Match background

Manuel Pellegrini renews acquaintance with Josep Guardiola when his Manchester City FC side play host to UEFA Champions League holders FC Bayern München on matchday two.

- Pellegrini failed to beat Guardiola's FC Barcelona as coach of Real Madrid CF, and nor did he manage it with Villarreal CF or Málaga CF. City's five-year unbeaten home run in Europe does offer cause for optimism, as does a 3-0 win at FC Viktoria Plzeň on matchday one, their first opening-day success in the competition.
- For Bayern, this Group D fixture brings them back to England five months after they won the 2013 UEFA Champions League final at Wembley, and they will arrive level on points with City after beating PFC CSKA Moskva 3-0.

Previous meetings

- The clubs first met in the 2011/12 group stage, Jupp Heynckes' Bayern beating City 2-0 in Munich on 27 September 2011 thanks to two Mario Gomez goals (38, 45+1).
- The Bavarian club had already secured first place in the group by the time they met again on matchday six and although David Silva (36) and Yaya Touré (52) earned City a 2-0 home victory, it counted for nothing with SSC Napoli winning the group's other fixture to leave Roberto Mancini's men in third place.

Match background

- City failed to survive the group stage in their two previous UEFA Champions League appearances but have kept intact an impressive undefeated sequence at home in Europe which stretches back 20 matches to a 1-0 loss against FC Midtjylland in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup second qualifying round.
- They were fortunate to escape defeat against their last German visitors, though, holding a Borussia Dortmund side including Mario Götze 1-1 on 3 October last year only thanks to Mario Balotelli's 90th-minute penalty. It was one of their three home draws in the 2012/13 group stage and left them with a home record of W3 D2 L0 against visitors from the Bundesliga.
- Bayern's most recent encounter with English opposition was their UEFA Super Cup contest against Chelsea FC on 30 August in Prague. They won 5-4 on penalties after a 2-2 draw, Franck Ribéry and Javi Martínez scoring Bayern's goals.
- Besides their Wembley final triumph in May, Bayern also won at Arsenal FC in last season's competition, Toni Kroos, Thomas Müller and Mario Mandžukić earning them a 3-1 success in the round of 16. They lost the second leg 2-0 but advanced on away goals.
- Bayern's overall record away to English teams is W3 D7 L6.
- Bayern lifted the European Champion Clubs' Cup with a 2-0 final triumph against Leeds United AFC in 1975, but have since lost finals to Aston Villa FC (0-1, 1982), Manchester United FC (1-2, 1999) and Chelsea (1-1, 3-4 pens, 2012).

Team ties

- Guardiola and Pellegrini met as coaches of Barcelona and Real Madrid in 2009/10, Barça winning both matches – 1-0 at home and 2-0 away – as they beat Madrid to the Liga title by three points.
- With Villarreal in 2008/09, Pellegrini suffered a 2-1 home defeat by Guardiola's Barcelona but earned a 3-3 draw at the Camp Nou.
- The Chilean's Málaga side lost all four Liga games against Guardiola's Barcelona between 2010 and 2012, scoring four goals and conceding 15.
- Guardiola twice led Barcelona to UEFA Champions League final triumphs over Manchester United FC – 2-0 in Rome in 2009 and 3-1 at Wembley two years later. He also lifted the trophy as a player at Wembley when Barcelona overcame UC Sampdoria in 1992.
- As a Barcelona player and coach, Guardiola's only away win against Premier League opposition in eight attempts was a 4-2 victory over Arsenal FC at Wembley in the 1999/2000 group stage. There were four defeats, including a 1-0 reverse at Chelsea FC in the 2011/12 semi-finals.
- Pellegrini's Málaga suffered a dramatic late defeat against Götze's Dortmund in last season's UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, the German side scoring twice in added time to win the second leg 3-2 and advance by the same score on aggregate.
- Martín Demichelis, a member of that Málaga side, was at Bayern from 2003 until January 2011, winning both the Bundesliga and the German Cup four times.
- Touré played under Guardiola in the Barcelona team that beat Bayern 5-1 on aggregate in the 2008/09 quarter-

finals.

- Daniel Van Buyten made five league appearances for City on loan from Olympique de Marseille in 2003/04 while Jérôme Boateng spent 2010/11 with the Manchester club, making 16 league appearances. Boateng also played with Vincent Kompany at Hamburger SV from 2006 to 2008.
- On 6 September, Mandžukić scored Croatia's goal in a 1-1 FIFA World Cup qualifying draw against a Serbia side including Matija Nastasić and Aleksandar Kolarov. Mandžukić also scored when the same players met in Croatia's 2-0 home win over Serbia in March, and faced Kompany in his country's 1-1 draw in Belgium last year.
- Kompany's hopes of UEFA EURO 2012 qualification with Belgium were ended in October 2011 by a 3-1 defeat by a Germany side including Neuer, Philipp Lahm, Kroos and Müller.
- Kompany was also part of the RSC Anderlecht side eliminated from the UEFA Champions League after a 1-0 defeat at a Bayern side including Claudio Pizarro and substitute Bastian Schweinsteiger in their final 2003/04 group stage fixture.
- A 2009 Bundesliga champion, Edin Džeko played for VfL Wolfsburg from 2007 to 2010, scoring four goals in seven Bundesliga appearances against Bayern. In June 2010, Džeko scored for Bosnia and Herzegovina in a 3-1 friendly defeat in Frankfurt against a Germany team whose goals came from Schweinsteiger (two penalties) and Lahm.
- Boateng, Lahm, Neuer, Schweinsteiger, Müller and substitute Kroos all featured in Germany's 4-0 win against an Argentina side including Demichelis and substitute Sergio Agüero in the 2010 World Cup quarter-finals.
- David Silva and substitute Jesús Navas were in the Spain side that beat Arjen Robben's Netherlands 1-0 in the 2010 World Cup final. Navas had previously played as Spain defeated Bayern's Germany contingent in the semi-final, while Silva featured in Spain's 1-0 defeat of Germany in the final of UEFA EURO 2008.
- Ribéry and Samir Nasri were colleagues at Marseille from 2005 to 2007 and play together for France.

General information

- Manuel Pellegrini's team have won just one out of four on their travels this season but at home they have four victories from four, scoring 15 and conceding just once in the process.
- Jovetić (2) and Navas scored their first goals for the club in a 5-0 victory over second-tier Wigan Athletic FC in the League Cup last Tuesday. City had earned their fifth win against Manchester United FC in six league derbies with a 4-1 success on 22 September.
- Navas created more chances from open play than any other player in the Liga last season while Pablo Zabaleta made more tackles than any other defender in the Premier League in 2012/13.
- Demichelis was ruled out with a knee injury just four days after joining the club and is set to miss the first two matchdays.

Bayern

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Holders Bayern are bidding to become the first team to successfully defend the trophy in the UEFA Champions League era. AC Milan were the last side to win back-to-back European Cups in 1988/89 and 1989/90.
- The holders completed 753 of their 862 attempted passes on matchday one, a success rate of 87%. All three figures are higher than any other side. The three players who attempted the most passes in the first match all represent Bayern – David Alaba (108), Franck Ribéry (106) and Philipp Lahm (99).

General information

- Götze has been out since suffering an ankle injury in the UEFA Super Cup but was an unused substitute in Saturday's 1-0 win against VfL Wolfsburg.
- FCB have scored in their last 44 league games, a Bundesliga record, and are unbeaten in a club best 32 top-flight matches.
- Bayern won 46 of their 54 fixtures in all competitions last season; they have won nine out of 12 this.
- On 21 September Bayern won 4-0 at FC Schalke 04 – their biggest ever win in Gelsenkirchen. Bastian Schweinsteiger and Claudio Pizarro both opened their goalscoring accounts for 2013/14. Four days later Bayern advanced to the last 16 of the German Cup with a 4-1 win against Hannover 96.
- Thiago Alcántara has not played since suffering ankle ligament damage on his first Bayern start on 24 August. Javi Martínez has not featured since undergoing groin surgery on 3 September. Pierre Højbjerg has resumed training after seven weeks out with an ankle injury.
- Josep Guardiola, who succeeded Jupp Heynckes on a three-year deal this summer, suffered defeat in his first competitive outing as Bayern boss as Borussia Dortmund won the German Super Cup 4-2 on 27 July.
- On 29 August, Ribéry was voted the 2012/13 UEFA Best Player in Europe by a panel of leading football journalists.
- On 6 September, Lahm won his 100th cap for Germany during a 3-0 win against Austria.
- Bayern broke or equalled 30 Bundesliga records in 2012/13, among them most points (91), biggest winning margin (25 points), best goal difference (+80), clean sheets (21) and most wins (29). They sealed their 23rd German title on 6 April with a record six games remaining and then won the German Cup for a record 16th time.

- The former centre-back began his coaching career in 1988 with the sole club of his playing days, Universidad de Chile, before spending the next 16 years working with sides in Chile, Ecuador and Argentina.
- Took over at Villarreal in 2004, guiding them to third place in the Liga in his debut season and securing a place in the UEFA Champions League for the first time. His side also reached the quarter-finals of the UEFA Cup.
- The following campaign, Villarreal defied all expectations by reaching the UEFA Champions League semi-finals, where they lost 1-0 on aggregate to Arsenal FC. Guided the club to second place in the 2007/08 Liga, a club record, and the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals the following season, again being knocked out by Arsenal.
- Signed a two-year contract with Real Madrid on 2 June 2009, the Merengues winning a then club record 96 points in the Liga but still finishing second behind FC Barcelona, prompting Pellegrini's dismissal in May 2010
- That November he succeeded Jesualdo Ferreira as coach of Málaga and in the following campaign oversaw a fourth-placed league finish, the club's best ever. In an echo of his feats with Villarreal, he then took the Andalusian team through UEFA Champions League qualifying and all the way to the quarter-finals. In summer 2013, joined Manchester City on a three-year deal to replace Roberto Mancini.

FC Bayern München: Josep Guardiola

Date of birth: 18 January 1971

Coaching career: FC Barcelona B, FC Barcelona, FC Bayern München

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001. Also had spells with Brescia, Fabio Capello's Roma, Al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinola before ending his playing career in 2006.
- Won 40 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cup tournaments through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, he took charge of the senior side in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season in charge. In the process he became the sixth man to have lifted the European Cup as player and coach.
- That was just the beginning of a glorious four-season spell which yielded 14 trophies in all. In his second campaign, Guardiola steered Barcelona to a second Liga title as well as the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups and the FIFA Club World Cup. Even more success followed in 2010/11 as Barcelona completed a hat-trick of Spanish titles and, for the second time under Guardiola, got the better of Manchester United FC in the UEFA Champions League final.
- In his final season, 2011/12, Guardiola's team won the UEFA Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup once more before he signed off his reign with a second Copa del Rey triumph. After a year's break from football, Guardiola took charge of Bayern in June 2013, replacing Juup Heynckes at the helm.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
