## **Match background**

Newcomers FK Austria Wien are still seeking their first goal and victory in the UEFA Champions League group stage as they prepare to host the early Group G leaders Club Atlético de Madrid.

• Nenad Bjelica's hosts can take heart from having collected their first point away to FC Zenit last time out but now find themselves up against an Atlético side chasing a third straight victory.

#### **Previous meetings**

• Atlético prevailed on the one previous occasion the clubs met, in the 1970/71 European Champion Clubs' Cup first round. Luis Aragonés and José Gárate scored the goals in a 2-0 first-leg home win and although Eduard Krieger's penalty gave Austria an early lead in the Vienna return, Aragonés and Gárate both struck again to complete a 4-1 aggregate triumph.

#### Match background

- Austria will want to improve on their recent home results in Europe, having lost to GNK Dinamo Zagreb in the playoffs as well as FC Porto on matchday one. They have yet to score in the group stage yet can draw encouragement from some solid defensive displays – including the qualifying rounds, Bjelica's men have kept four clean sheets in six European outings this term.
- After victories over Zenit at home and Porto away, Atlético are looking to complete a sequence of three successive wins in the European Cup for the first time since their very first campaign in the competition in 1958/59 (Dublin City FC 8-0 h, 5-1 a; PFC CSKA Sofia 2-1 h).
- Austria have won only once at home against Spanish opposition in nine previous attempts, a 1-0 success against Real Zaragoza in the 2004/05 UEFA Cup group stage, Radosław Gilewicz the scorer.
- The Austrian title holders' most recent encounter with Liga opposition brought 3-0 home and away losses to Athletic Club in the 2009/10 UEFA Europa League group stage. Markus Suttner is the only survivor of that home defeat by Athletic.
- Atlético have won on both their two previous visits to Vienna. Besides their aforementioned victory at Austria in 1970, they also won 2-1 at SK Rapid Wien in the 1976/77 European Cup Winners' Cup first round en route to a 3-2 aggregate success.

#### **Team ties**

- During a six-year spell in Spanish football, Bjelica played for Albacete Balompié, Real Betis Balompié and UD Las Palmas. During that time he lined up against Atlético coach Diego Simeone four times, winning once a 3-2 victory with Betis in March 1997 losing once, and drawing twice.
- Simeone scored in both of their head-to-head meetings in the 1995/96 Liga season, getting the first goal in Spanish double winners Atlético's 2-0 home success against Albacete and an 88th-minute equaliser in a 1-1 away draw.
- Bjelica's overall record against Atlético as a player reads W1 D2 L3. He once had a trial with the Madrid club but was never offered a contract.
- David Villa was in the Spain squad that won the UEFA EURO 2008 final at the Ernst-Happel-Stadion, although he was injured for that game. The tournament's top scorer, Villa did play in the quarter-final against Italy there, converting a spot kick in Spain's 4-2 shoot-out victory, and started the semi-final against Russia until he was forced off by injury. Villa returned to the stadium in November 2009, scoring twice in Spain's 5-1 friendly win over Austria.
- Suttner and Robin Okotie played in Austria's 2-0 friendly victory over Arda Turan's Turkey at the Ernst-Happel-Stadion in August 2012. The Atlético player missed an added-time penalty at the same venue against an Austria side including Daniel Royer in a goalless UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in September 2011. Arda did, however, convert a spot kick there in Turkey's 3-1 shoot-out triumph against Croatia in the UEFA EURO 2008 quarter-finals.
- Okotie is the only survivor of the Austria Wien side that faced Arda's Galatasaray AŞ in Istanbul in a goalless group stage fixture of the 2007/08 UEFA Cup.
- Philipp Hosiner and Christian Ramsebner first came up against Toby Alderweireld in a 2-2 draw between Austria and Belgium in a UEFA European Under-17 Championship qualifier on 23 October 2005.

#### **UEFA** milestones and competition statistics

- This campaign is the club's first in the group stage and they still await their first goal; Marko Stanković came closest when he hit the post against FC Porto. Five separate scorers struck Austria's five goals in qualifying: Daniel Royer, Marin Leovac, Stanković, Florian Mader and Roman Kienast.
- The 0-0 draw at FC Zenit on matchday two was the first point claimed by an Austrian side in the competition since 2001, when SK Sturm Graz beat Panathinaikos FC 2-1.
- Tomáš Jun is the only Austria player with UEFA Champions League experience before this season having appeared 12 times for AC Sparta Praha in 2003/04 and 2004/05.
- · Austria became the 128th club from 31 countries to participate in the group stage on matchday one.

#### **General information**

- Austria are five games without a win, and have lost six of their last ten matches in all competitions.
- Austria have lost four of their last five home games, drawing the other.
- Alexander Grünwald (knee ligaments, 15 September) and Stanković (calf injury, 21 September) have been sidelined; Thomas Murg missed Saturday's 1-1 draw at SV Ried through illness.
- Alexander Gorgon had resumed individual training following shin and calf problem but on Sunday Austria announced the midfielder now requires knee surgery and is expected to be out for the rest of the year.
- The Violets won the 2012/13 Austrian Bundesliga with a record points total, their tally of 82 surpassing the previous high of 81 set by Sturm Graz in 1997/98.

• Five Austria players were on senior duty during the international break: Heinz Lindner, Philipp Hosiner, Markus Suttner, Manuel Ortlechner (Austria), James Holland (Australia).

#### **Atlético**

#### **UEFA** milestones and competition statistics

- · Matchday three is Atlético's 250th game in UEFA competition.
- Diego Costa, who has registered ten goals in his past nine Liga outings, is available after serving a two-game ban following his red card against FC Viktoria Plzeň on matchday six of last season's UEFA Europa League.

#### **General information**

- Atlético's eight-match winning start to the Liga, their best ever start to a domestic campaign, ended on Saturday with a 1-0 loss at RSD Espanyol. They fell one short of Real Madrid CF's league record of nine consecutive wins at the beginning of 1968/69.
- Atlético had been 15 matches unbeaten, a run stretching back to last season's Copa del Rey final victory over Madrid, which Los Rojiblancos won in extra time. It also ended Diego Simeone's side's 17-game unbeaten away run.
- Adrián López (fractured cheekbone, out since 18 September), Raúl García (ankle, 1 October), Gabi (knee ligaments, 6 October) and David Villa (ankle, 6 October) all returned on Saturday.
- Atlético conceded the fewest goals in the Liga (31) last term with Thibaut Courtois now in his third season on loan from Chelsea FC winning the Zamora Trophy, awarded to the goalkeeper with the lowest goals-to-game ratio.

#### International duty

- Nine Atlético players were called up to senior duty during the international break: Koke, Mario Suárez, Juanfran (Spain), Diego Godín, Cristian Rodríguez, José María Giménez (Uruguay), Arda Turan (Turkey), Courtois, Toby Alderweireld (Belgium).
- Koke and Juanfran featured in Spain's 2-0 win at home to Georgia on 11 October, a result that secured the holders' passage through to the FIFA World Cup finals.
- Despite captaining Turkey to a 2-0 win against Estonia, Arda Turan could not prevent his team losing to the Netherlands in their final qualifier, a loss that ended Turkish hopes of reaching the World Cup.
- Courtois and Alderweireld helped Belgium through with a 2-1 win in Croatia on 11 October.
- Rodríguez scored Uruguay's opener in the 3-2 qualifying win at home to Argentina, Godín and Giménez also featuring in a victory that sealed a World Cup play-off place.

- Aged 19, Bjelica made his professional debut for home-town club Osijek, scoring seven goals in 23 games in his first full season. In 1992 the Croatian joined Albacete where he spent four successful years before spells at Betis and Las Palmas. In summer 1999 he rejoined Osijek for a year, prior to closing out his career in Germany and Austria.
- The playmaker, voted Croatia's player of the year in 2000, was awarded his international debut against Austria in 2001 and was capped nine times by his country. He made two appearances at UEFA EURO 2004 in Portugal.
- Bjelica started life in the dugout in autumn 2007 as player-coach at Kärnten registering 29 Austrian second division outings that season.
- Then hung up his boots but remained in charge until early 2009, subsequently taking over at Lustenau and Wolfsberger, whom he guided from the third tier to the Austrian Bundesliga.
- During his final campaign with Wolfsberger, in 2012/13, Bjelica's side missed out on UEFA Europa League qualification by a solitary point. Bjelica left his post to replace Peter Stöger at Austria Wien and soon led his new employers to the UEFA Champions League group stage.

### Club Atlético de Madrid: Diego Simeone

- Launched career as a combative midfielder with Vélez Sarsfield and was a full Argentinian international at 18, making debut in a July 1988 friendly against Australia; went on to play in three FIFA World Cups and retired as Argentina's most-capped player (106 appearances, 11 goals). Moved to Italy in 1990 to join Pisa; two years later he left for Sevilla, where he played under Argentina's 1986 World Cup-winning coach Carlos Bilardo and for one season alongside Diego Maradona.
- Joined Atlético in 1994 and won the Spanish domestic double in his second season, his first major club honours to add to two Copa América titles (1991 and 1993) plus the 1992 FIFA Confederations Cup with Argentina.
- Enjoyed further success after returning to Italy, winning the UEFA Cup with Inter, plus a Serie A and Coppa Italia double in his debut campaign with Lazio (1999/2000). After four years in Rome, he returned to Madrid for a second spell with Atlético before ending his playing career in Argentina with Racing Club.
- Started coaching career with Racing Club and won Argentinian titles with Estudiantes (2006 Apertura) and River Plate (2008 Clausura); brief spells at San Lorenzo, Italian club Catania and Racing (again) preceded his appointment in December 2011 at Atlético.
- Made immediate impact, leading them to victory in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final against Athletic Club and to a Copa del Rey final triumph over Real Madrid CF in 2013. Even better followed a year later as Atlético held off FC Barcelona and Madrid to win their first league title since 1996.




