Match background

FC Bayern München will look to strengthen their position at the top of Group D when they welcome bottom club FC Viktoria Plzeň on matchday three.

- Josep Guardiola's holders have performed like champions in beating PFC CSKA Moskva and Manchester City FC and now take on the group's least experienced team, Plzeň.
- After two defeats so far, the Czech champions already find themselves with a mountain to climb – and a visit to a city where they lost 6-1 on their only previous visit is a daunting prospect for Pavel Vrba's side.

Past meetings

• Bayern earned a 7-1 aggregate victory when the teams met in the 1971/72 European Cup Winners' Cup first round. Wolfgang Sühnholz hit the only goal of the first leg in Plzen and Bayern doubled their aggregate lead in the first minute of the return through Gerd Müller. Although Ivan Bican equalised, Bayern ran out 6-1 winners with Franz Krauthausen, Wilhelm Hoffmann (2), Franz Roth and Müller again scoring. Bayern's current club president, Uli Hoeness, featured in both games.

Match background

- Bayern have won 13 of their last 15 home UEFA Champions League fixtures in Munich, most recently a 3-0 success against CSKA on matchday one.
- Plzeň had been on a seven-match unbeaten streak on the road in UEFA competition prior to their 3-2 defeat at CSKA last time out.
- This is Bayern's first encounter with Czech opposition since the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League first group stage when they met AC Sparta Praha, drawing 0-0 in Munich and winning 1-0 in Prague thanks to a Jiří Novotný own goal.
- Bayern have never lost at home to Czech opposition and their overall record reads W7 D2 L1. That solitary defeat was a 2-1 loss at FC Baník Ostrava in the 1976/77 European Champion Clubs' Cup second round but even then they won the return leg 5-0.
- Plzeň's only other meeting with Bundesliga opposition came in the 2011/12 UEFA Europa League round of 32 against FC Schalke 04. After Vladimír Darida scored in a 1-1 home draw, the return in Germany went to extra time after František Rajtoral equalised two minutes from the end to make it 1-1. However, Schalke eventually ran out 3-1 winners thanks to a Klaas-Jan Huntelaar hat-trick.

Team ties

- Plzeň faced Guardiola's FC Barcelona in their debut group stage campaign in 2011/12, meeting on matchdays three and four, and losing 2-0 away and 4-0 at home.
- As a player, Guardiola faced AC Sparta Praha with Barcelona in the group stage of the 1991/92 European Cup, winning 3-2 at home and losing 1-0 away. When he faced Sparta with Barcelona again – in the second group stage in 1999/2000 – he scored his only UEFA Champions League goal in a 5-0 home victory and also featured in a 2-1 success in Prague.
- With Spain in 1998 FIFA World Cup qualifying, Guardiola played in a goalless away draw with the Czech Republic and a 1-0 home victory.
- As assistant manager of Slovakia, Vrba saw his team lose 2-1 against Germany in a UEFA EURO 2008 qualifier in Hamburg, with Philipp Lahm in the opposition lineup.
- Milan Petržela made 12 Bundesliga appearances for FC Augsburg in 2012/13, appearing as a late substitute in a 2-0 home loss to Bayern last December.
- Roman Hubník was at Hertha BSC Berlin from 2010 to 2013 and suffered two heavy defeats against Bayern in 2011/12, losing 4-0 away and 6-0 at home.
- Javi Martínez helped Spain win 2-0 at a Czech Republic side including Hubník and Daniel Kolář in UEFA EURO 2012 qualifying.
- Hubník scored for the Czech Republic in a 3-1 friendly defeat of Daniel Van Buyten's Belgium in 2009.
- Marek Bakoš was in the Slovakia side beaten 2-0 away by Arjen Robben's Netherlands in a May 2012 friendly.
- Radim Řezník and Tomáš Hořava faced Mario Götze in the Czech Republic's 1-1 home draw with Germany in a 2011 UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifier.
- Mario Mandžukić's GNK Dinamo Zagreb team overcame Matúš Kozáčik's Sparta Praha on away goals in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup first round.

- Marián Čižovský played for FC Timișoara in their 2-0 aggregate loss to VfB Stuttgart in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League play-offs.
- Pavel Horváth has won just once in seven visits to Germany over the last 15 years – 2-1 at 1. FC Kaiserslautern with FK Teplice in the 2003/04 UEFA Cup first round.
- Horváth first faced Bundesliga opposition in March 1998, with SK Slavia Praha in a 2-0 defeat against Stuttgart in the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals. He was in the Czech Republic side beaten 3-2 in Germany in a June 2000 friendly, the year of his only previous UEFA Champions League trip to Germany – Sporting Clube de Portugal's 3-2 loss at Bayer 04 Leverkusen in the first group stage.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Bayern are bidding to become the first team to defend the trophy in the UEFA Champions League era.
- Jérôme Boateng is suspended following his red card on matchday two.
- Arjen Robben has scored in Bayern's last five UEFA Champions League matches, a club record.

General information

- Dante was taken off with a deep cut to his ankle before half-time as Bayern came from behind to beat 1. FSV Mainz 05 4-1 on Saturday. Franck Ribéry was ruled out with an ankle injury sustained in training on the eve of the game.
- Bayern moved top of the Bundesliga for the first time this season after a 1-1 draw at Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 5 October, capitalising on defeat for Borussia Dortmund. Toni Kroos scored his first goal for the club since February.
- Xherdan Shaqiri has been ruled out for six to seven weeks after injuring his hamstring in Switzerland's 2-1 victory over Albania on 11 October. Thiago Alcántara has not played since suffering ankle ligament damage on his first Bayern start on 24 August. Javi Martínez has been out since undergoing groin surgery on 3 September but returned to team training on Sunday.
- Ribéry has not been on the losing side in the Bundesliga in 38 games (since a 1-0 defeat at Dortmund on 11 April 2012), equalling the German top-flight record set by Holger Hieronymus at Hamburger SV in the early 1980s. Ribéry missed Bayern's only league defeat last term with a thigh problem.
- Bayern have registered in each of their last 31 matches in all competitions. They have scored in their last 46 league games, a Bundesliga record, and are unbeaten in a club best 34 top-flight outings. FCB won 46 of their 54 fixtures in all competitions last season; they have won 11 out of 15 this.

International duty

- Fifteen Bayern players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Manuel Neuer, Philipp Lahm, Boateng, Bastian Schweinsteiger, Kroos, Mario Götze, Thomas Müller (Germany), Robben (Netherlands), Ribéry (France), David Alaba (Austria), Shaqiri (Switzerland), Mario Mandžukić (Croatia), Daniel Van Buyten (Belgium), Claudio Pizarro (Peru), Dante (Brazil).
- Six Bayern players were in Germany's starting lineup as a 3-0 win against the Republic of Ireland on 11 October sealed progress to the FIFA World Cup. Four days later Schweinsteiger won his 100th cap as Germany beat Sweden 5-3. Six Bayern players were again in the starting XI and Götze came on to score.
- Shaqiri and Van Buyten helped book places in Brazil on 11 October. Shaqiri scored Switzerland's first in a 2-1 victory over Albania before going off injured, while Van Buyten's Belgium won 2-1 against a Croatia side featuring Mandžukić.
- Robben scored for the Netherlands against Hungary (8-1) and Turkey (2-0), Pizarro struck as Peru lost 3-1 in Argentina and Alaba registered from the spot as Austria beat the Faroe Islands 3-0. Ribéry converted a penalty and played a part in the five other goals as France overwhelmed Australia 6-0 in a friendly on 11 October, opening the scoring again in a 3-0 qualifying win against Finland four days later.

Plzeň

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Marián Čižovský's five goals made him the top scorer of the qualification phase alongside FC Zenit's Roman Shirokov. The centre-back missed matchdays one and two through injury but has resumed training.
- Plzeň's game with Manchester City FC was the first UEFA Champions League match to be staged in Plzeň as in 2011/12 they played their three home group games at Prague's Stadion Eden. The Štruncovy Sady Stadión therefore became the 142nd venue to stage a UEFA Champions League match.

General information

- Čižovský returned after seven games out with a calf problem on Saturday as Plzeň drew 1-1 with SK Slavia Praha.
- Plzeň are unbeaten after 11 rounds of the Czech First League, recording seven wins and four draws.
- David Limberský has not featured since picking up a thigh injury on 27 September.
- Midfielder Martin Pospíšil, who made his league debut for Plzeň in a 0-0 draw at home to FK Dukla Praha on 21 September, scored twice as Plzeň beat fourth-tier SK Kladno 3-1 in the third round of the Czech Cup on 12 October.

International duty

- Six Plzeň players were on senior duty during the international break: František Rajtoral, Václav Procházka, Tomáš

Hořava (Czech Republic), Michal Ďuriš, Marek Bakoš, Matúš Kozáčik (Slovakia).

Head coach

FC Bayern München: Josep Guardiola

Date of birth: 18 January 1971

Nationality: Spanish

Playing career: FC Barcelona, Brescia Calcio (twice), AS Roma, Al-Ahly Club, Dorados de Sinola

Coaching career: FC Barcelona B, FC Barcelona, FC Bayern München

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001. Also had spells with Brescia, Fabio Capello's Roma, Al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinola before ending his playing career in 2006.
- Won 40 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cup tournaments through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, he took charge of the senior side in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season in charge. In the process he became the sixth man to have lifted the European Cup as player and coach.
- That was just the beginning of a glorious four-season spell which yielded 14 trophies in all. In his second campaign, Guardiola steered Barcelona to a second Liga title as well as the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups and the FIFA Club World Cup. Even more success followed in 2010/11 as Barcelona completed a hat-trick of Spanish titles and, for the second time under Guardiola, got the better of Manchester United FC in the UEFA Champions League final.
- In his final season, 2011/12, Guardiola's team won the UEFA Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup once more before he signed off his reign with a second Copa del Rey triumph. After a year's break from football, Guardiola took charge of Bayern in June 2013, replacing Juup Heynckes at the helm.

FC Viktoria Plzeň: Pavel Vrba

Date of birth: 6 December 1963

Nationality: Czech

Playing career: FC Baník Ostrava (twice), TJ Železářny Prostějov, RH Cheb, TJ Baník Havířov, FC Přerov

Coaching career: FC Přerov, FC Baník Ostrava (youth, assistant), Czech Republic Under-20, FK Púchov, MŠK Žilina, Slovakia (assistant), FC Viktoria Plzeň

- The defender was part of the Czechoslovakia side that reached the final of the 1982 UEFA European Under-18 Championship and also appeared at the FIFA U-20 World Cup the following year; the Czechs lost in the quarter-finals to a Brazil team including Bebeto and Dunga.
- His club career did not hit the same highs, Vrba making a handful of appearances for Cheb and Baník before finishing his playing days in the lower leagues with hometown club Přerov.
- Returned to Baník as a youth coach and also went back to the U20 World Cup, taking charge of the Czech Republic in the 2003 edition. Became assistant at Baník and, despite a 7-0 loss to SK Slavia Praha in his first match in temporary charge in May 2003, ended the next season with the league title.
- That summer crossed the border into Slovakia, winning a championship as head coach of Žilina in 2007, by which time he was also working as assistant to Ján Kocián with the country's national side.
- Moved on to Plzeň in 2008, winning the Czech Cup in his second season – when he was voted the country's coach of the year – and the league in 2011. Led the club into the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time in 2011/12 and repeated the trick two years later following another title in 2013.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

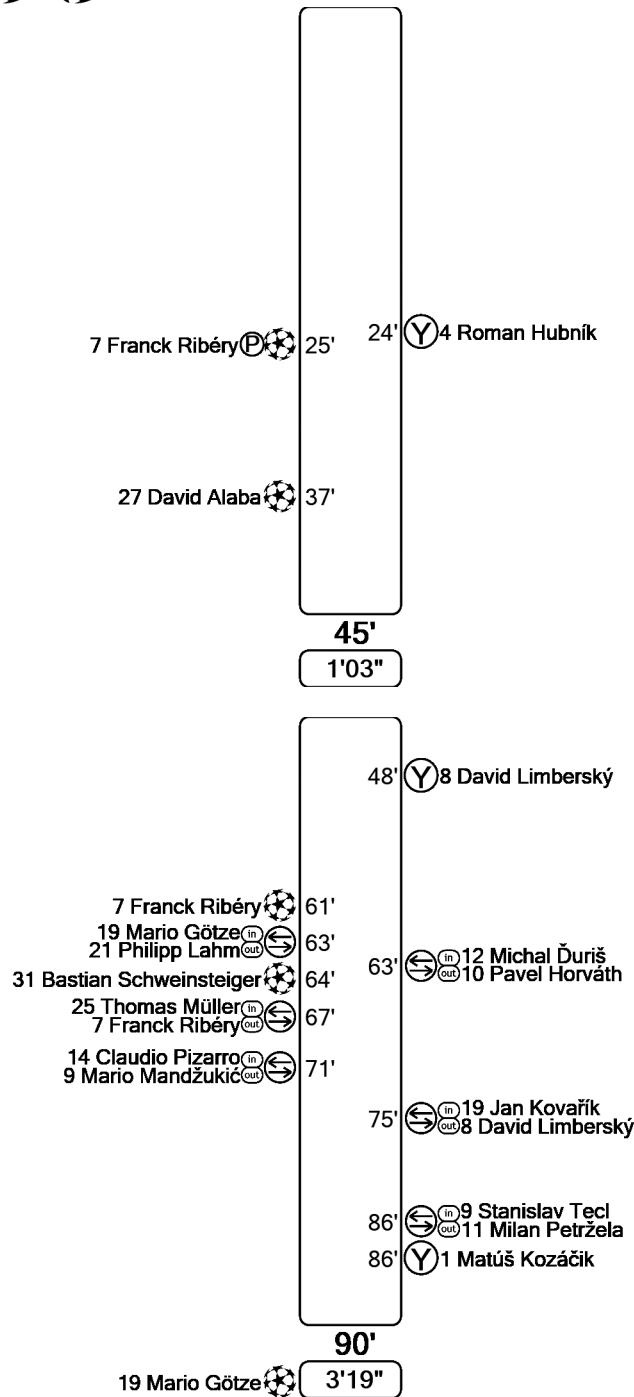

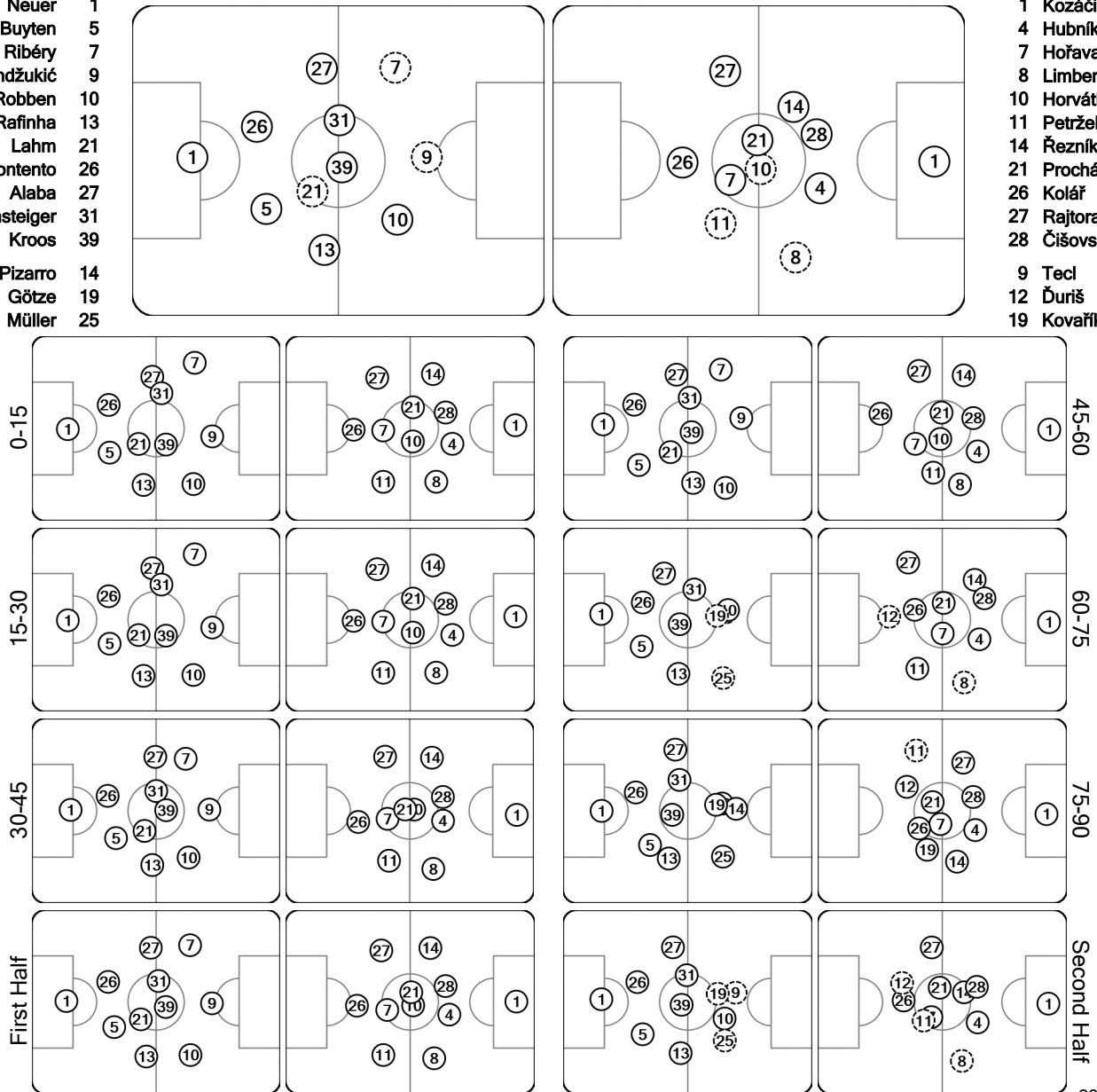
