Match background

FC Barcelona have the opportunity to increase their lead at the top of Group H when they host AC Milan on matchday four.

- Gerardo Martino's Spanish title holders go into the game two points clear of second-placed Milan following the clubs' 1-1 draw at San Siro on 22 October and would take a big step towards a tenth successive appearance in the knockout rounds with a home victory.
- Milan will go to the group summit with a victory but they are visiting a stadium where their UEFA Champions League ambitions were extinguished by defeats in each of the last two seasons.

Previous meetings

- These famous names have squared off 18 times, Barcelona recording seven wins to Milan's five and scoring 27 goals to the Italian side's 22. Barcelona's record at home against the Rossoneri reads W4 D3 L1.
- Massimiliano Allegri's Milan won 2-0 at San Siro in the first leg of last season's last-16 encounter, Kevin-Prince Boateng (57) and Sulley Muntari (81) the scorers. Barcelona hit back, however, with four unanswered goals at the Camp Nou, Lionel Messi (5, 40), David Villa (55) and Jordi Alba (90) securing a 4-2 aggregate success.
- Jordi Roura was in charge of Barcelona for that last Camp Nou meeting on 12 March and the lineups were:
Barcelona: Valdés, Daniel Alves, Piqué, Mascherano (Puyol 77), Jordi Alba, Xavi, Busquets, Iniesta, Villa (Sánchez 75), Messi, Pedro (Adriano 84).
Milan: Abbiati, Abate, Mexès, Zapata, Constant, Flamini (Bojan 74), Ambrosini (Muntari 60), Montolivo, Boateng, El Shaarawy, Niang (Robinho 60).
- Barcelona earned a goalless draw at Milan in the first leg of their 2011/12 quarter-final meeting before prevailing 3-1 in the return. Messi hit two first-half penalties, either side of an Antonio Nocerino equaliser (32), with Andrés Iniesta (53) cementing victory for Josep Guardiola's side.
- The clubs also met in that season's group stage, Barcelona taking four points to consign Milan to second place. At the Camp Nou it finished 2-2, Thiago Silva (92) scoring Milan's equaliser after Pedro Rodríguez and Villa had overturned Pato's first-minute goal.
- Barcelona subsequently won 3-2 in Milan, Xavi Hernández hitting a 63rd-minute winner after Zlatan Ibrahimović and Boateng had cancelled out Mark van Bommel's own goal and Messi's penalty respectively.
- Frank Rijkaard's Barcelona were 1-0 aggregate winners against Carlo Ancelotti's Milan in the 2005/06 semi-finals, Ludovic Giuly's strike at San Siro proving decisive in a first leg featuring Víctor Valdés, Carles Puyol and Iniesta for Barcelona.
- Valdés, Puyol, Xavi and Iniesta are survivors of the clubs' encounters in the 2004/05 group stage. After losing 1-0 at San Siro a fortnight earlier, Barcelona made amends with a 2-1 home success on 2 November 2004, and ended up second behind Milan in a group also containing Celtic FC.
- The clubs' most high-profile encounter was the 1994 UEFA Champions League final, Fabio Capello's Milan winning 4-0 with goals from Daniele Massaro (22, 45), Dejan Savićević (47) and Marcel Desailly (58). Milan also prevailed when the pair met in the 1989 UEFA Super Cup, winning 1-0 at home after a 1-1 away draw.
- Barcelona won the sides' first two-legged contest 7-1 on aggregate in the first round of the 1959/60 European Champion Clubs' Cup.

Match background

- Barcelona got back to winning ways at the Camp Nou with their 4-0 victory over AFC Ajax on matchday one. Their 3-0 semi-final home loss to FC Bayern München in May is their only defeat in their last 23 UEFA Champions League home fixtures.
- Milan are unbeaten on their travels in this season's competition, having drawn 1-1 at PSV Eindhoven in the play-offs and AFC Ajax on matchday two.
- Milan lost twice in Spain last term, going down 1-0 at Málaga CF in the group stage in addition to their 4-0 reverse at Barcelona.
- Milan's overall away record against teams from Spain is W4 D6 L14. The Rossoneri have not won on any of their last five visits to the country, their last success having come in the 2009/10 group stage when Pato's 88th-minute strike sealed a 3-2 victory at Real Madrid CF.
- Barcelona's overall record against Italian visitors is W12 D5 L2.
- Barcelona won their first European Cup by beating UC Sampdoria 1-0 in the final at Wembley in 1992.

- Milan lost their first European Cup final 3-2 to Real Madrid in 1957/58.

Team ties

- Neymar scored for Brazil in a 4-2 win over an Italy side including Ignazio Abate, Mattia De Sciglio, Riccardo Montolivo, Stephan El Shaarawy and Mario Balotelli in the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup group stage.
- Only Montolivo played when Italy then faced Spain in a goalless semi-final. Montolivo scored his spot kick in the ensuing shoot-out but Xavi, Iniesta, Gerard Piqué and Sergio Busquets all converted theirs too as Spain won 7-6. Jordi Alba and Pedro also featured for the world champions.
- Abate, Montolivo and Balotelli played in Italy's 4-0 defeat by Spain in the UEFA EURO 2012 final. Alba was among the scorers for a Spain side also featuring Piqué, Xavi, Iniesta, Busquets, Cesc Fàbregas, and second-half substitute Pedro.
- Fàbregas had earlier scored in the countries' 1-1 group stage draw where the only Milan representative was Nocerino.
- Fàbregas hit the winning penalty when Spain overcame Italy in the UEFA EURO 2008 quarter-finals and struck Arsenal FC's opener in a 2-0 victory at Milan in the second leg of the 2007/08 round of 16, securing an identical aggregate success.
- Iniesta scored the extra-time winner as Spain overcame a Netherlands side featuring Nigel de Jong in the 2010 FIFA World Cup final.
- Christian Abbiati (Club Atlético de Madrid), Cristián Zapata (Villarreal CF), Kaká and Robinho (Real Madrid) have all had spells in Spanish football.
- Kaká failed to win in five visits to the Camp Nou with Madrid, recording three draws and two defeats. Robinho tasted victory at Barcelona once – a 1-0 Liga success in December 2007 – while Christian Zapata suffered a 5-0 defeat there with Villarreal in August 2011.
- Alexis Sánchez scored in Udinese Calcio's 4-4 draw at Milan in 2010/11. That was his solitary goal in seven league and cup meetings with Milan for Udinese.
- Javier Mascherano was in the Liverpool FC team beaten 2-1 by Milan in the 2007 UEFA Champions League final.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Barcelona's next draw in UEFA competition will be their 100th.
- Barcelona have the joint highest pass completion rate (86%) in the competition along with Paris Saint-Germain FC.
- Lionel Messi's matchday one treble against AFC Ajax made him the first player to score four UEFA Champions League hat-tricks. It was his 24th hat-trick for Barcelona.
- Last season the Blaugrana made a sixth consecutive appearance in the semi-finals, a UEFA Champions League record. The 7-0 aggregate defeat by FC Bayern München was Barça's heaviest aggregate loss in UEFA competition.
- Cesc Fàbregas and Alexis Sánchez are both a booking away from a ban after picking up two yellow cards.

General information

- Friday's 1-0 derby win at home to RCD Espanyol extended Barcelona's unbeaten start to life under new coach Gerardo Martino to 17 games.
- Alexis Sánchez has scored eight goals in his last seven outings for club and country.
- Martino's side have kept ten clean sheets in 17 games in all competitions this season.
- Isaac Cuenca has not played this term following knee surgery this summer, while Ibrahim Afellay had an operation in August to correct a thigh complaint. Jordi Alba has been out since tearing his right hamstring on 14 September; Adriano missed Friday's game having damaged his left hamstring.
- Barcelona's eight-match winning start to the Liga ended on 19 October when they drew 0-0 at CA Osasuna. They were one shy of Real Madrid's league best of nine victories at the start of a campaign achieved in 1968/69.
- Barcelona had won 21 successive home league games, their best run since 1974, before the Osasuna draw.
- That stalemate was the first time in 65 games that Barcelona had been shut out in the Liga. Carles Puyol made his first appearance since March at Osasuna after recovering from knee surgery.
- Jonathan Dos Santos could be out until April after suffering knee ligament damage in training on 23 October.
- Messi is in contention to receive the FIFA Ballon d'Or for the fifth successive season after being nominated for the 2014 award with Andrés Iniesta, Neymar and Xavi Hernández. The winner will be announced on 13 January.

- Milan have scored 596 goals in UEFA competition.
- Philippe Mexès made his 50th UEFA Champions League appearance against AFC Ajax on matchday two.

General information

- Saturday's 2-0 loss to ACF Fiorentina left Milan on 12 points from 11 Serie A games, though that is only two fewer than the same stage last term.
- The Rossoneri have not won on their travels this season, losing three and drawing four.
- Kakà scored the first goal of his second spell with the Rossoneri in the 1-1 draw against SS Lazio on 30 October.
- Mattia De Sciglio made his first appearance since August against Lazio having recovered from a knee injury but has not played since after the joint became swollen.
- Cristián Zapata is the only player who has been ever present for Massimiliano Allegri's side this term.
- Christian Abbiati broke Sebastiano Rossi's record of 330 appearances as Milan keeper on 28 September.
- Mario Balotelli had converted all the 21 penalties he had taken during his career before Pepe Reina saved his 22nd during the game lost 2-1 against SSC Napoli on 22 September. He made it 22 out of 23 on matchday two.
- Stephan El Sharaawy has not played since 1 September because of a right thigh injury. Giampaolo Pazzini has been out since May with a knee problem. Daniele Bonera is back in training following a knee injury suffered in late July.
- Milan will take on Swiss side BSC Young Boys in a friendly match at the Stade de Suisse on 16 November.

- An attacking central midfielder, Martino – commonly known as 'Tata' – took his first steps in the game at Newell's Old Boys, the club that would have a heavy influence on his playing and coaching career.
- Made first-team for Rosario-based side as a 17-year-old and went on to score 38 goals in a club record 505 appearances over three spells, captaining the team as they won four domestic titles in five years between 1988 and 1992.
- A former Argentina international, Martino's only experience in Europe as a player came with Tenerife where he scored once in 15 Liga games. Later influenced by Marcelo Bielsa, the 50-year-old began his coaching career in Argentina's lower divisions.
- Impressed in Paraguay with Libertad and Cerro Porteño, gaining championship-winning experiences that would lead to chance to take charge of Paraguay; took the national team to the 2010 FIFA World Cup quarter-finals and the Copa América final the following year.
- Agreed a return to Newell's in 2012 and immediately improved the side's fortunes, leading them to victory in the 2013 Torneo Final; subsequently agreed to take over at Barça on a two-year deal following Tito Vilanova's enforced departure.

AC Milan: Clarence Seedorf

Date of birth: 1 April 1976

Nationality: Dutch

Playing career: AFC Ajax, UC Sampdoria, Real Madrid CF, FC Internazionale Milano, AC Milan, Botafogo FR

Coaching career: AC Milan

- Grew up at Ajax, picking up the first of four UEFA Champions League titles when he was 19. After a season in Italy with Sampdoria he moved to Madrid, winning Europe's top club competition again in 1998.
- Returned to Italy in December 1999 to join Inter, switching to city rivals Milan in 2002. He lifted the Scudetto with the Rossoneri in 2004 and 2011, adding to previous championships in the Netherlands (1994, 1995) and Spain (1997).
- Became the first player to win the UEFA Champions League with three clubs in 2003 and landed the trophy for a fourth time in 2007, before helping Milan to FIFA Club World Cup glory the following December. He also got his hands on the UEFA Super Cup twice with the Diavolo.
- Scored four goals in his first seven outings for the Netherlands, including one on his debut in December 1994 against Luxembourg; represented the Oranje at three UEFA European Championships (1996, 2000, 2004) and one FIFA World Cup (1998), ending his international career in 2008 with 87 caps.
- After a decade at Milan, he went to Brazilian outfit Botafogo in 2012, helping them win the Carioca (Rio de Janeiro state) championship the next year, when he was named player of the tournament. On 14 January 2014 he announced his decision to quit playing to become Milan coach on a contract until 2016; enjoyed a victorious start five days later as the Rossoneri beat Hellas Verona FC 1-0.

UEFA Champions League final: Did you know?

- Spain are the most successful nation with seven triumphs, one more than Italy. Spain's wins – 1998, 2000, 2002, 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2014 – came from 11 final dates while Italy were victorious in 1994, 1996, 2003, 2007 and 2010 from their 11 appearances. England emerged victorious in 1999, 2005, 2008 and 2012 and were losing finalists in 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011 while Germany were winners in 1997, 2001 and 2013 and runners-up in 1999, 2002, 2010, 2012 and 2013.
- No team has played in more finals than AC Milan, who made their sixth appearance in 2007. Real Madrid CF, however have four final victories (1998, 2000, 2002, 2014), one more than both AC Milan (1994, 2003, 2007) and FC Barcelona (2006, 2009, 2011).
- With 26, Italy has the most appearances per nation in all-time European Cup finals – of those 12 have ended in victory and 14 in defeat. Spain has recorded 14 wins from 24 final appearances; England has 12 wins from 19 final appearances, with Germany on 17 appearances, (seven wins), Portugal nine (four wins) and the Netherlands eight (six wins).
- There have been five finals between teams from the same country. In 2000 Real Madrid beat Valencia CF 3-0 at the Stade de France; three years later Milan defeated Juventus on penalties at Old Trafford; in 2008 Manchester United overcame Chelsea FC in Moscow, also on spot kicks; in 2013 FC Bayern München beat Borussia Dortmund 2-1 at Wembley and in 2014 Real Madrid overcame Club Atlético de Madrid 4-1 after extra time in Lisbon in the first European final between teams from the same city.
- In the previous 22 UEFA Champions League finals, there have been 16 outright wins and six matches decided on shoot-outs. A total of 59 goals have been scored with the most common results being 2-1, which has happened on five occasions; there have been four 1-1 draws, and three finals have finished 1-0.
- Sixteen European Cup finals have gone to extra time, including the 2014 decider. The finals of 1958, 1968, 1970, 1992 and 2014 were decided in the additional period, while the 1974 showpiece between Bayern and Club Atlético de Madrid ended 1-1 after 120 minutes with Bayern winning a replay. The other ten finals were settled by a penalty shoot-out after extra time: in 1984, 1986, 1988, 1991, 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012 when Chelsea defeated Bayern 4-3 in the shoot-out after a 1-1 draw.
- Milan's 4-0 win against FC Barcelona in the 1994 final remains the biggest winning margin and the Rossoneri were also involved in the highest scoring showpiece when they shared six goals with Liverpool in 2005 before penalties. In terms of the European Cup, Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960 remains the most impressive while Bayern (1974 v Club Atlético de Madrid) and Milan (1989 v FC Steaua Bucureşti) also recorded 4-0 successes.
- No player has scored a hat-trick in a UEFA Champions League final. Daniele Massaro (Milan 1994), Karl-Heinz Riedle (Borussia Dortmund 1997), Hernán Crespo (Milan 2005), Filippo Inzaghi (Milan 2007) and Diego Milito (FC Internazionale Milano 2010) all struck twice. In European Cup terms, Ferenc Puskás scored four goals in Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960, when Alfredo di Stéfano found the net three times; Puskás scored another final hat-trick in 1962 with Pierino Prati (Milan 1969) the only other player to have managed a final hat-trick.
- Only Raúl González (Madrid 2000 and 2002), Samuel Eto'o (Barcelona 2006 and 2009), Lionel Messi (Barcelona 2009 and 2011) and Cristiano Ronaldo (Manchester United FC 2008, Real Madrid CF 2014) have scored in two UEFA Champions League finals – part of an exclusive club of 17 players to have found the net in more than one European Cup showpiece. Di Stéfano and Puskás lead the list having each scored seven goals for Madrid.
- Paolo Maldini's goal 51 seconds into the 2005 showpiece is the fastest in a UEFA Champions League final.
- Jens Lehmann (2006) and Didier Drogba (2008) are the only players to be dismissed in a European Cup final.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) equalled.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United

(2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
