Match background

When RSC Anderlecht and Olympiacos FC come face to face on matchday two in the UEFA Champions League Group C, it will be their first competitive meeting for 39 years.

• Both teams need points having each lost their first fixture. While Anderlecht went down 2-0 at SL Benfica, Olympiacos FC were beaten 4-1 at home by Paris Saint-Germain FC.

Previous meetings

- The teams played a friendly game in Piraeus on 7 August which Olympiacos won 1-0 thank to a Dimitris Siovas goal.
- The last time this fixture was played on the European stage was in autumn 1974 in the European Champion Clubs' Cup second round. Anderlecht were 5-1 home winners but had to withstand an almighty second-leg scare in Patras as Maik Galakos scored a hat-trick for Olympiacos, who nevertheless bowed out after only managing a 3-0 success.
- Anderlecht are unbeaten in their last seven competitive fixtures against Greek sides, winning four and drawing three. Their only other defeat came in a 2002/03 UEFA Cup fourth round tie, 3-0 against Panathinaikos FC. Their overall record is W5 D5 L2 (W4 D2 L0 at home).
- Anderlecht's last six meetings with Greek opponents have come against AEK Athens FC, in the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League group stage and the 2010/11 and 2011/12 UEFA Europa League group stage. They recorded three victories and three draws, but won three of their last four fixtures.
- Olympiacos' only other experience of Belgian opponents came in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League group stage, when they beat R. Standard de Liège 2-1 at the Georgios Karaiskakis Stadium but went down 2-0 in the return.

Match background

- In their tenth UEFA Champions League participation, Anderlecht finished bottom of Group C last season and suffered the same fate in all the other five group stage campaigns since progressing to the second group stage in 2000/01.
- In those six seasons they have won just four fixtures and when they beat FC Zenit 1-0 on matchday four in last season's competition it was their first home success in the UEFA Champions League proper in nine years.
- In 2012/13, when Anderlecht returned to the competition proper after four qualifying failures, the Belgian champions lost their two other home games, against AC Milan and Málaga CF.
- Olympiacos, in the group stage for the 15th time and their third in succession, reached the 1998/99 guarter-finals.
- Last season they finished third in Group B, losing away games at Arsenal FC and FC Schalke 04 and winning 2-1 at Montpellier Hérault SC. The previous season they also finished third in their section, losing away against Arsenal and Borussia Dortmund while winning in France against Olympique de Marseille.

Team ties

- Míchel was in the starting lineup for both Real Madrid CF's dramatic encounters against Anderlecht in the 1984/85 UEFA Cup second round. Madrid lost 3-0 in Brussels but won the return 6-1 to go through.
- Kostas Manolas played in three of AEK's UEFA Europa League games against Anderlecht and was sent off in Brussels on 15 September 2011, when the Belgian club won 4-1. Anderlecht team-mates Olivier Deschacht and Silvio Proto played the full 360 minutes across the two seasons.
- Anthony Vanden Borre was on target when Anderlecht met AEK in the UEFA Champions League group stage on 6 December 2006, scoring the opener in a 2-2 draw.

- Anderlecht have conceded 449 goals in UEFA competition.
- Anderlecht scored four times in the group stage last season, with only one-goal GNK Dinamo Zagreb netting fewer.
- The 1-0 home win against FC Zenit in last season's competition was the Belgian club's first UEFA Champions League home win in nine years, since defeating Olympique Lyonnais 1-0 in the 2003/04 group stage.

General information

- Two Massimo Bruno goals helped John van den Brom's men defeat second-tier KAS Eupen 7-0 at home in the Belgian Cup on 25 September. Anthony Vanden Borre featured for the first time this season, while 17-year-old Andy Kawaya made his club debut. Anderlecht will visit KVC Westerlo in the last 16 on 4 December.
- Anderlecht suffered their biggest league defeat since 3 October 2010 a 5-1 reverse against R. Standard de Liège when they lost 4-0 at Club Brugge KV on 22 September. They bounced back to defeat K. Lierse SK 2-0 on Sunday.
- Mitrović was given a three-match ban for an incident with Club Brugge fans at full time. He marked his first start for the club with two goals in a 5-0 victory over KV Mechelen on 14 September, Anderlecht's biggest win of 2013.
- Ronald Vargas underwent surgery on his left knee in July and is expected to be out until early November.
- Only Gillet has played the full 810 minutes of the first nine league matches: six wins and three losses.
- Matías Suárez has scored six league goals this term, already more than his injury-hit 2012/13 haul of three.

Olympiacos

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Olympiacos have conceded 199 European Cup goals. Their next defeat in UEFA competition will be their 100th.
- The Greek champions are 26 games without a draw in UEFA competition, winning 13 and losing 13 since their UEFA Champions League meeting at AZ Alkmaar ended goalless on 24 November 2009.
- Only eight players registered for last season's group stage feature this time round: Balázs Megyeri, José Holebas, Giannis Maniatis, Kostas Mitroglou, David Fuster, Dimitris Siovas, Kostas Manolas and Paulo Machado.

General information

- Salino returned after two weeks out with a hamstring problem as Olympiacos won 2-0 at Panionios on Saturday. Yatabaré sat the game out with a foot injury while Bong was rested after recovering from an ankle knock.
- On 25 September, Avraam Papadopoulos (out since April with a knee problem) made his comeback as captain in a 5-1 home victory against third-tier Fokikos FC in the first leg of the teams' Greek Cup second round tie. Marko Šćepović (2), Campbell, Yatabaré and Olaitan all opened their Olympiacos goalscoring accounts.
- Mitroglou scored back-to-back hat-tricks for Olympiacos last month, following his three-goal haul in the 5-0 win at Levadiakos FC on 1 September the first of his career with another 13 days later against Skoda Xanthi FC.
- The Levadiakos success was the first time the Piraeus outfit have hit five away from home in over six years.

• David Fuster (out since 17 September, hamstring) and Machado (22 September, knee) are unlikely to play on matchday two.

Head coach

RSC Anderlecht: John van den Brom

Date of birth: 4 October 1966

Nationality: Dutch

Playing career: Vitesse (twice), AFC Ajax, Istanbulspor AŞ, De Graafschap **Coaching career:** AGOVV Apeldoorn, ADO Den Haag, Vitesse, RSC Anderlecht

- Signed his first professional contract with Vitesse in 1986, spending seven seasons with the Arnhem side and scoring 80 goals. The midfielder, who won two Netherlands caps, earned a move to Ajax and was part of the squad that lifted the 1995 UEFA Champions League, although he played no part in the final.
- Tried his luck in Turkey at Istanbulspor in 1995/96 but lasted one season before returning for five more years with Vitesse, hanging up his boots in 2003 after a short spell at De Graafschap.
- Returned to Ajax as second-team coach, becoming head of youth development in 2005. Took the reins at second-tier AGOVV two years later and guided the club to the promotion play-offs in his final season.
- Earned a promotion of his own in 2010, being named Den Haag coach, and he duly took the club into Europe for the first time in 23 years. In June 2011 Vitesse convinced Van den Brom to make a heart-warming return and he rewarded their faith by leading the club into the UEFA Europa League via the end-of-season play-offs.
- Left for Anderlecht in May 2012, making an immediate impression by winning the Belgian Super Cup and masterminding Anderlecht's return to the UEFA Champions League group stage after a six-season hiatus. Things got even better when he ended his first season in Brussels holding the league championship trophy.

Olympiacos FC: Míchel

Date of birth: 23 March 1963

Nationality: Spanish

Playing career: Real Madrid CF, Atlético Celaya

Coaching career: Rayo Vallecano de Madrid, Real Madrid Castilla, Getafe CF, Sevilla FC, Olympiacos FC

- Joined Real Madrid aged 13, rising through the club's ranks before winning the second division championship with 'B' side Real Madrid Castilla. Subsequently stepped up to the first team and would later become one of five key homegrown players known as La Quinta del Buitre, or The Vulture (Emilio Butragueño) and Co.
- The right-sided midfielder played in 559 official games for the capital outfit with whom he won among other titles six Ligas and back-to-back UEFA Cups (1985, 1986). Míchel also represented Spain at youth, Under-21 and senior level, scoring 21 goals in 66 appearances for La Roja between 1985 and 1992.
- Led Rayo Vallecano to fifth place in the Spanish third tier in his first stint as coach in 2005. Subsequently headed back to Madrid to take charge of Castilla, but it was at Getafe where his reputation as a tactician grew, helping the club to avoid relegation on the last day of the 2009/10 campaign.
- Enjoyed a brief stint at Sevilla before deciding to pursue a career outside Spain. In February 2013, he was appointed by Olympiacos, taking over from UEFA EURO 2004-winning goalkeeper Antonis Nikopolidis, who had stepped in as interim coach a month earlier when the Piraeus club fired Leonardo Jardim.
- Shortly after his appointment, Olympiacos failed to make it past the UEFA Europa League round of 32, succumbing to Levante UD. They were well on their way to their 40th league title, though, the first of Míchel's coaching career, while they also secured the domestic double by beating Asteras Tripolis FC in the Greek Cup final.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Mario Gomez for FC Bayern München on matchday eight in 2011/12.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.






