## Match background

---

Olympique de Marseille begin their ninth UEFA Champions League campaign with a match against familiar foes Arsenal FC, who beat them to first place in their section two seasons ago.

### Previous meetings

- Arsenal had the better of the two games in 2011/12, winning 1-0 away through Aaron Ramsey's late winner before the London return ended goalless. The Gunners finished a point ahead in the final standings.
- The lineups in Marseille on 19 October 2011 were:  
**Marseille:** Mandanda, Azpilicueta, Diawara, N'Koulou, Morel, Diarra, Lucho González (Amalfitano 73), Cheyrou (Kaboré 87), Valbuena, A Ayew, Rémy (Gignac 69).  
**Arsenal:** Szczęsny, Jenkinson (Djourou 62), Mertesacker, Koscielny, André Santos, Song, Arteta, Rosický, Walcott (Gervinho 67), Arshavin (Ramsey 78), Van Persie.
- The defeat means OM's home record against English visitors is W7 D1 L3, with the three defeats coming in the last five fixtures. They have faced three English opponents in their last two campaigns, beating Chelsea FC 1-0 on home soil in the 2010/11 group stage and drawing 0-0 at home to Manchester United FC in the round of 16 before a 2-1 away loss.
- Arsenal have remained unbeaten in their nine visits to France: six wins and three draws. They have won the last five fixtures, including a 2-1 success at Montpellier Hérault SC on matchday one last season.
- The Gunners have lost two European finals in Paris: 2-1 to FC Barcelona in the 2006 UEFA Champions League and 2-1 (aet) to Real Zaragoza in the 1995 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup.

### Match background

- Last season's absence ended a run of five successive UEFA Champions League campaigns for Marseille. In 2011/12 they made it to the quarter-finals for the first time since becoming the tournament's inaugural winners in 1993, losing 2-0 home and away to FC Bayern München.
- Marseille have lost their last three home fixtures on matchday one; two years ago they were away, at Olympiacos FC, and won 1-0.
- OM's progress to the 2011/12 quarter-finals came despite their poor home UEFA Champions League record. They lost twice at Stade Vélodrome in the group and the loss to Bayern means they have suffered ten defeats in their last 21 home fixtures in the competition proper, with only eight victories.
- Arsenal's success in France is out of step with their recent record on their travels which shows nine defeats in 17 away games in the competition proper and five victories.
- Arsène Wenger's team, who finished fourth in the 2012/13 Premier League, are in the group stage for the 16th season in a row. For the sixth time in eight campaigns they had to negotiate a qualifying round, overcoming Fenerbahçe SK 5-0 on aggregate in the play-offs. Ramsey scored once in the 3-0 win in Turkey and then got both goals in the home victory.
- For the third season in a row Arsenal departed from last year's competition in the round of 16, losing 3-1 at home to Bayern and bowing out on away goals after a 2-0 away win. It was the 13th successive time that they had made it through the group.
- The win at Montpellier extended their unbeaten run on matchday one to nine games: seven wins and two draws. Their last opening-day defeat came on 17 September 2003 when FC Internazionale Milano won 3-0 at Highbury.

### Team ties

- Mathieu Flamini began his career at OM, making his senior debut in December 2003. At the end of that season he joined Arsenal for the first time.
- Arsène Wenger was a defender with RC Strasbourg and began his coaching career with AS Nancy-Lorraine and AS Monaco FC.
- Bacary Sagna (AJ Auxerre 2004–2007), Laurent Koscielny (EA Guingamp 2004–2007, Tours FC 2007–2009, FC Lorient 2009/10), Mikel Arteta (Paris Saint-Germain FC 2001–2002), Olivier Giroud (Grenoble Foot 38 2005-2008, FC Istres, loan, 2007-2008, Tours FC 2008-2010, Montpellier 2010-2012) and Yaya Sanogo (Auxerre 2010-2013) have all played in France.
- Sagna, Koscielny and Giroud are France team-mates of Steve Mandanda, André-Pierre Gignac, Mathieu Valbuena, Dimitri Payet and Rod Fanni.
- Valbuena scored France's second goal in a 2-1 friendly win against England at Wembley Stadium on 17 November

2010. Theo Walcott and Kieran Gibbs both appeared for the home side.

- Sanogo, Mario Lemina and Florian Thauvin were all part of France's triumphant FIFA Under-20 World Cup squad in Turkey this summer.
- Sagna and Benoît Cheyrou were team-mates at Auxerre.
- Alaixys Romao and Jérémy Morel played with Koscielny at Lorient.
- Jordan and André Ayew play for Ghana alongside Emmanuel Frimpong.
- Souleymane Diawara spent 2006/07 in England with Charlton Athletic FC.

- Six Marseille players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Steve Mandanda, Mathieu Valbuena, Payet, André-Pierre Gignac (France), André Ayew (Ghana) and Nicolas N'Koulou (Cameroon).
- Gignac won his first cap since the 2010 FIFA World Cup when he replaced Karim Benzema in France's goalless draw with Georgia on 6 September.
- Four days later Valbuena provided two assists as France won 4-2 in Belarus to secure a top-two finish in World Cup qualifying Group I.

#### General information

- Gignac scored in OM's first three games this season, his best start to a campaign.
- Lucas Mendes marked his first appearance of the campaign – a 2-1 defeat by AS Monaco FC on 1 September – with his first goal in 33 games. The 23-year-old's only previous strike for OM came on his club debut last October. He made it two in as many outings with Saturday's late equaliser in the 1-1 draw at Toulouse FC.
- Of Marseille's 21 wins in Ligue 1 last season, 18 were by a single goal and 12 ended 1-0.

### Arsenal

- This is Arsenal's 16th successive UEFA Champions League campaign, longevity bettered only by Manchester United FC (18) and Real Madrid CF (17).

- Arsenal paid in the region of €50m for Özil, three times their previous club record outlay of €16m for Arshavin in 2009.

- Eleven Arsenal players were on senior international duty last week: Jack Wilshere, Theo Walcott (England), Per Mertesacker, Özil (Germany), Wojciech Szczęsny, Łukasz Fabiański (Poland), Bacary Sagna, Laurent Koscielny, Olivier Giroud (France), Tomáš Rosický (Czech Republic) and Aaron Ramsey (Wales).

#### General information

- Arsenal have won five in a row in all competitions since starting their season with a 3-1 home defeat by Aston Villa FC on 17 August.
- Giroud has registered a goal in five of Arsenal's six fixtures this term, as many as he mustered in his first 16 outings in 2012/13. Saturday's goal at Sunderland AFC was the first he has scored outside London in the Premier League.
- Ramsey has scored six goals for club and country this term, already double what he managed in the whole of 2012/13.
- Thomas Vermaelen made his first appearance of the season following a back problem as a late substitute on Saturday, replacing debutant Özil.
- Arsenal have won their last nine away games in all competitions, a run that started with the 2-0 victory at FC Bayern

München in last season's round of 16. Seven have come in the league, just one shy of their best set in 2001/02.

- Mikel Arteta is yet to play this season because of a thigh problem, while Abou Diaby has been sidelined since March with a knee injury. Lukas Podolski (hamstring) could be out until November and Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain has missed five games with a knee problem.

---

**Date of birth:** 17 March 1955

**Coaching career:** CO Castelnaudary, Toulouse FC, AS Saint-Étienne (twice), FC Girondins de Bordeaux, FC Nantes, Olympique de Marseille

- The Pyrenean-born Baup's promising career as a goalkeeper ended at the age of 20 when a car crash left him with two broken bones in his neck.
- Having gained formal coaching qualifications, Baup put his theory into practice with amateur side Castelnaudary, doing enough to attract the attention of Toulouse, who put him in charge of their youth academy in 1984; Fabien Barthez was among his discoveries, and he was to move to St-Étienne in a similar capacity in 1991, briefly taking command of the senior team in 1996.
- Hired by Bordeaux in 1997, Baup embarked on the most successful spell of his career, with his Girondins selection pipping Marseille to the 1998/99 French title then beating FC Lorient 3-0 in the 2001/02 League Cup final, a victory best remembered for a tremendous Pauleta bicycle kick.
- Having regularly led Bordeaux in Europe, Baup was to return to UEFA competitions in subsequent spells with St-Étienne (2004-06) and Toulouse (2006-08), but took time out after his Nantes side were relegated from Ligue 1 at the end of the 2008/09 campaign.
- Following a successful spell as a TV pundit, Baup returned to coaching, replacing Didier Deschamps at Marseille in July 2012; his side started the 2012/13 season with a record six straight Ligue 1 wins en route to qualifying for the UEFA Champions League group stage as runners-up to Paris Saint-Germain FC.

### Arsenal FC: Arsène Wenger

---

**Date of birth:** 22 October 1949

**Nationality:** French

**Coaching career:** RC Strasbourg (assistant coach), AS Cannes (assistant coach), AS Nancy-Lorraine, AS Monaco FC, Nagoya Grampus Eight, Arsenal FC

- Not the most successful of players, Arsène Wenger has more than made up for that as a coach, turning Arsenal into one of Europe's top teams.
- Born in Strasbourg, Wenger worked at Strasbourg and Cannes before Nancy-Lorraine offered him his big break. He impressed sufficiently to be offered the job as coach of Monaco in 1987.
- Within a year Monaco scooped the French title and Wenger the Coach of the Year award. He led the side to 1991 French Cup glory, then the 1992 European Cup Winners' Cup final where they lost to SV Werder Bremen. After reportedly turning down France and FC Bayern München, he moved on to Japan and enjoyed huge success with Grampus Eight.
- Appointed by Arsenal in September 1996, Wenger became the first non-Briton to win the Premier League in 1998, adding the first of four FA Cup triumphs. The Gunners lost the 2000 UEFA Cup final to Galatasaray AŞ but claimed another double in 2002, and in 2003/04 played some thrilling attacking football en route to becoming the first team since 1889 to negotiate an English top-flight season unbeaten.
- Wenger nearly topped all his achievements by taking Arsenal to the 2006 UEFA Champions League final, only for FC Barcelona to come from behind to win 2-1. Arsenal's move to their new stadium later that year was also instigated by Wenger.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

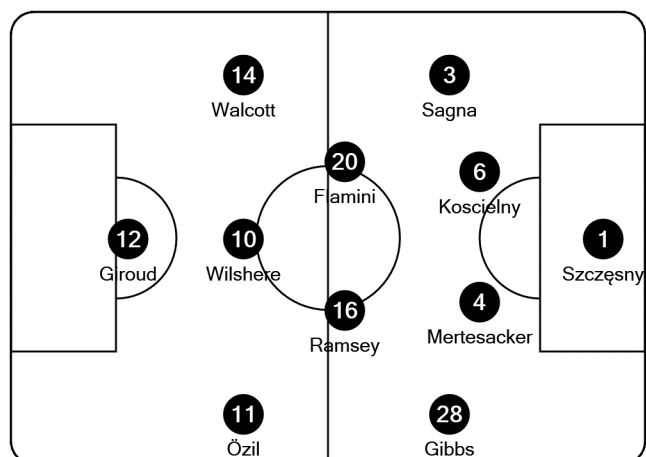

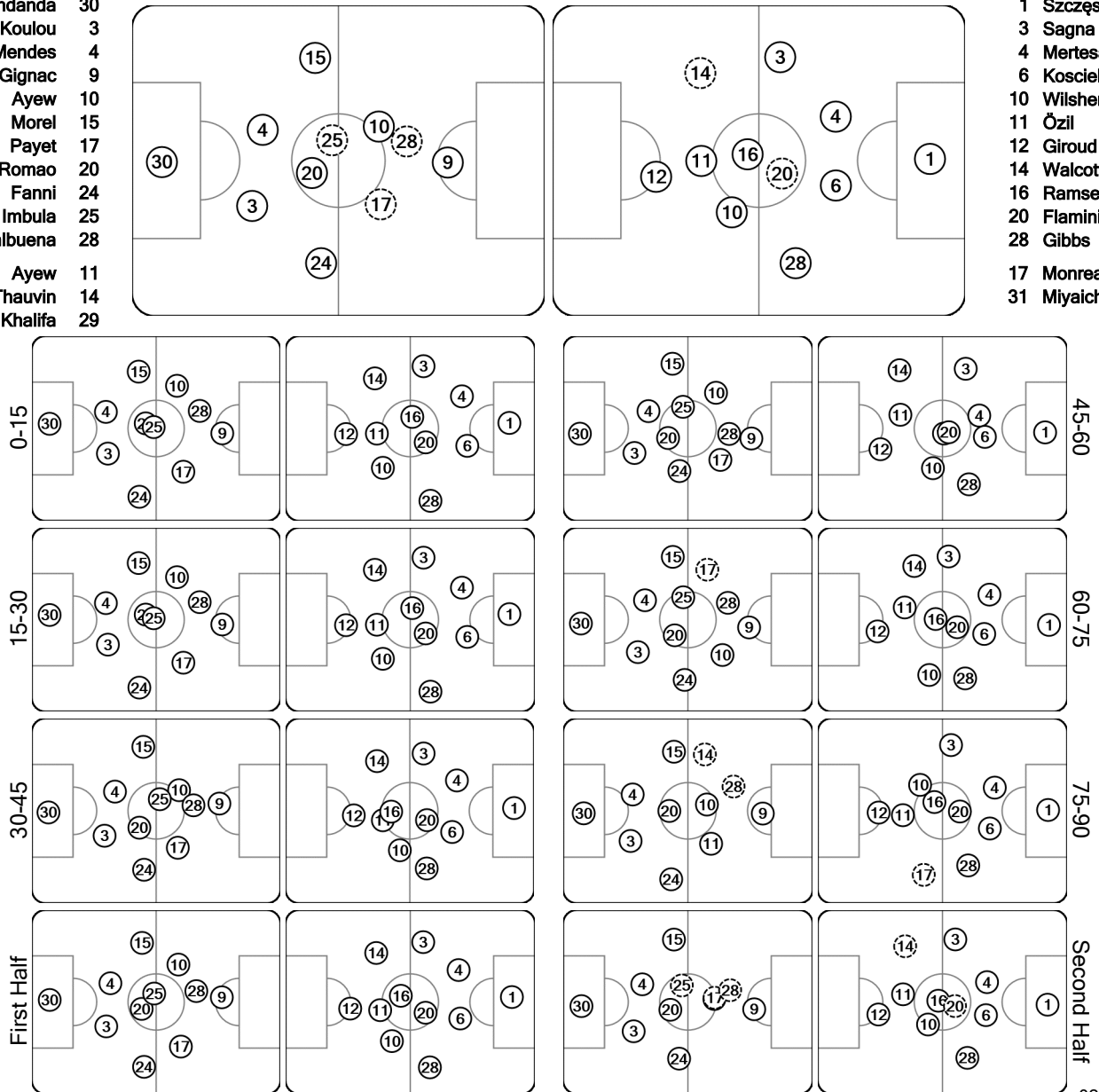
