Match background

AC Milan will not be lacking motivation when they host FC Barcelona on matchday three – this fixture offers not just an opportunity to leapfrog the Spanish champions at the top of Group H but also a chance of revenge.

- The Rossoneri have a recent history of UEFA Champions League disappointments against Barcelona to make amends for, with the Blaugrana's victory in last season's round of 16 completing an unwanted hat-trick alongside their 2011/12 quarter-final and 2005/06 semi-final defeats.

Previous meetings

- These two famous names have squared off 17 times, Barcelona recording seven wins to Milan's five and scoring 26 goals to the Italian side's 21. Milan's record in eight home outings against Barcelona reads W3 D2 L3.

- Massimiliano Allegri's Milan won 2-0 at San Siro in the first leg of last season's last-16 encounter, Kevin-Prince Boateng (57) and Sulley Muntari (81) the scorers. Barcelona hit back, however, with four unanswered goals at the Camp Nou, Lionel Messi (5, 40), David Villa (55) and Jordi Alba (90) securing a 4-2 aggregate success.

- Jordi Roura was in charge of Barcelona for that last San Siro meeting on 20 February and the lineups were:

Milan: Abbiati, Abate, Mexès, Zapata, Constant, Ambrosini, Montolivo, Muntari, Boateng, Pazzini (Niang 75), El Shaarawy (Traoré 88).

Barcelona: Valdés, Daniel Alves, Piqué, Puyol (Mascherano 88), Jordi Alba, Xavi, Busquets, Fàbregas (Sánchez 62), Pedro, Messi, Iniesta.

- Barcelona earned a goalless draw at Milan in the first leg of their 2011/12 quarter-final before prevailing 3-1 in the return. Messi hit two first-half penalties, either side of an Antonio Nocerino equaliser (32), with Andrés Iniesta (53) cementing victory for Josep Guardiola's side.

- The clubs also met in that season's group stage, with Barcelona taking four points to consign Milan to second place. At the Camp Nou it finished 2-2, Thiago Silva (92) scoring Milan's equaliser after Pedro Rodríguez and Villa had overturned Pato's first-minute goal.

- Barcelona subsequently won 3-2 in Milan, Xavi Hernández hitting a 63rd-minute winner after Zlatan Ibrahimović and Boateng had cancelled out Mark van Bommel's own goal and Messi's penalty respectively.

- Frank Rijkaard's Barcelona were 1-0 aggregate winners against Carlo Ancelotti's Milan in the 2005/06 semi-finals, Ludovic Giuly's strike at San Siro proving decisive in a first leg featuring Víctor Valdés, Carles Puyol and Iniesta for Barcelona.

- Valdés, Puyol, Xavi and Iniesta are survivors of the clubs' encounter in the 2004/05 group stage when Barcelona lost 1-0 at San Siro on 20 October 2004 and ended up second behind Milan in a group also containing Celtic FC.

- The clubs' most high-profile encounter was the 1994 UEFA Champions League final, Fabio Capello's Milan winning 4-0 with goals from Daniele Massaro (22, 45), Dejan Savićević (47) and Marcel Desailly (58). Milan also prevailed when the pair met in the 1989 UEFA Super Cup, winning 1-0 at home after a 1-1 away draw.

- Barcelona won the sides' first two-legged contest 7-1 on aggregate in the first round of the 1959/60 European Champion Clubs' Cup.

Match background

- Gerardo Martino's Barcelona have maximum points at the Group H summit and know a third straight victory would open up a five-point advantage at the top.

- Barcelona won at Celtic on matchday two with a 76th-minute Cesc Fàbregas goal but Milan have left it even later in their games – they saw off Celtic with two goals in the last eight minutes and then needed Mario Balotelli's added-time penalty equaliser at AFC Ajax.

- Milan's 2-0 success over Barcelona at San Siro in February was their first home win in seven attempts against Liga opposition. Their overall record against visitors from Spain is W11 D6 L6.

- Barcelona's away record against Serie A teams is W6 D7 L6.

- Barcelona won their first European Cup by beating UC Sampdoria 1-0 in the final at Wembley in 1992.

- Milan lost their first European Cup final 3-2 to Real Madrid CF in 1957/58.

Team ties

- Neymar scored for Brazil in a 4-2 win over an Italy side including Ignazio Abate, Mattia De Sciglio, Riccardo Montolivo, Stephan El Shaarawy and Balotelli in the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup group stage.

- Only Montolivo played when Italy then faced Spain in a goalless semi-final. Montolivo scored his spot kick in the ensuing shoot-out but Xavi, Iniesta, Gerard Piqué and Sergio Busquets all converted theirs too as Spain won 7-6.

Jordi Alba and Pedro also featured for the world champions.

- Abate, Montolivo and Balotelli played in Italy's 4-0 defeat by Spain in the UEFA EURO 2012 final. Alba was among the scorers for a Spain side also featuring Piqué, Xavi, Iniesta, Busquets, Fàbregas, and second-half substitute Pedro.
- Fàbregas had earlier scored in the countries' 1-1 group stage draw where the only Milan representative was Nocerino.
- Fàbregas hit the winning penalty when Spain overcame Italy in the UEFA EURO 2008 quarter-finals and struck Arsenal FC's opener in a 2-0 victory at Milan in the second leg of the 2007/08 round of 16, securing an identical aggregate success.
- Iniesta scored the extra-time winner as Spain overcame a Netherlands side featuring Nigel de Jong in the 2010 FIFA World Cup final.
- Christian Abbiati (Club Atlético de Madrid), Cristián Zapata (Villarreal CF), Kaká and Robinho (Real Madrid) have all had spells in Spanish football.
- Alexis Sánchez scored in Udinese Calcio's 4-4 draw at Milan in 2010/11. That was his solitary goal in seven league and cup meetings with Milan for Udinese.
- Javier Mascherano was in the Liverpool FC team beaten 2-1 by Milan in the 2007 UEFA Champions League final.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Philippe Mexès made his 50th UEFA Champions League appearance against AFC Ajax on matchday two.
- Alongside Cristiano Ronaldo, Mario Balotelli has had the most attempts on target in the competition this season (10). He has missed the target just once.

General information

- Christian Abbiati, who broke Sebastiano Rossi's record of 330 appearances as Milan keeper on 28 September, missed Saturday's 1-0 victory over Udinese Calcio with a calf injury. Balotelli missed out with a thigh problem. Brazilian goalkeeper Gabriel, who is not in Milan's UEFA Champions League squad, and Matías Silvestre made their club debuts.
- The Rossoneri have not won on their travels this season, losing two and drawing four.
- Nine of Milan's last 13 goals have come after the 81-minute mark.
- Stephan El Sharaawy has not played since 1 September because of a right thigh injury. Giampaolo Pazzini has been out since May with a knee problem. Daniele Bonera is back in training following a knee injury suffered in late July. Mattia De Sciglio, restricted to one appearance this season because of a knee injury, is also close to a return.

International duty

- Seven Milan players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Riccardo Montolivo, Ignazio Abate, Balotelli, Andrea Poli (Italy), Cristián Zapata (Colombia), Nigel de Jong (Netherlands), Sulley Muntari (Ghana).
- Muntari found the net in Ghana's 6-1 FIFA World Cup play-off victory against Egypt on 15 October.
- Balotelli scored a 76th-minute equaliser in the 2-2 draw against Armenia to ensure already-qualified Italy remained undefeated in qualifying.

Barcelona

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Barcelona have attempted (1,602) and completed (1,387) more passes than any other team, with the best completion percentage at 87%. They have also enjoyed a larger share of possession (64%) than any other team.
- Lionel Messi's matchday one treble against AFC Ajax made him the first player to score four UEFA Champions League hat-tricks. It was his 24th hat-trick for Barcelona.
- Last season the Blaugrana made a sixth consecutive appearance in the semis, a UEFA Champions League record. The 7-0 aggregate defeat by FC Bayern München was Barça's heaviest aggregate loss in UEFA competition.

General information

- Barcelona's club record eight-match winning start to the Liga ended on Saturday when they drew 0-0 at CA Osasuna. They were one shy of Real Madrid CF's league best of nine victories at the start of a campaign achieved in 1968/69.
- Saturday's draw with Osasuna was the first time in 65 games that Barcelona have been shut out in the Liga.
- Carles Puyol made his first appearance since March at Osasuna after recovering from knee surgery, while Messi was a second-half substitute after a hamstring problem. Javier Mascherano strained a hamstring on 24 September and was an unused replacement on Saturday.
- Gerardo Martino's side have kept eight clean sheets in 13 games in all competitions this season.
- Isaac Cuenca has not played this season after having knee surgery this summer while Ibrahim Afellay underwent an operation in August to correct a chronic right thigh complaint. Jordi Alba has been out since tearing his right hamstring on 14 September.

International duty

- Twelve Barcelona players were called up for senior international duty during the international break: Víctor Valdés, Gerard Piqué, Sergio Busquets, Xavi Hernández, Andrés Iniesta, Cesc Fàbregas, Pedro Rodríguez (Spain), Alexis Sánchez (Chile), Neymar, Daniel Alves (Brazil), Alex Song (Cameroon).
- Alexis registered two first-half goals in Chile's 3-3 draw in Colombia, another strike against Ecuador four days later helping the team to a 2-1 win that sealed a FIFA World Cup place.
- Holders Spain also qualified after wins against Belarus and Georgia, Xavi scoring in the 2-1 victory over the former.

- Neymar scored in Brazil's 2-0 friendly win against South Korea in Seoul.

- Grew up at Ajax, picking up the first of four UEFA Champions League titles when he was 19. After a season in Italy with Sampdoria he moved to Madrid, winning Europe's top club competition again in 1998.
- Returned to Italy in December 1999 to join Inter, switching to city rivals Milan in 2002. He lifted the Scudetto with the Rossoneri in 2004 and 2011, adding to previous championships in the Netherlands (1994, 1995) and Spain (1997).
- Became the first player to win the UEFA Champions League with three clubs in 2003 and landed the trophy for a fourth time in 2007, before helping Milan to FIFA Club World Cup glory the following December. He also got his hands on the UEFA Super Cup twice with the Diavolo.
- Scored four goals in his first seven outings for the Netherlands, including one on his debut in December 1994 against Luxembourg; represented the Oranje at three UEFA European Championships (1996, 2000, 2004) and one FIFA World Cup (1998), ending his international career in 2008 with 87 caps.
- After a decade at Milan, he went to Brazilian outfit Botafogo in 2012, helping them win the Carioca (Rio de Janeiro state) championship the next year, when he was named player of the tournament. On 14 January 2014 he announced his decision to quit playing to become Milan coach on a contract until 2016; enjoyed a victorious start five days later as the Rossoneri beat Hellas Verona FC 1-0.

FC Barcelona: Gerardo Martino

Coaching career: CA Almirante Brown, CA Platense, Instituto Atlético Central Córdoba, Club Libertad, Club Cerro Porteño, CA Colón, Paraguay, CA Newell's Old Boys, FC Barcelona

- An attacking central midfielder, Martino – commonly known as 'Tata' – took his first steps in the game at Newell's Old Boys, the club that would have a heavy influence on his playing and coaching career.
- Made first-team for Rosario-based side as a 17-year-old and went on to score 38 goals in a club record 505 appearances over three spells, captaining the team as they won four domestic titles in five years between 1988 and 1992.
- A former Argentina international, Martino's only experience in Europe as a player came with Tenerife where he scored once in 15 Liga games. Later influenced by Marcelo Bielsa, the 50-year-old began his coaching career in Argentina's lower divisions.
- Impressed in Paraguay with Libertad and Cerro Porteño, gaining championship-winning experiences that would lead to chance to take charge of Paraguay; took the national team to the 2010 FIFA World Cup quarter-finals and the Copa América final the following year.
- Agreed a return to Newell's in 2012 and immediately improved the side's fortunes, leading them to victory in the 2013 Torneo Final; subsequently agreed to take over at Barça on a two-year deal following Tito Vilanova's enforced departure.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League final: Did you know?

- Spain are the most successful nation with seven triumphs, one more than Italy. Spain's wins – 1998, 2000, 2002, 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2014 – came from 11 final dates while Italy were victorious in 1994, 1996, 2003, 2007 and 2010 from their 11 appearances. England emerged victorious in 1999, 2005, 2008 and 2012 and were losing finalists in 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011 while Germany were winners in 1997, 2001 and 2013 and runners-up in 1999, 2002, 2010, 2012 and 2013.
- No team has played in more finals than AC Milan, who made their sixth appearance in 2007. Real Madrid CF, however have four final victories (1998, 2000, 2002, 2014), one more than both AC Milan (1994, 2003, 2007) and FC Barcelona (2006, 2009, 2011).
- With 26, Italy has the most appearances per nation in all-time European Cup finals – of those 12 have ended in victory and 14 in defeat. Spain has recorded 14 wins from 24 final appearances; England has 12 wins from 19 final appearances, with Germany on 17 appearances, (seven wins), Portugal nine (four wins) and the Netherlands eight (six wins).
- There have been five finals between teams from the same country. In 2000 Real Madrid beat Valencia CF 3-0 at the Stade de France; three years later Milan defeated Juventus on penalties at Old Trafford; in 2008 Manchester United overcame Chelsea FC in Moscow, also on spot kicks; in 2013 FC Bayern München beat Borussia Dortmund 2-1 at Wembley and in 2014 Real Madrid overcame Club Atlético de Madrid 4-1 after extra time in Lisbon in the first European final between teams from the same city.
- In the previous 22 UEFA Champions League finals, there have been 16 outright wins and six matches decided on shoot-outs. A total of 59 goals have been scored with the most common results being 2-1, which has happened on five occasions; there have been four 1-1 draws, and three finals have finished 1-0.
- Sixteen European Cup finals have gone to extra time, including the 2014 decider. The finals of 1958, 1968, 1970, 1992 and 2014 were decided in the additional period, while the 1974 showpiece between Bayern and Club Atlético de Madrid ended 1-1 after 120 minutes with Bayern winning a replay. The other ten finals were settled by a penalty shoot-out after extra time: in 1984, 1986, 1988, 1991, 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012 when Chelsea defeated Bayern 4-3 in the shoot-out after a 1-1 draw.
- Milan's 4-0 win against FC Barcelona in the 1994 final remains the biggest winning margin and the Rossoneri were also involved in the highest scoring showpiece when they shared six goals with Liverpool in 2005 before penalties. In terms of the European Cup, Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960 remains the most impressive while Bayern (1974 v Club Atlético de Madrid) and Milan (1989 v FC Steaua Bucureşti) also recorded 4-0 successes.
- No player has scored a hat-trick in a UEFA Champions League final. Daniele Massaro (Milan 1994), Karl-Heinz Riedle (Borussia Dortmund 1997), Hernán Crespo (Milan 2005), Filippo Inzaghi (Milan 2007) and Diego Milito (FC Internazionale Milano 2010) all struck twice. In European Cup terms, Ferenc Puskás scored four goals in Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960, when Alfredo di Stéfano found the net three times; Puskás scored another final hat-trick in 1962 with Pierino Prati (Milan 1969) the only other player to have managed a final hat-trick.
- Only Raúl González (Madrid 2000 and 2002), Samuel Eto'o (Barcelona 2006 and 2009), Lionel Messi (Barcelona 2009 and 2011) and Cristiano Ronaldo (Manchester United FC 2008, Real Madrid CF 2014) have scored in two UEFA Champions League finals – part of an exclusive club of 17 players to have found the net in more than one European Cup showpiece. Di Stéfano and Puskás lead the list having each scored seven goals for Madrid.
- Paolo Maldini's goal 51 seconds into the 2005 showpiece is the fastest in a UEFA Champions League final.
- Jens Lehmann (2006) and Didier Drogba (2008) are the only players to be dismissed in a European Cup final.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) equalled.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United

(2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
