Match background

UEFA Champions League holders FC Bayern München travel to the Czech Republic looking to inflict another defeat on FC Viktoria Plzeň and maintain their 100% winning start in Group D.

- Bayern's 5-0 defeat of Plzeň last time out kept them three points clear at the top of the section and they will book their progress to the last 16 if they win and Manchester City FC avoid defeat against PFC CSKA Moskva in the group's other game.
- Plzeň are looking to restore some pride after three straight losses, although Pavel Vrba's men would be eliminated if they fail to match or better City's result against CSKA.

Past meetings

• Bayern earned a 7-1 aggregate victory when the teams met in the 1971/72 European Cup Winners' Cup first round. Wolfgang Sühnholz hit the only goal of the first leg in Plzen and Bayern doubled their aggregate lead in the first minute of the return through Gerd Müller. Although Ivan Bican equalised, Bayern ran out 6-1 winners with Franz Krauthausen, Wilhelm Hoffmann (2), Franz Roth and Müller again scoring. Bayern's current club president, Uli Hoeness, featured in both games.

Match background

- Although Plzeň lost heavily at home to Manchester City on matchday one, they had won ten of their preceding 11 home fixtures in UEFA competition including three in a row in this season's UEFA Champions League qualifying rounds.
- Reigning champions Bayern, however, are enjoying their best run of form on the road in Europe since posting six successive away wins in their triumphant 1995/96 UEFA Cup campaign. Including last season, they have now won four in a row in the UEFA Champions League and five of their last six.
- Bayern's most recent visit to the Czech Republic brought a 1-0 victory over AC Sparta Praha in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League first group stage, courtesy of a Jiří Novotný own goal.
- Bayern have a strong away record against Czech clubs, which reads W4 D0 L1. That solitary defeat was a 2-1 loss at FC Baník Ostrava in the 1976/77 European Champion Clubs' Cup second round but even then they won the return leg 5-0.
- Plzeň's only other meeting with Bundesliga opposition came in the 2011/12 UEFA Europa League round of 32 against FC Schalke 04. After Vladimír Darida scored in a 1-1 home draw, the return in Germany went to extra time after František Rajtoral equalised two minutes from the end to make it 1-1. However, Schalke eventually ran out 3-1 winners thanks to a Klaas-Jan Huntelaar hat-trick.

Team ties

- Plzeň faced Josep Guardiola's FC Barcelona in their debut group stage campaign in 2011/12, meeting on matchdays three and four, and losing 2-0 away and 4-0 at home.
- As a player, Guardiola faced AC Sparta Praha with Barcelona in the group stage of the 1991/92 European Cup, winning 3-2 at home and losing 1-0 away. When he faced Sparta with Barcelona again in the second group stage in 1999/2000 he scored his only UEFA Champions League goal in a 5-0 home victory and also featured in a 2-1 success in Prague.
- With Spain in 1998 FIFA World Cup qualifying, Guardiola played in a goalless away draw with the Czech Republic and a 1-0 home victory.
- As assistant manager of Slovakia, Vrba saw his team lose 2-1 against Germany in a UEFA EURO 2008 qualifier in Hamburg, with Philipp Lahm in the opposition lineup.
- Milan Petržela made 12 Bundesliga appearances for FC Augsburg in 2012/13, appearing as a late substitute in a 2-0 home loss to Bayern last December.
- Roman Hubník was at Hertha BSC Berlin from 2010 to 2013 and suffered two heavy defeats against Bayern in 2011/12, losing 4-0 away and 6-0 at home.
- Javi Martínez helped Spain win 2-0 at a Czech Republic side including Hubník and Daniel Kolář in UEFA EURO 2012 qualifying.
- Hubník scored for the Czech Republic in a 3-1 friendly defeat of Daniel Van Buyten's Belgium in 2009.
- Marek Bakoš was in the Slovakia side beaten 2-0 away by Arjen Robben's Netherlands in a May 2012 friendly.
- Radim Řezník and Tomáš Hořava faced Mario Götze in the Czech Republic's 1-1 home draw with Germany in a 2011 UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifier.

- Mario Mandžukić's GNK Dinamo Zagreb team overcame Matúš Kozáčik's Sparta Praha on away goals in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup first round.
- Marián Čišovský played for FC Timişoara in their 2-0 aggregate loss to VfB Stuttgart in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League play-offs.
- Pavel Horváth has won just once in seven visits to Germany over the last 15 years 2-1 at 1. FC Kaiserslautern with FK Teplice in the 2003/04 UEFA Cup first round.
- Horváth first faced Bundesliga opposition in March 1998, with SK Slavia Praha in a 2-0 defeat against Stuttgart in the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals. He was in the Czech Republic side beaten 3-2 in Germany in a June 2000 friendly, the year of his only previous UEFA Champions League trip to Germany Sporting Clube de Portugal's 3-2 loss at Bayer 04 Leverkusen in the first group stage.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- The 5-0 loss to Bayern on matchday three was Plzeň's heaviest defeat in the UEFA Champions League, equalling their worst reverse in UEFA competition set when Bayern beat them 6-1 in the 1971/72 European Cup Winners' Cup.
- Marián Čišovský's five goals made him the top scorer of the qualification phase alongside FC Zenit's Roman Shirokov. The centre-back missed matchdays one and two through injury.
- Plzeň's game with Manchester City FC was the first UEFA Champions League match to be staged in their home city as in 2011/12 they played their three home group games at Prague's Stadion Eden. The Štruncovy Sady Stadion therefore became the 142nd venue to stage a UEFA Champions League match.
- David Limberský is a booking away from a suspension after picking up two yellow cards.

General information

- Plzeň had gone 226 minutes without a goal before Pavel Horváth broke the deadlock from the penalty spot on Friday, setting the hosts on course for a 6-1 win against FK Jablonec.
- · Limberský missed the Jablonec match through illness.
- Plzeň's 11-match unbeaten start to the Czech First League seven wins and four draws ended on 26 October with a 1-0 loss to FK Teplice.

Bayern

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Bayern stretched their winning UEFA Champions League run to a club record eight on matchday three. Victory on Tuesday would match FC Barcelona's all-time high of nine set in 2002/03.
- Bayern are bidding to become the first team to defend the trophy in the UEFA Champions League era.
- Arjen Robben had scored in five consecutive UEFA Champions League games, a club record, before matchday three.

General information

- Bayern are unbeaten in a club best 36 top-flight outings, equalling Hamburger SV's Bundesliga record set between 1982 and 1983.
- Robben was rested with a groin problem on Saturday as Bayern fell behind for the third successive Bundesliga game before recovering to win, this time 2-1 at TSG 1899 Hoffenheim.
- Bayern are 24 games unbeaten away from home in the Bundesliga (W20 D4), just two shy of their German top-flight record set between December 1985 and August 1987.
- Xherdan Shaqiri has been out since injuring his hamstring in Switzerland's 2-1 victory over Albania on 11 October while Thiago Alcántara has not played since suffering ankle ligament damage on his first Bayern start on 24 August. Claudio Pizarro suffered a thigh injury in training on 24 October and has been ruled out until December.
- Franck Ribéry has not been on the losing side in the Bundesliga in 40 games (since a 1-0 defeat at Borussia Dortmund on 11 April 2012), surpassing the German top-flight record of 38 set by Holger Hieronymus at Hamburg in the early 1980s. Ribéry missed Bayern's only league defeat last term with a thigh problem.
- Mario Götze followed up his first goal for Bayern on matchday three with his first in the Bundesliga for the club three days later in a 3-2 win at home to Hertha BSC Berlin. All three Bayern goals, from Götze and Mario Mandžukić (2), were headers.
- Javi Martínez, out since undergoing groin surgery on 3 September, returned against Hertha.
- Bayern have registered in each of their last 34 matches in all competitions. They have scored in their last 48 league games, a Bundesliga record.
- FCB won 46 of their 54 fixtures in all competitions last season; they have won 14 out of 18 this.
- David Alaba was crowned Austrian Sportsman of the Year on 31 October, the first footballer to receive the award since Toni Polster in 1997.
- Bayern provide six of the 23 players shortlisted for the 2014 FIFA Ballon d'Or, which will be announced on 13 January: Philipp Lahm, Thomas Müller, Manuel Neuer, Ribéry, Robben and Bastian Schweinsteiger. Former boss Jupp Heynckes has been nominated for FIFA World Coach of the Year for Men's Football.

• The defender was part of the Czechoslovakia side that reached the final of the 1982 UEFA European Under-18 Championship and also appeared at the FIFA U-20 World Cup the following year; the Czechs lost in the quarter-finals to a Brazil team including Bebeto and Dunga.

- His club career did not hit the same highs, Vrba making a handful of appearances for Cheb and Baník before finishing his playing days in the lower leagues with hometown club Přerov.
- Returned to Baník as a youth coach and also went back to the U20 World Cup, taking charge of the Czech Republic in the 2003 edition. Became assistant at Baník and, despite a 7-0 loss to SK Slavia Praha in his first match in temporary charge in May 2003, ended the next season with the league title.
- That summer crossed the border into Slovakia, winning a championship as head coach of Žilina in 2007, by which time he was also working as assistant to Ján Kocián with the country's national side.
- Moved on to Plzeň in 2008, winning the Czech Cup in his second season when he was voted the country's coach of the year and the league in 2011. Led the club into the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time in 2011/12 and repeated the trick two years later following another title in 2013. In November 2013, agreed to take charge of Czech Republic national team at the end of Plzeň's group stage campaign.

FC Bayern München: Josep Guardiola

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001. Also had spells with Brescia, Fabio Capello's Roma, al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinola before ending his playing career in 2006. Won 40 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cup tournaments through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, he took charge of the senior side in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season in charge. In the process he became the sixth man to have lifted the European Cup as player and coach.
- That was just the beginning of a glorious four-season spell which yielded 14 trophies in all. In his second campaign, Guardiola steered Barcelona to a second Liga title as well as the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups and the FIFA Club World Cup. Even more sucess followed in 2010/11 as Barcelona completed a hat-trick of Spanish titles and, for the second time under Guardiola, got the better of Manchester United FC in the UEFA Champions League final.
- In his final season, 2011/12, Guardiola's team won the UEFA Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup once more before he signed off his reign with a second Copa del Rey triumph.
- After a year's break from football, Guardiola took charge of Bayern in June 2013, replacing Jupp Heynckes at the helm. In his first campaign he collected the UEFA Super Cup, FIFA Club World Cup and, with a record seven games to spare, the Bundesliga title.
