Match background

SSC Napoli begin only their second UEFA Champions League group-stage campaign with the visit of Borussia Dortmund, last season's runners-up.

Previous meetings

- In the first competitive meeting between the teams, new Napoli coach Rafael Benítez will be hoping to improve on the club's recent record against German opponents – no wins and five defeats in the last seven fixtures.
- Their overall record is W3 D4 L7 while at home it is W3 D1 L3.
- Napoli's last victory over a German side was a hugely significant moment when, with Diego Maradona in his pomp, they beat VfB Stuttgart 2-1 at home before drawing 3-3 away to lift their only European trophy, the 1989 UEFA Cup.
- In that campaign they also beat two other German opponents: 1. FC Lokomotive Leipzig, 3-1 on aggregate in the second round, and FC Bayern München, 4-2 on aggregate in the semi-finals.
- This is Dortmund's first Italian examination since the 2008/09 UEFA Cup first round tie with Udinese Calcio in which the away team prevailed 2-0 in both legs, the German club losing 4-3 on penalties. Gökhan Inler scored Udinese's second goal in the first leg.
- Dortmund, who are in their ninth UEFA Champions League campaign, did not beat Italian opponents until their eighth fixture. In a total of 27 games their record is W9 D4 L14; in Italy it is W4 D1 L8.

Match background

- Benítez enjoyed winning starts in his first UEFA Champions League group stage games with three of his previous clubs – Chelsea FC, Liverpool FC and Valencia CF. His first fixture for FC Internazionale Milano ended in a draw.
- Since returning to continental competition in 2008 after an absence of 13 years, Napoli had established a formidable home record and went unbeaten in 14 matches before PSV Eindhoven won 3-1 at the Stadio San Paolo in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage. It was the Serie A side's first home loss since a December 1994 defeat by Eintracht Frankfurt in the UEFA Cup third round.
- FC Viktoria Plzeň were also victorious in Naples last season, winning 3-0 in the round of 32 en route to a 5-0 aggregate triumph, meaning Napoli have lost their last two European home games.
- Dortmund's greatest moment came when they beat an Italian team, Juventus, 3-1 in Munich to lift the 1997 UEFA Champions League. Last season was their most successful campaign since then, remaining unbeaten until the semi-final second leg when they lost 2-0 at Real Madrid CF.
- That did not prevent Jürgen Klopp's team, 4-1 winners in the home leg, from advancing to the Wembley final where domestic rivals Bayern beat them 2-1. İlkay Gündoğan's penalty brought Dortmund level after Mario Mandžukić's opener only for Arjen Robben's late goal to prove decisive.
- An earlier visit to Santiago Bernabéu in last season's group stage had ended 2-2 while Dortmund also drew 1-1 at Manchester City FC and won 4-1 at AFC Ajax in the group stage. In the knockout rounds they drew 2-2 at FC Shakhtar Donetsk and 0-0 at Málaga CF before the return trip to the Spanish capital.
- Dortmund were 1-0 winners at home to Ajax in their opening fixture last season, ending a run of four matchday one fixtures without a victory (three draws, one defeat). Napoli, meanwhile, drew 1-1 at Manchester City FC on matchday one in 2011/12.

Team ties

- Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang started his career in AC Milan's youth system while Sokratis Papastathopoulos was with the Rossoneri in 2010/11, appearing five times in Serie A.
- Papastathopoulos also featured for Genoa CFC between 2008 and 2010 where he was a team-mate of Giandomenico Mesto.
- Henrikh Mkhitaryan scored in Armenia's 3-1 defeat by Christian Maggio's Italy in a 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifier in Yerevan on 12 October 2012.
- Nuri Şahin played alongside Higuaín, José María Callejón and Raúl Albiol at Real Madrid in 2011/12. While on loan at Liverpool last season he was a team-mate of Pepe Reina.
- Gonzalo Higuaín took part in all four Real Madrid games against Dortmund last season but did not score. Callejón was a substitute in the 2-2 draw in Madrid while Raúl Albiol was an unused replacement in all four encounters.
- Mats Hummels and Marco Reus scored in Germany's 5-3 defeat by Inler's Switzerland in Basel on 26 May 2012. Marcel Schmelzer, Sven Bender and Gündoğan also played for Germany.

- This is Napoli's second group stage campaign. They were unbeaten in four home matches, winning three, in their debut season in 2011/12 when they reached the round of 16.

- Twelve Napoli players were on senior duty during the international break: Christian Maggio, Lorenzo Insigne (Italy), Marek Hamšík (Slovakia), Pablo Armero, Camilo Zúñiga (Colombia), Mertens (Belgium), Valon Behrami, Gokhan Inler, Blerim Dzemaili (Switzerland), Goran Pandev (Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), Reina and Albiol (Spain).
- Having opened his international account last month against Argentina, Insigne made his first start for Italy in a 1-0 FIFA World Cup qualifying triumph over Bulgaria on 6 September. Maggio helped the Azzurri defeat the Czech Republic 2-1 four days later, a result which secured Cesare Prandelli's men a place in Brazil.

General information

- Napoli are unbeaten at home in the league in 2013, their last defeat at the Stadio San Paolo coming against Bologna on 12 December. Since then they have won ten home top-flight matches out of 12, including the last seven.
- Callejón has scored in each of his last five appearances, including two for Real Madrid at the end of last term. He struck 32 minutes into his Napoli debut, a 3-0 win against Bologna FC and then scored in a 4-2 defeat of AC Chievo Verona, when Higuaín registered his first Napoli goal. Goals from Callejón and Higuaín earned Saturday's 2-0 victory over Atalanta BC.
- Rafael Benítez succeeded Walter Mazzarri as Napoli coach on 27 May, signing a two-year contract with the option of a further 12 months.
- The Partenopei scored seven goals in their first two Serie A fixtures, something they had done only twice previously (1931/32 and 1965/66).

- Twelve Dortmund players were on senior duty during the international break: Sven Bender, Mats Hummels, Marco Reus, Marcel Schmelzer (Germany), Jakub Błaszczykowski, Robert Lewandowski (Poland), Papastathopoulos (Greece), Nuri Şahin (Turkey), Neven Subotić (Serbia), Mkhitaryan (Armenia), Aubameyang (Gabon) and Mitchell Langerak (Australia).
- Lewandowski equalised for Poland in their 1-1 FIFA World Cup qualifying draw with Montenegro on 6 September but missed the 5-1 defeat of San Marino, in which Błaszczykowski scored, four days later because of a knee problem.

General information

- Jürgen Klopp's side condemned Josep Guardiola to defeat in his first game as FC Bayern München coach, winning the German Super Cup 4-2 on 27 July.
- Dortmund began the season with four successive Bundesliga wins for the first time since 2001/02, when they went

on to secure the title. They have stretched the winning start to five, a club record.

- The Schwarzgelben have scored in their last 29 top-flight matches and the past 23 away from home.
- Aubameyang registered a hat-trick on his Bundesliga debut, a 4-0 win at FC Augsburg on 10 August. Mkhitarian broke his Dortmund duck with both goals in a 2-1 success against Eintracht Frankfurt on 1 September.
- Club captain Sebastian Kehl suffered an ankle ligament injury in training on Sunday and was ruled out for six weeks.
- On 13 September Jonas Hofmann signed a new deal tying him to the club until 2018.
- Łukasz Piszczek, out until at least the end of November, had hip and groin surgery during the summer. İlkay Gündoğan has been sidelined since mid-August due to compression of the spine.

- Although he played as a midfielder for Real Madrid's reserve team and two other lower ranking sides, injury prompted an early move into coaching. Having coached at youth and B-team level with Madrid, Benítez struck out on his own with Valladolid, Osasuna, Tenerife and Extremadura before getting his big break in 2001 at Valencia.
- Guided Valencia to a first league title for 31 years in 2002 and added a second championship two years later, when they also won the UEFA Cup.
- Joined Liverpool in June 2004, winning the UEFA Champions League in his first season, with the Reds beating AC Milan on penalties having come from 3-0 down in the final. Also won the 2006 FA Cup final on penalties after his side had come from 2-0 down to draw 3-3 with West Ham United FC.
- Left Anfield after six years in summer 2010, stepping into José Mourinho's shoes at Inter. Guided his new charges to victory in the Italian Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup but left following the latter competition in December 2010.
- Returned to management in November 2012 when he took over at Chelsea for the remainder of the season following Roberto Di Matteo's dismissal. In a short but successful stay he led Chelsea to victory in the UEFA Europa League final as well as third place in the Premier League. Took on a new challenge in late May 2013 when accepting Napoli's offer to take over from Walter Mazzarri, signing a two-year contract.

Borussia Dortmund: Jürgen Klopp

- Having spent his early career in the lower leagues and failed to break into Eintracht's first team, Klopp turned professional with Mainz, starting off as a striker before becoming a no-nonsense defender. Never played in the top flight but made 325 second-division appearances from 1990 to 2001, setting a club record by scoring 52 goals.
- 'Kloppo', as he is known in Germany, was appointed Mainz's caretaker coach on 28 February 2001, helping the club avoid relegation to the third tier. Duly won a permanent contract and built Mainz into one of the strongest clubs in the 2. Bundesliga; narrowly missed out on promotion in 2002 and 2003, Mainz losing out to Eintracht by a single goal in the latter campaign.
- Finally took Mainz into the top flight for the first time in 2004 and kept them in the Bundesliga until 2007, taking them into the 2005/06 UEFA Cup via the UEFA Fair Play ranking – they lost to eventual winners Sevilla FC in the first round.
- After another promotion near-miss in 2007/08 Klopp – whose enthusiasm and passion, plus work as a TV pundit, have made him popular all over Germany – left for Dortmund. Took them to sixth in his first season, led them into the UEFA Europa League the next year and then, with a squad packed with exciting young talent, oversaw league title wins in 2010/11 and 2011/12, adding the German Cup in the latter campaign.
- Earned even greater admiration in the 2012/13 season as he steered Dortmund all the way to the UEFA Champions League final at Wembley, where they lost to FC Bayern München.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

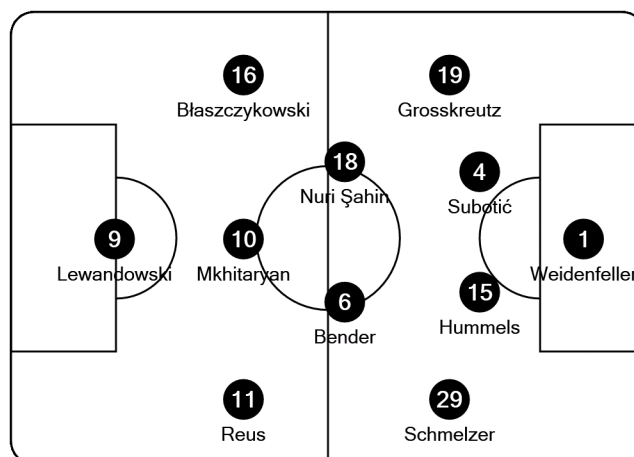

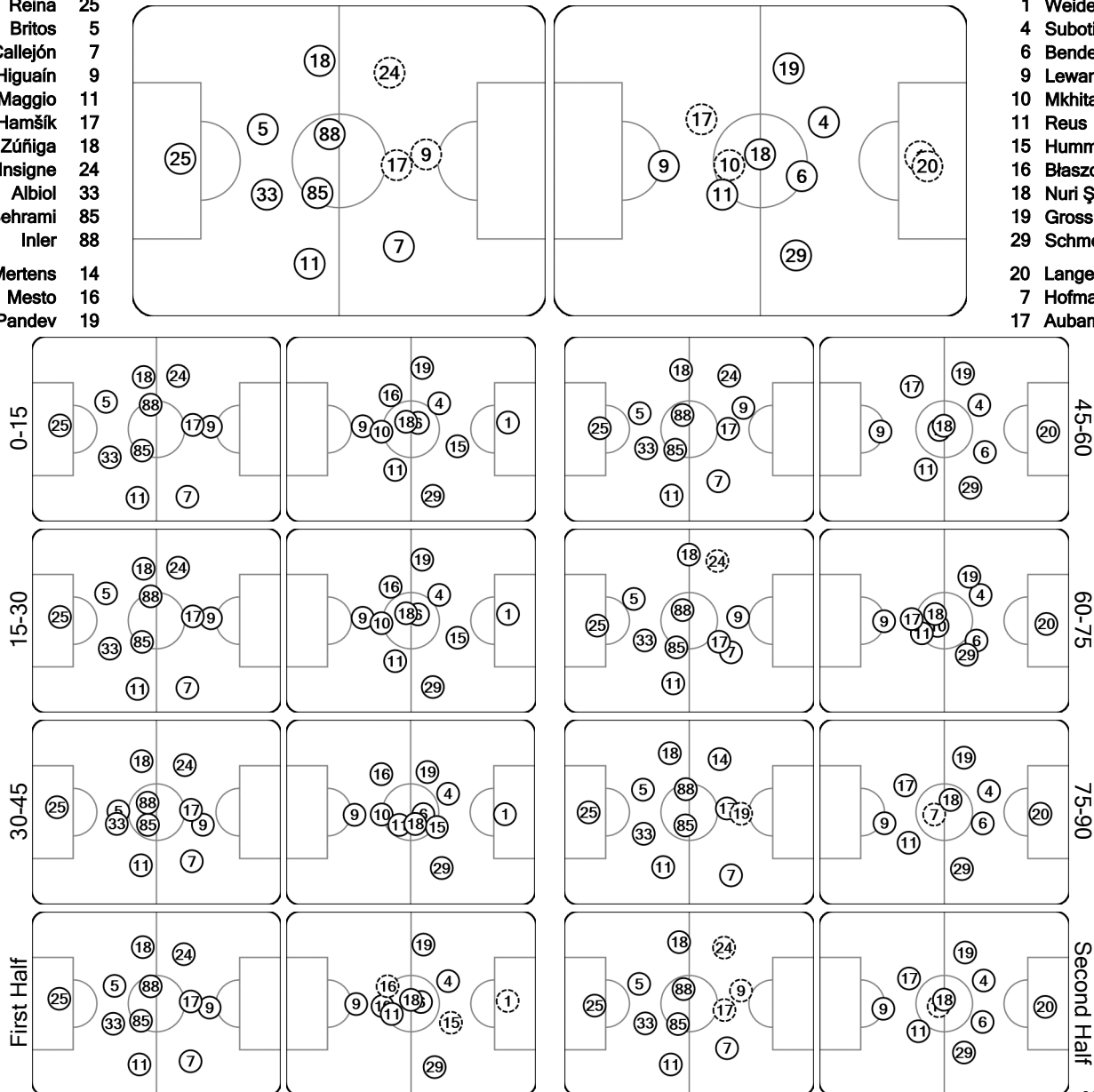
