Match background

Real Madrid CF have the advantage in Group B after winning their first two games and will be looking to extend their lead over Juventus to seven points when the teams meet on matchday three.

• Madrid – seeking a tenth European Cup – started with a 6-1 win at Galatasaray AŞ and followed up with a 4-0 home win over FC København, Cristiano Ronaldo adding two goals to his matchday one hat-trick. Juventus were held 1-1 in Copenhagen and then drew 2-2 at home to Galatasaray.

Previous meetings

- The fixture renews a rivalry between two teams who together have lifted this trophy four times since the onset of the UEFA Champions League from a total of seven appearances in the final.
- They met in the 1998 final in Amsterdam when a 66th-minute Predrag Mijatović goal ended the Merengues' 32-year wait to win their seventh European Cup title.
- The teams have faced each other 14 times all in the European Cup with home advantage proving key: Madrid's home record is W4 L2 while Juventus' is W5 L1. Those 14 games include that 1998 final and a 1961/62 European Cup quarter-final replay staged in Paris which Madrid (the nominal home team) won 3-1.
- They last met in the 2008/09 group stage when the Italian team won home and away. Juve won 2-1 in Turin, then Alessandro Del Piero scored twice at the Santiago Bernabéu in a 2-0 victory.
- The lineups in Madrid on 5 November 2008 were:

- It was one of two Juventus victories in their six away games against Madrid they also won 1-0 in the 1961/62 European Champion Clubs' Cup quarter-final, but lost 3-1 in a Paris replay. The other four games in Madrid all went the way of the home side although the 2008 win was the only time there was more than a single goal between the teams.
- Juventus have come out on top overall on the last three occasions the clubs have been paired together. However, Juve have lost 12 of their 19 visits to Spain, winning only three.
- The Italian club overturned a 2-1 first-leg defeat against Madrid in the 2002/03 semi-finals, winning 3-1 at home. In the final, the Bianconeri drew 0-0 with an AC Milan side coached by Carlo Ancelotti, who had an earlier spell in charge of Juve, after extra time. A 3-2 loss on penalties denied the Turin club a third European Cup.
- The 2008 Juventus defeat was the second of Madrid's three successive home losses against Italian visitors in the space of 19 months. Their overall home record against Serie A sides is W21 D2 L6.

Match background

- Madrid were Group D runners-up last season behind Borussia Dortmund. The two sides met again in the semi-finals
 when a 4-1 reverse in Germany set them on their way to a third successive semi-final elimination despite a 2-0 home
 success.
- · Madrid won four of their fixtures at the Santiago Bernabéu last season, drawing the other two.
- Juve, meanwhile, lost 2-0 home and away to FC Bayern München in last season's quarter-finals to end an unbeaten 18-game European run. They drew their first two away games and won the next two, extending their unbeaten away run in Europe to nine games before the defeat in Germany.

Team ties

- Carlo Ancelotti, twice a European Cup winner with AC Milan as a player before coaching victories in 2003 (against Juve) and 2007, coached Juventus between 1999 and 2001, with Antonio Conte captaining the side.
- Real Madrid assistant coach Zinédine Zidane played for Juve between 1996 and 2001 and was a team-mate of Conte.
- Xabi Alonso scored Liverpol FC's equalising third goal in the 3-3 draw against Ancelotti's Milan in the 2005 UEFA Champions League final in Istanbul. Andrea Pirlo missed from the spot as the English side won on penalties.
- Alonso and Pirlo were again midfield rivals two years later as Ancelotti's Milan defeated Liverpool 2-1 in the Athens final.
- Iker Casillas, Álvaro Arbeloa, Sergio Ramos, Xabi Alonso and Fernando Llorente were in Spain's victorious 2010 FIFA World Cup squad.

- Casillas saved two spot kicks as Spain defeated Gianluigi Buffon and Giorgio Chiellini's Italy 4-2 on penalties in Vienna in the UEFA EURO 2008 quarter-final. The game was goalless after 120 minutes.
- Alonso scored a penalty against Buffon for Spain in a Bari friendly on 10 August 2011. Italy, who also fielded Leonardo Bonucci, Chiellini, Claudio Marchisio and Pirlo, won 2-1.
- The same Juventus quintet plus Andrea Barzagli were defeated 4-0 by a Spain team captained by Casillas and including Ramos, Alonso and Arbeloa, in the UEFA EURO 2012 final in Kyiv. Angelo Ogbonna and Sebastian Giovinco were unused Italy substitutes.
- Giovinco and Pirlo scored in the shoot-out along with Ramos as Spain defeated Italy 7-6 on penalties in the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup semi-final in Fortaleza after a goalless 120 minutes. Bonucci missed the the decisive penalty.
- Llorente scored five times twice at the Santiago Bernabéu against Madrid in his total of 85 goals for Athletic Club. He was on the winning side just once in 17 encounters with the Merengues, Athletic losing the other 16 games.
- · Carlos Tévez and Ángel Di María are team-mates for Argentina.
- Paul Pogba and Raphaël Varane both made their France debuts on 22 March 2013 in a World Cup qualifier against Georgia at the Stade de France. Karim Benzema also played in that 3-1 victory.
- Martín Cáceres played in Spain for RC Recreativo de Huelva, FC Barcelona and Sevilla FC. He scored once against Madrid but lost all five encounters with the Merengues.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Madrid are the tournament's ten-goal highest scorers, with Cristiano Ronaldo's five strikes making him the leading goalscorer. Ángel Di María leads the way in the assist stakes with three.
- Ronaldo was the 12-goal top scorer in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League. He has found the net 24 times in his last 20 matches in the competition, registering 53 times in all.
- Jesé Rodríguez made his UEFA Champions League debut in the matchday two win against FC København.

General information

- Ronaldo, Madrid's fifth highest all-time scorer, has struck 16 goals in his last 11 outings for the club. He signed a three-year contract that ties him to Madrid until 2018 on 15 September.
- Carlo Ancelotti's seven-match unbeaten start as Madrid boss ended on 28 September with a 1-0 derby defeat at home to Club Atlético de Madrid.
- Gareth Bale sustained a left thigh strain while warming up for the Getafe CF game on 22 September, a problem that resurfaced in the defeat by Atlético. He returned as a substitute on Saturday, winning a late penalty that Ronaldo converted to seal a 2-0 win against Málaga CF.
- Xabi Alonso has not played since suffering a broken foot in August.

International duty

- There were 11 Madrid players called up for senior duty during the international break: Sami Khedira (Germany), Isco, Iker Casillas, Sergio Ramos, Álvaro Arbeloa (Spain), Fábio Coentrão, Ronaldo, Pepe (Portugal), Luka Modrić (Croatia), Marcelo (Brazil), Di María (Argentina).
- Khedira opened the scoring in the 3-0 win at home to the Republic of Ireland on 11 October that sealed Germany's FIFA World Cup place.
- Benzema ended his 16-month international goal drought as France defeated Australia 6-0 in a friendly and was on target again as Les Bleus concluded their qualifying campaign with a 3-0 win at home to Finland last Tuesday.

Juventus

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- · Like last season, Juventus have collected two draws from their first two group stage games this term.
- Fernando Llorente made his UEFA Champions League debut on matchday two against Galatasaray AŞ. He played 34 UEFA Europa League games scoring 16 times for his former team Athletic Club.
- Juventus have attempted 65 crosses; more than any other team in the competition.

General information

- Juventus suffered a first defeat of the season on Sunday, conceding four times in the final 14 minutes to go down 4-2 at ACF Fiorentina. It was the first time they had shipped four goals in a game under Antonio Conte.
- The Italian champions had made it four Serie A wins in a row on 6 October with a 3-2 success against AC Milan.
- Llorente marked his first start for Juventus with the winning goal against Hellas Verona FC on 22 September.
- Juventus have scored in 21 successive Serie A encounters since a 1-0 loss to AS Roma on 16 February.
- Mirko Vučinić and Stephan Lichtsteiner have not played since suffering muscle injuries on matchday two. On 15 October Fabio Quagliarella suffered a thigh injury that is expected to keep him out for three weeks.
- Martín Cáceres has not played since suffering a knee injury while on international duty with Uruguay on 8 September. Simone Pepe has not played a competitive game since 17 November 2012 because of a thigh injury.

International duty

- Nine Juventus players were called up for senior duty during the international break: Gianluigi Buffon, Leonardo Bonucci, Giorgio Chiellini, Claudio Marchisio, Andrea Pirlo (Italy), Paul Pogba (France), Kwadwo Asamoah (Ghana), Mauricio Isla, Arturo Vidal (Chile).
- On 11 October, Buffon became Italy's most capped player, surpassing Fabio Cannavaro with his 137th appearance in a 2-2 draw in Denmark.
- Vidal opened the scoring from the penalty spot in Chile's 3-3 draw against Colombia in FIFA World Cup qualifying.

- One of only six people to have lifted the European Champion Clubs' Cup as both a player and coach. A combative midfielder, he helped Roma win the 1983 Serie A title and four Italian Cups before joining Milan in 1986 where he added two more league championships, as well as back-to-back European Cup triumphs in 1989 and 1990.
- Began coaching in 1995 with a year at Reggiana, earning them promotion from Serie B, before two seasons at Parma. Replaced Marcello Lippi at Juventus in February 1999 and returned to San Siro as coach of Milan in 2001.
- During eight seasons in charge, won the UEFA Champions League in 2003 and 2007, but lost the 2005 final on penalties to Liverpool FC after leading 3-0. Milan also won a Serie A title, a Coppa Italia and the 2007 FIFA Club World Cup.
- Resigned on 31 May 2009 and was named as Chelsea's new manager the following day. His first season in London ended with the club winning the league and cup double for the first time. Dismissed at the end of his second campaign, Ancelotti took charge of Paris in December 2011.
- In his one full season in the French capital, 2012/13, Ancelotti steered Paris to their first Ligue 1 title in 19 years before leaving to take over at Madrid on a three-year contract, winning the Copa del Rey in his first season.

Juventus: Antonio Conte

Date of birth: 31 July 1969

Nationality: Italian

Playing career: US Lecce, Juventus

Coaching career: AC Siena (assistant), USD Arezzo, AS Bari, Atalanta BC, AC Siena, Juventus

- A combative and versatile midfielder, Conte also weighed in with his share of goals usually spectacular.
- Made Serie A debut with hometown club Lecce aged 16 in 1985/86 but was not a regular until 1988/89 when his side returned to the top flight after two seasons away. Joined Juventus in November 1991.
- Spent the next 13 seasons at Juve, later describing the famous black-and-white shirt as his "second skin". Won five Scudettos, the UEFA Champions League in 1995/96 and the UEFA Cup in 1992/93 in addition to triumphs in the UEFA Super Cup, Italian Cup and a European/South American Cup, wearing the captain's armband from 1996. Capped 20 times by Italy, he was part of the squads that finished runners-up at the 1994 FIFA World Cup and UEFA EURO 2000.
- Started coaching career as assistant at Siena in 2005, taking over Serie B side Arezzo the following season. After leading Bari and Siena to the top flight in 2009 and 2011 respectively, he signed a two-year contract with Juventus.
- Wasted no time in revamping the squad and enjoyed a debut season to remember as the Bianconeri claimed the Scudetto without losing a single game, suffering their sole defeat of the season against SSC Napoli in the Coppa Italia final. After signing a new contract until 2015, he duly guided Juventus to a second successive title in 2013.






