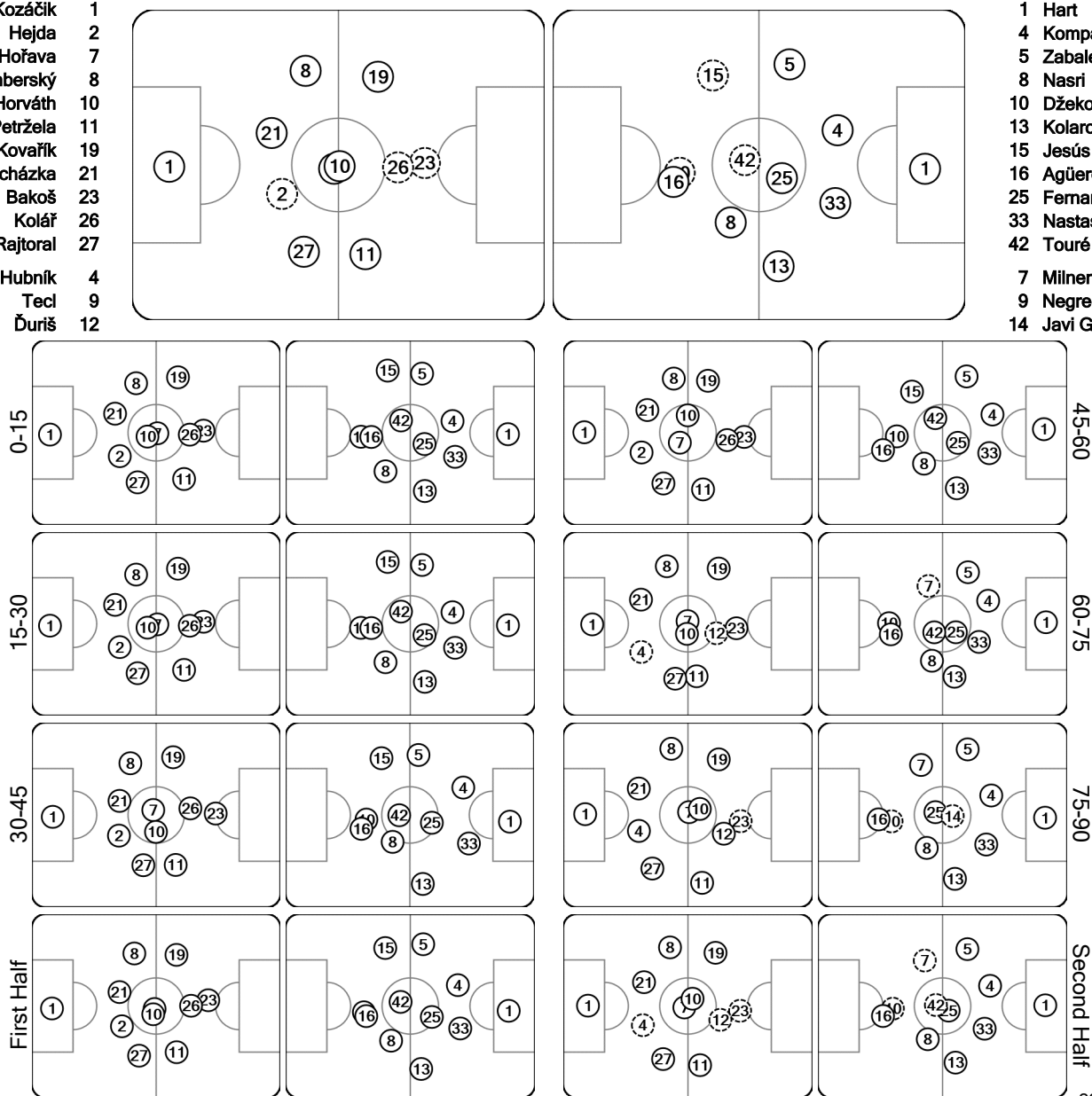
