### Match background

Celtic FC will hope lightning can strike twice when they welcome Group H rivals FC Barcelona back to Glasgow 11 months after a memorable victory against the Spanish champions in last season's group stage.

- Celtic's 2-1 win on 7 November last year came the day after their 125th anniversary and proved key to their ultimate qualification for the last 16 but Gerardo Martino's Barcelona will be determined to ensure a different outcome when these two famous clubs meet again.
- Martino enjoyed a winning start in the UEFA Champions League when Barcelona beat AFC Ajax 4-0 on matchday one, but Celtic are still seeking their first points after succumbing to late goals in a 2-0 loss at AC Milan.

#### Past meetings

- Victor Wanyama (21) and UEFA Champions League debutant Tony Watt (83) earned Neil Lennon's men their victory last term, despite Lionel Messi (90) replying for Barcelona. It was a result that avenged Barcelona's last-gasp success at the Camp Nou a fortnight earlier when Jordi Alba hit the winner four minutes into added time, after Andrés Iniesta (45) had equalised a Giorgios Samaras (18) strike.
- The lineups for last year's Celtic Park encounter were:

**Celtic:** Forster, Lustig (Watt 72), Wilson, Ambrose, Matthews, Commons, Ledley, Wanyama, Mulgrew, Samaras (Kayal 79), Miku.

**Barcelona:** Valdés, Alves, Mascherano, Bartra (Piqué 72), Alba, Song (Fàbregas 71), Xavi, Iniesta, Pedro, Messi, Sánchez (Villa 65).

- That win was Celtic's first against Barcelona since the clubs' first meeting in the 2003/04 UEFA Cup fourth round. Lennon was then a player in Martin O'Neill's team, who overcame a Barcelona side including Víctor Valdés, Carles Puyol and Xavi Hernández 1-0 on aggregate thanks to Alan Thompson's first-leg goal in Glasgow.
- Barcelona won on both their subsequent visits to Celtic Park, starting with a 3-1 success on the opening night of the 2004/05 UEFA Champions League group stage when Henrik Larsson struck the visitors' third goal against his old club. Lennon played that night along with Valdés, Puyol and Xavi as Celtic suffered their only home loss in a group stage fixture. It finished 1-1 in the Camp Nou two months later.
- Barcelona also got the better of Celtic in a 2007/08 round of 16 tie. Despite trailing twice, they won the first leg 3-2 at Celtic with a team featuring Valdés, Puyol, Iniesta, Xavi and the two-goal Messi. Xavi hit the only goal of the return.

#### Match background

- Celtic have won seven of their last nine European fixtures in Glasgow, the one defeat in that sequence coming against Juventus (0-3) in last season's round of 16.
- Celtic did not concede a home goal in this season's three qualifiers, beating Cliftonville FC 2-0 and IF Elfsborg 1-0 before overcoming FC Shakhter Karagandy 3-0 to overturn a two-goal first-leg deficit.
- The last Spanish team to taste victory at Celtic were Club Atlético de Madrid, 1-0 winners in the 2011/12 UEFA Europa League group stage. Celtic's overall record against Spanish visitors is W7 D2 L4.
- Barcelona's record in Scotland is W2 D1 L3. They achieved an identical record on their travels in last season's UEFA Champions League, but did not win any of their three away games in the knockout rounds.

#### **Team ties**

- Lennon's first taste of European club football as a player came in a 4-1 aggregate defeat for Leicester City FC against Atlético in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup first round. He also played for Northern Ireland in a 4-1 friendly loss to Spain in Santander in June 1998.
- Tomas Rogic appeared as a 69th-minute substitute in the Australia side beaten 6-0 by Brazil in Brasilia on 7 September, Neymar scoring the third goal.
- Teemu Pukki played in the Finland side beaten 2-0 at home by Spain in a 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifier on 6 September, Alba scoring the first goal. Iniesta, Xavi, Cesc Fàbregas and Pedro Rodríguez also featured for the world champions. Pukki had previously scored a 79th-minute equaliser past Valdés when Finland held Spain 1-1 in Gijon in March.
- Pukki hit three goals in 32 league games for Sevilla FC's B team between 2007 and 2010. He also made one Liga appearance for the senior side.
- Efe Ambrose was in the Nigeria team defeated 3-0 by Spain in the group stage of the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup on 23 June. Alba scored twice for a Spain side also including Gerard Piqué, Sergio Busquets, Valdés, Iniesta, Xavi, Fàbregas and Pedro.

- Derk Boerrigter scored in AFC Ajax's 4-1 group stage defeat at Real Madrid CF last December.
- Baldé struck four goals in 13 third-division outings during a loan spell at CD Badajoz in 2010/11.
- Emilio Izaguirre's Honduras lost 2-0 to Spain in the 2010 World Cup group stage.
- With Arsenal FC, Fàbregas and Alex Song won 2-0 away to a Celtic team including Scott Brown and Samaras en route to a 5-1 aggregate victory in the 2009/10 play-offs.
- Javier Mascherano faced Brown and Kris Commons in Argentina's 1-0 defeat of Scotland in a 2008 Hampden friendly.
- Iniesta was on target for Spain, while Piqué scored an own goal, when La Roja beat Scotland 3-2 at Hampden Park in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in October 2010.

#### **General information**

- Giorgos Samaras struck his first hat-trick in three years and Baldé notched his first for the club as Celtic won 5-2 at Kilmarnock FC on Saturday. Adam Matthews was withdrawn five minutes before half-time due to illness.
- Celtic suffered their first domestic defeat of the season on 24 September when they were knocked out of the Scottish League Cup by second-tier Greenock Morton FC after a penalty in the first period of extra time. The League Cup is the only domestic trophy to elude Neil Lennon since taking over as manager in 2010.
- Pukki scored 12 minutes after coming on for his club debut in the 14 September 3-1 win at Heart of Midlothian FC and struck on his first start at Celtic Park a week later in a 2-1 victory over Saint Johnstone FC.
- Biton made his first domestic appearance against St Johnstone having made his Celtic debut as a second-half substitute in Celtic's 2-0 defeat to AC Milan on matchday one.
- Mouyokolo is set to miss the entire group stage after rupturing his Achilles in training before matchday one.
- Lennon last season joined Jock Stein and Billy McNeill as only the third man in Celtic's history to win the league and cup double both as a player and manager.
- Celtic's oldest former player Bill Boland passed away on 23 September aged 93.

#### **UEFA** milestones and competition statistics

- Lionel Messi's matchday one treble against AFC Ajax made him the first player to score four hat-tricks in the UEFA Champions League. Mario Gomez and Filippo Inzaghi had previously matched the Argentinian with three.
- Last season the Blaugrana made a sixth consecutive appearance in the UEFA Champions League semi-finals, a tournament record. The 7-0 aggregate defeat by FC Bayern München represented Barça's heaviest aggregate loss in UEFA club competition.
- Messi has scored 62 UEFA Champions League goals and is behind only Raúl González (71).

#### **General information**

- Pedro Rodríguez hit his first hat-trick for Barça in the 4-0 win at Rayo Vallecano de Madrid on 21 September.
- Saturday's 2-0 victory at UD Almería was Barça's seventh straight Liga win, a first for the club at the beginning of a campaign. Gerardo Martino therefore eclipses James Bellamy (1929/30), Johan Cruyff (1990/91), Louis van Gaal (1997/98), Josep Guardiola (2009/10) and Tito Vilanova (2012/13), who all oversaw six in a row. Real Madrid CF hold the record for consecutive victories at the beginning of a season with nine, in 1968/69.
- Messi's hat-trick against Ajax was his 24th for Barcelona. He struck again at the weekend but was quickly withdrawn with a hamstring injury that has ruled him out of the trip to Glasgow.
- Despite a hamstring injury towards the end, Messi contributed 46 of Barça's club record 115 Liga goals last term and became the first player to score against every opponent in the division consecutively.
- Carles Puyol and Isaac Cuenca had knee surgery this summer; Jordi Alba tore his right hamstring on 14 September.

Date of birth: 25 June 1971 Nationality: Northern Irish

Playing career: Manchester City FC, Crewe Alexandra FC, Leicester City FC, Celtic FC, Nottingham Forest FC,

Wycombe Wanderers FC Coaching career: Celtic FC

- A hard-working midfielder, Lennon made his name at Crewe, featuring in almost 150 games before joining Leicester in 1996. Won two English League Cups in four and a half years under Martin O'Neill, whom he joined at Celtic in December 2000.
- Six and a half years as a player at Celtic Park yielded a domestic treble in 2000/01 and league and cup doubles in 2003/04 and 2006/07, plus two more league titles and further triumphs in both the Scottish Cup and League Cup.
- Capped 40 times by Northern Ireland, Lennon hung up his boots after short spells at Forest and Wycombe, whom he left to take up the position of first-team coach at Celtic under Gordon Strachan in April 2008.
- Appointed caretaker manager following Tony Mowbray's dismissal in March 2010, Lennon won every remaining league game that season, though Celtic were beaten by second-tier Ross County FC in the Scottish Cup semi-finals.
- Given the job full time that June, Lennon missed out on the league title by a single point in his first full season but claimed the Scottish Cup. Led Celtic to a first championship in four years in 2011/12, when he was named manager of the year, and better was to follow in 2012/13 as Celtic reached the UEFA Champions League last 16 for the first time since 2007/08, crowning the season with a domestic double.

- An attacking central midfielder, Martino commonly known as 'Tata' took his first steps in the game at Newell's Old Boys, the club that would have a heavy influence on his playing and coaching career.
- Made first-team for Rosario-based side as a 17-year-old and went on to score 38 goals in a club record 505 appearances over three spells, captaining the team as they won four domestic titles in five years between 1988 and 1992.
- A former Argentina international, Martino's only experience in Europe as a player came with Tenerife where he scored once in 15 Liga games. Later influenced by Marcelo Bielsa, the 50-year-old began his coaching career in Argentina's lower divisions.
- Impressed in Paraguay with Libertad and Cerro Porteño, gaining championship-winning experiences that would lead to chance to take charge of Paraguay; took the national team to the 2010 FIFA World Cup quarter-finals and the Copa América final the following year.
- Agreed a return to Newell's in 2012 and immediately improved the side's fortunes, leading them to victory in the 2013 Torneo Final; subsequently agreed to take over at Barça on a two-year deal following Tito Vilanova's enforced departure.

### **Competition facts**

#### **UEFA Champions League: Did you know?**

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
