Match background

FC Porto had a 100% record at the Estádio do Dragão in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League and Paulo Fonseca will hope for more of the same against Group G rivals Club Atlético de Madrid in his first European home game at the helm.

- Fonseca enjoyed a winning start on matchday one when Porto prevailed 1-0 at FK Austria Wien, but Atlético hit the ground running too, beating FC Zenit 3-1 in the Spanish capital.

Previous meetings

- The clubs' four past encounters all came in 2009, starting with a Porto success by the narrowest of margins in the 2008/09 UEFA Champions League round of 16. Although Abel Resino's Atlético led twice in the first leg in Madrid – Maxi Rodríguez (3) and Diego Forlán (45) scoring – Porto responded each time through Lisandro (22, 72), and a goalless draw in the return leg took Jesualdo Ferreira's team into the quarter-finals.

- Porto prevailed with greater ease when the clubs met again in the next season's group stage. Then as now they hosted the Rojiblancos on Matchday 2 and won 2-0 with Falcao (75) – a future Atlético striker – and Rolando (82) getting the goals.

- The lineups for that encounter on 30 September 2009 were:

- By the time the sides renewed acquaintance in their final group fixture, Porto were already sure of progress to the knockout stage while Atlético had replaced Resino with Quique Sánchez Flores. Porto came away with a 3-0 victory – Bruno Alves (2), Falcao (14) and Hulk (76) the scorers – though Atlético would find a silver lining by winning the UEFA Europa League.

Match background

- Facing Málaga CF in last season's round of 16, a Porto side then led by Vítor Pereira won the first leg 1-0 through a João Moutinho goal but fell to a 2-0 defeat in Spain with Steven Defour sent off for two bookable offences.

- Porto fared better against Villarreal CF in their triumphant 2010/11 UEFA Europa League campaign, winning 5-1 at home in the semi-finals en route to a 7-4 aggregate triumph. Porto's overall home record against visitors from across the border is W8 D3 L7.

- Porto won all four home fixtures in last season's UEFA Champions League, scoring eight goals and conceding just two.

- Atlético's 2-0 defeat at A. Académica de Coimbra in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage ended the Spanish side's 16-match winning sequence in UEFA competition. They had previously beaten Académica 2-1 at home, Diego Costa and Emre Belözoğlu scoring.

- Atlético's overall record in Portugal is W1 D2 L4. Their solitary success came in a 2011/12 UEFA Europa League play-off when they won 4-0 at Vitória SC with Gabi (penalty), Adrián López (2) and Salvio scoring to complete a 6-0 aggregate victory.

- Porto have faced two Spanish sides in the UEFA Super Cup in the past decade, losing 2-1 against Valencia CF in 2004 and 2-0 against FC Barcelona in 2011.

Team ties

- As an SS Lazio player, Diego Simeone was on the receiving end of a 4-1 defeat at Porto in the semi-finals of the 2002/03 UEFA Cup. Simeone was an unused substitute in the scoreless second leg as José Mourinho's Porto advanced to a final in which they beat Celtic FC.

- For Cristián Rodríguez, this fixture takes him back to the club he served for four seasons between 2008 and 2012, making 70 league appearances and scoring 12 goals.

- Tiago faced Porto nine times during spells at SC Braga and SL Benfica, scoring once and winning just once. As a Chelsea FC player, he faced Porto again in the 2004/05 UEFA Champions League group stage, helping the English club win 3-1 at home before a 2-1 defeat in Portugal.

- Emiliano Insúa made 37 league appearances for Sporting Clube de Portugal between 2011 and 2013. During that period he played three times against Porto as Sporting posted two defeats and one draw.

- Diego Costa started his career in European football in Portugal where he made six league appearances for Braga in 2006/07 after 13 on loan at FC Penafiel, where he scored five goals.

- David Villa played in Barcelona's 2011 UEFA Super Cup defeat of Porto. He had struck the only goal when Spain beat Portugal 1-0 in the round of 16 of the 2010 FIFA World Cup.
- Defour was in the Belgium side beaten 2-1 at home by Spain thanks to Villa's 88th-minute winner in a 2010 World Cup qualifier in October 2008; later in the same campaign, Villa scored twice more as Spain beat Defour's Belgium 5-0 in Madrid, with Toby Alderweireld watching from the bench.
- Eliaquim Mangala and Joshua Guilavogui are former France Under-21 team-mates.

- Porto's three shots on goal on matchday one was fewer than any other side.
- Like FC Barcelona and Real Madrid CF, Porto are embarking on their 18th UEFA Champions League campaign. Only Manchester United FC (19) have appeared more.
- Lucho González has scored in each of the nine seasons he has appeared in the UEFA Champions League – six with Porto and three with Olympique de Marseille.
- Steven Defour is available after serving a one-match ban on matchday one following his red card against Málaga CF in last season's round of 16 second leg.

General information

- The Portuguese champions' six-match winning start to the campaign ended on 22 September when they drew 2-2 at Estoril Praia, a game in which Ghilas made his Porto debut as a late substitute.
- Maicon has not featured since limping off with an ankle injury against Gil Vicente FC on 14 September, his 25th birthday.
- Jackson Martínez, the 26-goal Portuguese Liga top scorer last term, has struck in six of Porto's eight fixtures in all competitions this season.
- The Dragons are 49 matches unbeaten in the league, since a 3-1 loss at Gil Vicente FC on 29 January 2012.
- Porto are 75 games unbeaten at home in the Liga, since 25 October 2008 and a 3-2 loss to Leixões SC.
- Porto opened a new club museum on 28 September, the day of their 120th anniversary.

- Diego Costa, who has registered ten goals in his past eight Liga outings, completes a two-game ban following his red card against FC Viktoria Plzeň on matchday six of last season's UEFA Europa League.

General information

- Atlético beat Real Madrid CF 1-0 on Saturday to make it seven wins from seven in the Liga this term, breaking the club record set in 1964/65 and 1991/92. It is also their best start to a league season; Madrid hold the record for consecutive victories at the beginning of a season with nine, in 1968/69.
- Atlético are 13 matches unbeaten in all competitions, nine of them this term. The Rojiblancos are 16 games unbeaten away from home.
- On 19 September, Arda Turan agreed a contract extension that ties him to Los Rojiblancos until June 2017.
- Adrián López fractured a cheekbone in the matchday one triumph against FC Zenit and has not played since.
- Atlético conceded the fewest goals in the Liga last term with Courtois – now in his third season on loan from Chelsea – winning the Zamora Trophy, awarded to the goalkeeper with the lowest goals-to-game ratio. He played his 100th game for Atlético in the Spanish Super Cup first leg against Barcelona on 21 August – the Madrid side lost on away goals.

- Impressed by guiding third division Pinhalnovense to the quarter-finals of the Portuguese Cup in 2009/10 and 2010/11, when his side lost 2-0 away to Porto.
- Assumed the reins at Aves and steered the northern club to third place in the second division and another cup quarter-final, prompting Paços de Ferreira to appoint him. Rewarded that faith by earning a third-place finish in 2012/13, Paços's best-ever placing in the Portuguese top flight, and a UEFA Champions League play-off berth.
- On 10 June 2013 he signed a two-year deal to coach champions Porto.

- Joined Atlético in 1994 and won the Spanish domestic double in his second season, his first major club honours to add to two Copa América titles (1991 and 1993) plus the 1992 FIFA Confederations Cup with Argentina.
- Enjoyed further success after returning to Italy, winning the UEFA Cup with Inter, plus a Serie A and Coppa Italia double in his debut campaign with Lazio (1999/2000). After four years in Rome, he returned to Madrid for a second spell with Atlético before ending his playing career in Argentina with Racing Club.
- Started coaching career with Racing Club and won Argentinian titles with Estudiantes (2006 Apertura) and River Plate (2008 Clausura); brief spells at San Lorenzo, Italian club Catania and Racing (again) preceded his appointment in December 2011 at Atlético.
- Made immediate impact, leading them to victory in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final against Athletic Club and to a Copa del Rey final triumph over Real Madrid CF in 2013.

(This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

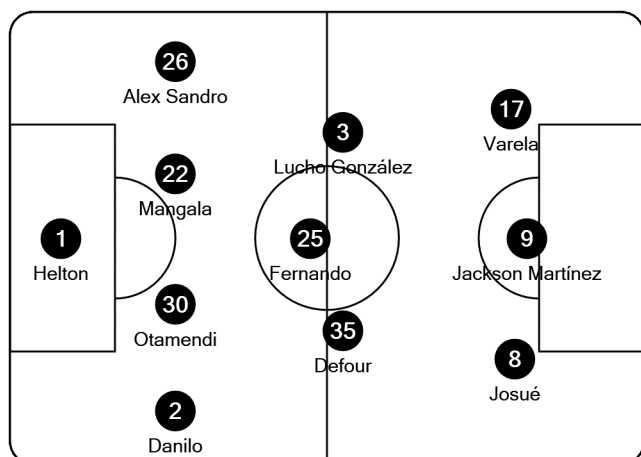

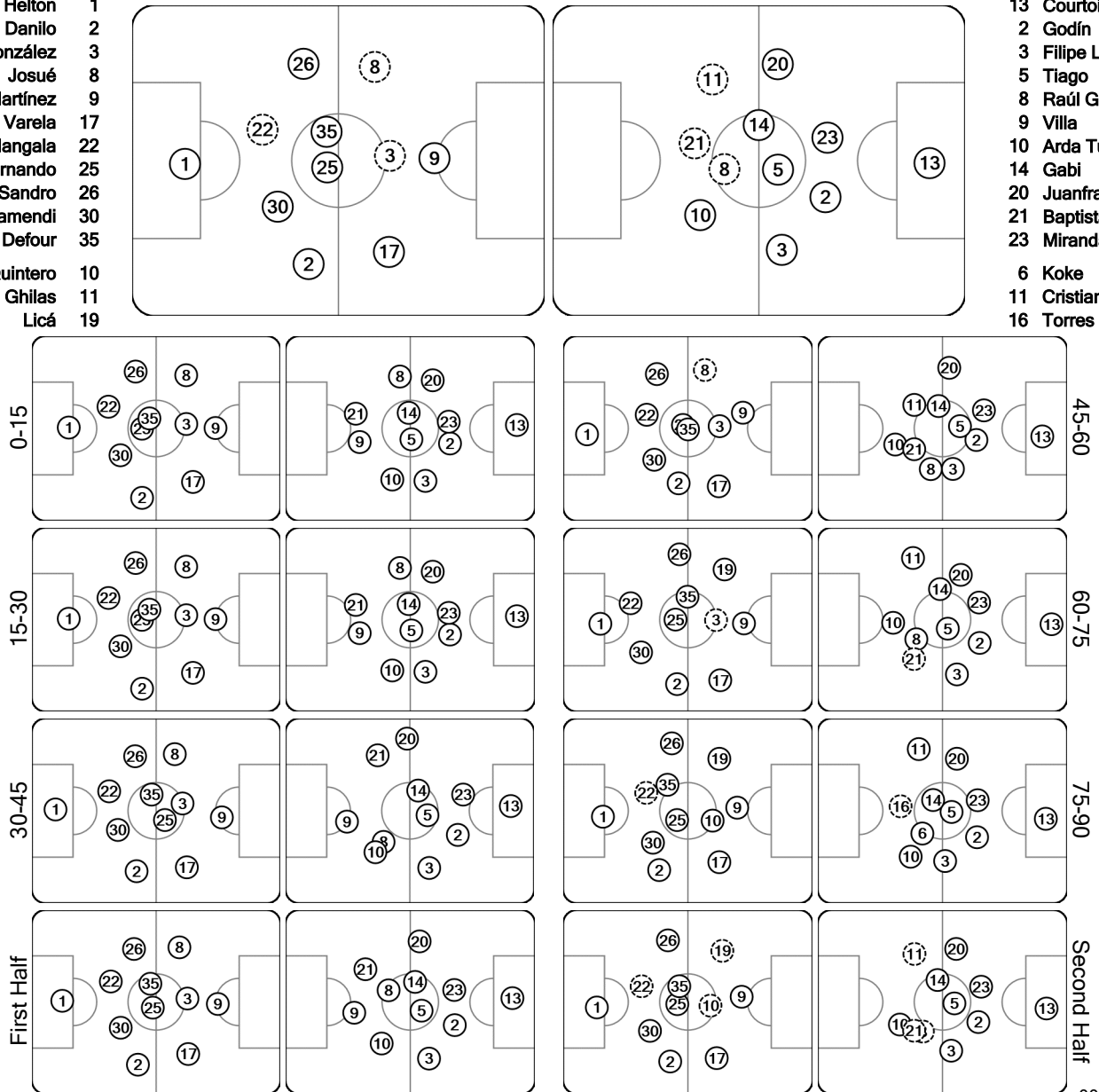
