Match background

FC Porto kick off the new UEFA Champions League season by returning to the scene of one of their greatest triumphs.

- Porto's Group G meeting with tournament newcomers FK Austria Wien takes them back to the Ernst-Happel-Stadion which, in its previous guise as the Praterstadion, was the stage for the 1987 European Champion Clubs' Cup final, where they claimed their first major international honour by beating FC Bayern München 2-1.
- For Austria, European Cup semi-finalists in 1979, this is a first taste of the UEFA Champions League group stage. Porto, by contrast, are embarking on their 18th campaign, although under a coach who is new to the tournament, Paulo Fonseca.

Previous meetings

- Porto beat Christoph Daum's Austria in the 2002/03 UEFA Cup second round en route to winning the trophy under José Mourinho. Derlei struck the only goal of the first leg in Vienna after 70 minutes and scored again in the return, making it 2-0 with four minutes remaining to add to Hélder Postiga's first-half goal.
- The lineups on 31 October 2002 at the Ernst-Happel-Stadion were:

Match background

- Nenad Bjelica's Austria reached the group stage by overcoming Iceland's FH Hafnarfjörður 1-0 on aggregate in the third qualifying round before surviving a test of nerve against GNK Dinamo Zagreb in the play-offs. After a 2-0 first-leg win in Croatia, they trailed 3-1 at home until Roman Kienast's 82nd-minute goal secured a 4-3 aggregate success.
- Austria have never got the better of Portuguese opponents. Besides their 2002 defeat by Porto they twice lost two-legged ties against SL Benfica – in the 1961/62 European Cup first round and 2006/07 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round – and also fell short against CD Nacional in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League group stage, drawing 1-1 at home and losing 5-1 in Funchal.
- Tomáš Jun and Manuel Ortlechner appeared in both games against Nacional, with Markus Suttner playing in the away loss. Austria's overall home record against Portuguese opponents is three draws (all 1-1) and one defeat.
- Porto won once on their travels in last term's UEFA Champions League – 2-0 away to the same Dinamo side that Austria beat in the play-offs last month. They also drew at FC Dynamo Kyiv (0-0) but then suffered defeats at Paris Saint-Germain FC (1-2) and Málaga CF (0-2), the latter result leading to their elimination in the last 16.
- Porto's only other trip to Vienna brought a 3-1 win at SK Rapid Wien on a snowy night in December 2010 when a Falcao hat-trick (42, 86, 88) secured a 3-1 victory for André Villas-Boas's side, which featured Helton, Jorge Fucile, Nicolás Otamendi, Fernando and Silvestre Varela.
- Porto, who went on to win the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League, had begun their campaign with a 3-0 home win against Rapid in which Rolando (26), Falcao (65) and Rúben Micael (77) got the goals.

Team ties

- Marat Izmilov was in the FC Lokomotiv Moskva team beaten 1-0 at home by Rapid Wien in the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round, with Kienast an unused substitute for the visitors.
- Kienast was in the Austria side beaten 6-3 by Portugal in the 2003 UEFA European Under-19 Championship semi-finals.
- Steven Defour played in Austria with R. Standard de Liège when they held FC Salzburg 0-0 to complete a 3-2 aggregate victory in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League round of 32.
- Defour helped Belgium win 2-0 against Austria in Vienna in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in March 2011, which Ortlechner watched from the home bench.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- This campaign will be the club's first in the group stage.
- Five separate scorers struck Austria's five goals in qualifying: Roman Kienast, Marin Leovac, Daniel Royer, Florian Mader and Marko Stanković.
- Tomáš Jun is the only Austria Wien player with UEFA Champions League experience having appeared 12 times for AC Sparta Praha in 2003/04 and 2004/05.
- Austria have scored 95 goals in the European Champion Clubs' Cup.

International duty

- Five Austria Wien players were on senior duty during the international break: Philipp Hosiner, Manuel Ortlechner, Heinz Lindner, Markus Suttner (Austria) and James Holland (Australia).
- None of the Austrian quartet made it off the bench during their country's FIFA World Cup qualifying matches against Germany and the Republic of Ireland, while Holland suffered the same fate in Australia's 6-0 loss to Brazil.

General information

- Austria Wien's last three matches have all been at home and they have not won any, drawing one and suffering 3-2 losses to GNK Dinamo Zagreb and, on Saturday, SV Grödig.
- The Violets won the 2012/13 Austrian Bundesliga with a record points total, their tally of 82 surpassing the previous high of 81 set by SK Sturm Graz in 1997/98.
- Hosiner won Austria's golden boot last season with 32 goals in 36 games and has scored three in seven league outings this season.
- Alexander Gorgon has been unavailable since suffering a major leg injury in mid-August.

Porto

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Like FC Barcelona and Real Madrid CF, Porto are embarking on their 18th UEFA Champions League campaign. Only Manchester United FC (19) have appeared more.
- Paulo Fonseca is set for his first taste of European football having signed a two-year contract with Porto in June after guiding FC Paços de Ferreira to a third-placed finish, the club's best ever position.
- The 2-0 defeat at Málaga CF which sealed their exit from last season's round of 16 was the club's 100th loss in UEFA competition.
- Lucho González has scored in each of the nine seasons he has appeared in the UEFA Champions League – six with Porto and three with Olympique de Marseille.
- Steven Defour serves a one-match ban following his red card against Málaga in last season's last-16 second leg.

International duty

- Nine Porto players were on senior duty during the international break: Josué, Licá (Portugal), Jorge Fucile (Uruguay), Jackson Martínez, Quintero (Colombia), Nabil Ghilas (Algeria), Reyes, Herrera (Mexico) and Eliaquim Mangala (France).
- Licá made his senior debut on 10 September, coming off the bench for the final minutes of Portugal's 3-1 defeat by Brazil in a friendly match played in Boston, United States.

- Defour scored Belgium's first in a 2-0 FIFA World Cup qualifying win in Scotland on 6 September which leaves the Red Devils a win away from securing a first major finals appearance since 2002.
- Ricardo scored Portugal's last goal in a 5-1 home win against Norway in their opening U21 qualifier.

General information

- Jackson Martínez, the 26-goal Portuguese Liga top scorer last term, has scored in each of Porto's five games – and wins – in all competitions this season.
- Silvestre Varela scored eight minutes into his first league appearance of the season on Saturday as Porto beat Gil Vicente FC 2-0. Quintero made his first league start, while Maicon limped off early in the first half having damaged his left ankle.
- First-half goals from Licá, Jackson Martínez and Lucho helped Porto to a 3-0 win against Vitória SC on 10 August, their 20th Portuguese Super Cup.
- Porto started the league campaign with a 3-1 win at Vitória FC, meaning they have not lost their first league match of the season since 2001/02.
- Porto are 47 matches unbeaten in the league, since a 3-1 loss at Gil Vicente FC on 29 January 2012.
- The Dragons are 74 games unbeaten at home in the Liga, dating back to 25 October 2008 and a 3-2 loss to Leixões SC.

Coaching career: FC Kärnten, FC Lustenau 1907, Wolfsberger AC, FK Austria Wien

- Aged 19, Bjelica made his professional debut for home-town club Osijek, scoring seven goals in 23 games in his first full season. In 1993 the Croatian joined Albacete where he spent three successful years before spells at Betis and Las Palmas. In summer 1999 he rejoined Osijek for a year, prior to closing out his career in Germany and Austria.
- The playmaker, voted Croatia's player of the year in 2000, was awarded his international debut against Austria in 2001 and was capped nine times by his country. He made two appearances at UEFA EURO 2004 in Portugal.
- Bjelica started life in the dugout in autumn 2007 as player-coach at Kärnten – registering 29 Austrian second division outings that season.
- Then hung up his boots but remained in charge until early 2009, subsequently taking over at Lustenau and Wolfsberger, whom he guided from the third tier to the Austrian Bundesliga.
- During his final campaign with Wolfsberger, in 2012/13, Bjelica's side missed out on UEFA Europa League qualification by a solitary point. Bjelica left his post to replace Peter Stöger at Austria Wien and soon led his new employers to the UEFA Champions League group stage.

FC Porto: Paulo Fonseca

Playing career: FC Barreirense, Leça FC, CF Os Belenenses, CS Marítimo, Vitória SC, CF Estrela da Amadora

Coaching career: CF Estrela da Amadora (youth), SU 1º Dezembro, Odivelas FC, CD Pinhalnovense, Aves, FC Paços de Ferreira, FC Porto

- A central defender during his playing days, he was signed by Porto in 1995/96 but never trained or played for the Dragons as he was immediately loaned to Leça; eventually moved to Vitória Guimarães after further spells with Belenenses and Marítimo.
- Hung up his boots aged 32 at Estrela da Amadora and started coaching the club's youth teams the following season before taking his first senior job at fourth-tier SU 1º Dezembro in 2007.
- Impressed by guiding third division Pinhalnovense to the quarter-finals of the Portuguese Cup in 2009/10 and 2010/11, when his side lost 2-0 away to Porto.
- Assumed the reins at Aves and steered the northern club to third place in the second division and another cup quarter-final, prompting Paços de Ferreira to appoint him. Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

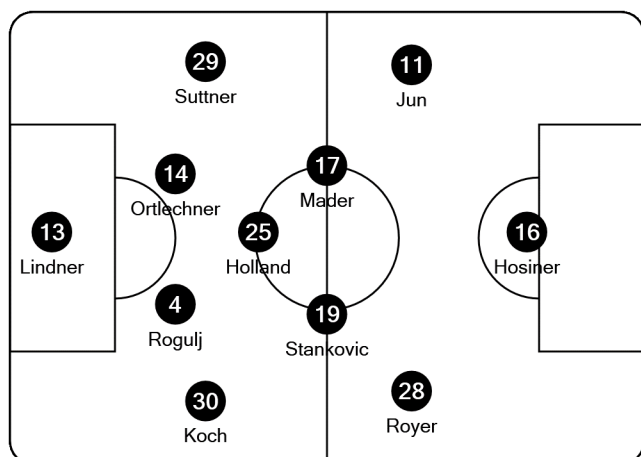

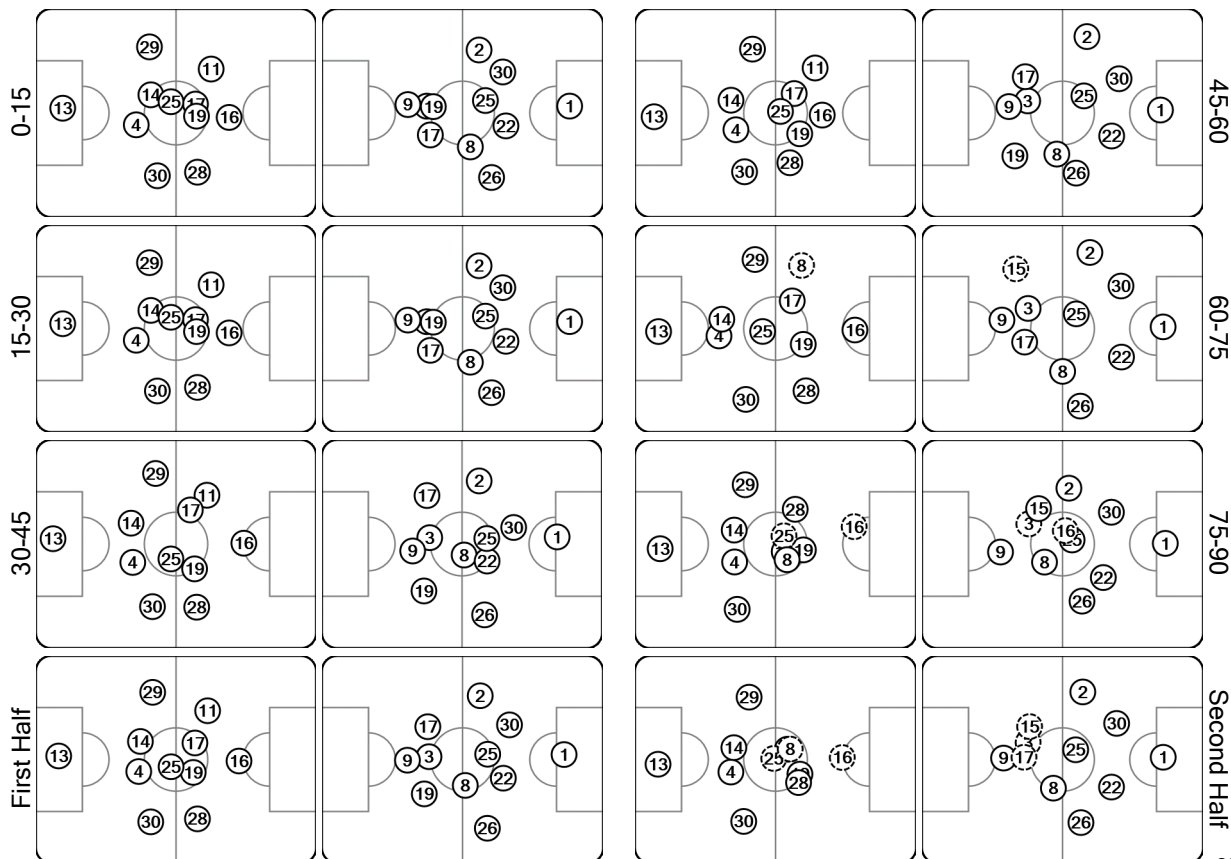
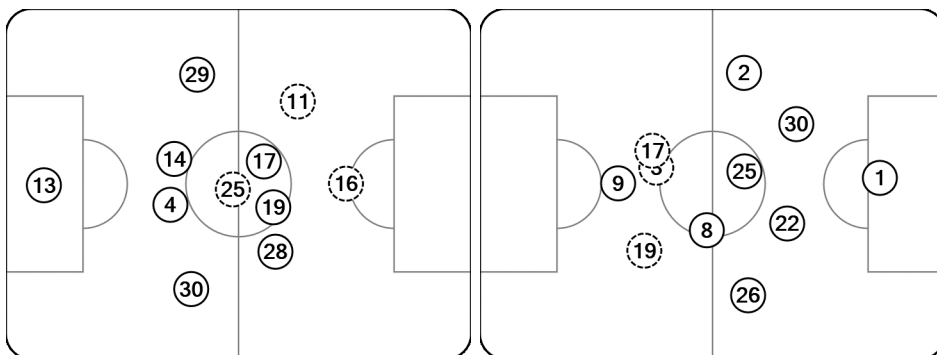
