Match background

SL Benfica and Olympiacos FC will both be looking for their second win in Group C when they come face to face in Lisbon on matchday three.

• Benfica followed their 2-0 home victory over RSC Anderlecht by losing 3-0 away to Paris Saint-Germain FC while the Greek champions went down 4-1 at home to PSG but bounced back in Belgium, winning 3-0.

Previous meetings

- The clubs met in Piraeus in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup group stage when Olympiacos won 5-1. They took an early 3-0 lead with goals from Luciano Galletti (1), Christos Patsatzoglou (17) and Diogo (24) and led 4-1 at half-time after David Luiz (33) had pulled one back and Fernando Belluschi (44) had restored the three-goal difference. Diogo (53) completed the scoring; Maxi Pereira and Rúben Amorim both featured for Benfica with Óscar Cardozo on the bench and Avraam Papadopoulos in the home team.
- The teams at the Georgios Karaiskakis Stadium on 27 November 2008 were:

Olympiacos: Nikopolidis, Patsatzoglou, Domi, Galletti (Leto 59), Santo (Kovačević 69), P Djordjević, Antzas, Dudu, Papadopoulos, Belluschi (Óscar González 76), Pantos.

Benfica: Quim, Reyes, Maxi Pereira, David Luiz, Rúben Amorim (Javier Balboa 59), Binya, Jorge Ribeiro, Yebda (Carlos Martins 76), Sidnei, Suazo, Nuno Gomes (Urreta 56).

- The sides had met in the 1973/74 European Champion Clubs' Cup first round, when Benfica enjoyed 1-0 wins home and away. In the second round of the same competition ten years later, the aggregate score was 3-1 in the Portuguese side's favour, the Lisbon game ending 3-0 to the home side.
- Their five games to date have produced three wins for Benfica and two for Olympiacos. The Greek side have still to score in the Portuguese capital.
- Including those five matches, Olympiacos have played 11 matches against Portuguese opposition. Their away record is W0 D1 L4.
- Benfica have also played 11 games against Greek sides overall, winning four and losing one at home. The sole reverse was a 2-1 loss against PAOK FC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup second round second leg; having won by the same score away, Benfica won the subsequent penalty shoot-out 4-1.

Match background

- Benfica, in their ninth UEFA Champions League campaign and on a run of seven successive home wins in Europe, finished third in their group last season. At home they lost 2-0 to FC Barcelona before beating FC Spartak Moskva 2-0 and Celtic FC 2-1.
- The Portuguese side subsequently entered the UEFA Europa League and won all four home games en route to the final, where they lost 2-1 to Chelsea FC.
- Olympiacos, in the group stage for the 15th time and a third season in succession, reached the 1998/99 quarter-finals.
- Last season they finished third in Group B, losing at Arsenal FC and FC Schalke 04 and winning 2-1 at Montpellier Hérault SC. The previous season they also finished third in their section, losing away against Arsenal and Borussia Dortmund while winning in France against Olympique de Marseille.

Team ties

- Javier Saviola spent three seasons with Benfica from 2009 to 2012, winning the Portuguese title in 2009/10 and the League Cup three times. In 122 matches he scored 39 goals.
- Saviola and fellow Argentinian Ezequiel Garay were team-mates at Benfica in 2011/12 having also played together at Real Madrid CF in 2008/09.
- Roberto played for Benfica in 2010/11, helping them reach the UEFA Europa League semi-finals. He made 41 starts.
- Ljubomir Fejsa spent two seasons at Olympiacos before moving to Benfica this summer. He made 33 appearances, scoring once.
- Paulo Machado is a product of FC Porto's youth system and faced Benfica on six occasions with CF Estrela da Amadora, UD Leiria and Leixões SC. He scored Amadora's goal in a 2-1 home defeat by Benfica on 4 March 2006.
- Machado is a team-mate of Rúben Amorim, Sílvio, André Almeida and André Gomes with Portugal.
- Leandro Salino faced Benfica 12 times while with CD Nacional and SC Braga. In the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League semi-finals he helped Braga overcome Benfica to advance to the final.
- During three years at Braga, Salino was a team-mate of Sílvio, Artur, Lima and Rúben Amorim.

• The Estádio do Sport Lisboa e Benfica has special meaning for Greek football as it is where Greece were crowned UEFA EURO 2004 champions by beating Portugal 1-0.

- Benfica have conceded 398 goals in UEFA competition.

General information

- Sílvio, fit after a knee problem, made his debut on Saturday as Benfica beat third-tier CD Cinfães in the Portuguese Cup third round, Ola John scoring the only goal of the game. Rúben Amorim shook off a thigh problem to start.
- Lazar Marković withdrew from this month's Serbia U21 national squad after suffering a thigh injury on 6 October. He, Rodrigo (knee), André Gomes and Miralej Sulejmani (both thigh) missed Saturday's game.
- Eduardo Salvio has not been registered for the UEFA Champions League after tearing knee ligaments in the 1-1 draw against Sporting Clube de Portugal on 31 August. He is expected to be out until the new year.
- Jorge Jesus is in his fifth season in charge and is Benfica's longest-serving coach since Otto Glória (1954-59).
- Benfica lost 2-1 at CS Marítimo on the opening day of the season and have now gone a record nine years without winning in round one. Giovanni Trapattoni was at the helm the last time they managed it.

International duty

- The club had five players on international duty: André Almeida (Portugal), Nemanja Matić (Serbia), Ezequiel Garay (Argentina), Maxi Pereira (Uruguay), Óscar Cardozo (Paraguay).
- Almeida made his Portugal debut in a 1-1 draw with Israel on 11 October, playing the full 90 minutes again four days later in a 3-0 win against Luxembourg.

Olympiacos

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Kostas Mitroglou became the first Greek player to score a UEFA Champions League hat-trick at RSC Anderlecht on matchday two. The forward is now third in Olympiacos' all-time European scoring standings with 12 goals, behind Nikos Anastopoulos (14) and Predrag Djordjević (15).
- Olympiacos have conceded 199 European Cup goals. Their next defeat in UEFA competition will be their 100th.
- The Greek champions are 27 games without a draw in UEFA competition, winning 14 and losing 13 since their UEFA Champions League meeting at AZ Alkmaar ended goalless on 24 November 2009.
- Only eight players registered for last season's group stage feature this time round: Balázs Megyeri, José Holebas, Giannis Maniatis, Mitroglou, David Fuster, Dimitris Siovas, Kostas Manolas and Paulo Machado.
- Roberto saved penalties on the first two matchdays, denying Paris Saint-Germain FC's Zlatan Ibrahimović and Anderlecht's Aleksandar Mitrović.

General information

- On 25 September, Avraam Papadopoulos (out since April with a knee problem) made his comeback in a 5-1 victory over third-tier Fokikos FC in the Greek Cup. He started again on Saturday as Olympiacos won 4-1 at Platanias FC; Leandro Salino returned to the side after a hamstring problem suffered at the end of September.
- Gaëtan Bong (groin) and Holebas (quadriceps) missed Saturday's win with injuries picked up on international duty while Sambou Yatabaré was left out after returning late from representing Mali.
- Mitroglou netted his fourth hat-trick of the season in the 6-0 win against Veria FC on 6 October, his second back-to-back treble of 2013/14. He had never scored a hat-trick before this term.
- Machado has been out with a knee injury since 22 September.

International duty

- There were 13 Olympiacos players called up for senior duty during the international break: Maniatis, Siovas, Mitroglou, Holebas, Andreas Samaris, Manolas (Greece), Vladimír Weiss (Slovakia), Carl Medjani (Algeria), Bong (Cameroon), Balázs Megyeri (Hungary), Yatabaré (Mali), Joel Campbell (Costa Rica), Roy Carroll (Northern Ireland).
- Samaris earned his first cap for Greece on 15 October, coming off the bench in a 2-0 win against Liechtenstein.
- Medjani scored Algeria's second goal in their 3-2 FIFA World Cup play-off first leg loss to Burkina Faso.

- A midfielder at Sporting, Jesus enjoyed a long if low-key career with a number of smaller Portuguese sides before moving into coaching with fourth division Amora after hanging up his boots in 1989, leading them to a title.
- More success followed at Felgueiras, whom he led from the third division to the Liga in successive seasons, though they were relegated in their third campaign under his command in 1995/96.
- Further Liga experience came at hometown side Estrela da Amadora, Setúbal and Guimarães, though he endured another relegation with Moreirense in 2004/05. In 2006/07, he guided Belenenses to fifth place and the Portuguese Cup final, where despite losing to Sporting they earned a place in the UEFA Cup.
- Even better followed at Braga in 2008/09 as he guided them to UEFA Intertoto Cup success and subsequently the UEFA Cup round of 16. A fifth-place Liga finish prompted Benfica to lure him back to Lisbon in 2009 and Jesus rewarded their faith with the league title and League Cup in his debut campaign.
- After completing a hat-trick of Portuguese League Cup triumphs in 2012, Jesus's Benfica came tantalisingly close to an even bigger hat-trick in 2013, only to finish runners-up in both the Portuguese Liga and Cup and lose the UEFA Europa League final to Chelsea FC. Despite that disappointment, he signed a two-year contract extension in June 2013.

Olympiacos FC: Míchel

Date of birth: 23 March 1963

- Joined Real Madrid aged 13, rising through the club's ranks before winning the second division championship with 'B' side Real Madrid Castilla. Subsequently stepped up to the first team and would later become one of five key homegrown players known as La Quinta del Buitre, or The Vulture (Emilio Butragueño) and Co.
- The right-sided midfielder played in 559 official games for the capital outfit with whom he won among other titles six Ligas and back-to-back UEFA Cups (1985, 1986). Michel also represented Spain at youth, Under-21 and senior level, scoring 21 goals in 66 appearances for La Roja between 1985 and 1992.
- Led Rayo Vallecano to fifth place in the Spanish third tier in his first stint as coach in 2005. Subsequently headed back to Madrid to take charge of Castilla, but it was at Getafe where his reputation as a tactician grew, helping the club to avoid relegation on the last day of the 2009/10 campaign.
- Enjoyed a brief stint at Sevilla before deciding to pursue a career outside Spain. In February 2013, he was appointed by Olympiacos, taking over from UEFA EURO 2004-winning goalkeeper Antonis Nikopolidis, who had stepped in as interim coach a month earlier when the Piraeus club fired Leonardo Jardim.
- Shortly after his appointment, Olympiacos failed to make it past the UEFA Europa League round of 32, succumbing to Levante UD. They were well on their way to their 40th league title, though, the first of Michel's coaching career, while they also secured the domestic double by beating Asteras Tripolis FC in the Greek Cup final.

UEFA Champions League final: Did you know?

- Spain are the most successful nation with seven triumphs, one more than Italy. Spain's wins 1998, 2000, 2002, 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2014 came from 11 final dates while Italy were victorious in 1994, 1996, 2003, 2007 and 2010 from their 11 appearances. England emerged victorious in 1999, 2005, 2008 and 2012 and were losing finalists in 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2011 while Germany were winners in 1997, 2001 and 2013 and runners-up in 1999, 2002, 2010, 2012 and 2013.
- No team has played in more finals than AC Milan, who made their sixth appearance in 2007. Real Madrid CF, however have four final victories (1998, 2000, 2002, 2014), one more than both AC Milan (1994, 2003, 2007) and FC Barcelona (2006, 2009, 2011).
- With 26, Italy has the most appearances per nation in all-time European Cup finals of those 12 have ended in victory and 14 in defeat. Spain has recorded 14 wins from 24 final appearances; England has 12 wins from 19 final appearances, with Germany on 17 appearances, (seven wins), Portugal nine (four wins) and the Netherlands eight (six wins).
- There have been five finals between teams from the same country. In 2000 Real Madrid beat Valencia CF 3-0 at the Stade de France; three years later Milan defeated Juventus on penalties at Old Trafford; in 2008 Manchester United overcame Chelsea FC in Moscow, also on spot kicks; in 2013 FC Bayern München beat Borussia Dortmund 2-1 at Wembley and in 2014 Real Madrid overcame Club Atlético de Madrid 4-1 after extra time in Lisbon in the first European final between teams from the same city.
- In the previous 22 UEFA Champions League finals, there have been 16 outright wins and six matches decided on shoot-outs. A total of 59 goals have been scored with the most common results being 2-1, which has happened on five occasions; there have been four 1-1 draws, and three finals have finished 1-0.
- Sixteen European Cup finals have gone to extra time, including the 2014 decider. The finals of 1958, 1968, 1970, 1992 and 2014 were decided in the additional period, while the 1974 showpiece between Bayern and Club Atlético de Madrid ended 1-1 after 120 minutes with Bayern winning a replay. The other ten finals were settled by a penalty shoot-out after extra time: in 1984, 1986, 1988, 1991, 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012 when Chelsea defeated Bayern 4-3 in the shoot-out after a 1-1 draw.
- Milan's 4-0 win against FC Barcelona in the 1994 final remains the biggest winning margin and the Rossoneri were also involved in the highest scoring showpiece when they shared six goals with Liverpool in 2005 before penalties. In terms of the European Cup, Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960 remains the most impressive while Bayern (1974 v Club Atlético de Madrid) and Milan (1989 v FC Steaua Bucureşti) also recorded 4-0 successes.
- No player has scored a hat-trick in a UEFA Champions League final. Daniele Massaro (Milan 1994), Karl-Heinz Riedle (Borussia Dortmund 1997), Hernán Crespo (Milan 2005), Filippo Inzaghi (Milan 2007) and Diego Milito (FC Internazionale Milano 2010) all struck twice. In European Cup terms, Ferenc Puskás scored four goals in Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960, when Alfredo di Stéfano found the net three times; Puskás scored another final hat-trick in 1962 with Pierino Prati (Milan 1969) the only other player to have managed a final hat-trick.
- Only Raúl González (Madrid 2000 and 2002), Samuel Eto'o (Barcelona 2006 and 2009), Lionel Messi (Barcelona 2009 and 2011) and Cristiano Ronaldo (Manchester United FC 2008, Real Madrid CF 2014) have scored in two UEFA Champions League finals part of an exclusive club of 17 players to have found the net in more than one European Cup showpiece. Di Stéfano and Puskás lead the list having each scored seven goals for Madrid.
- Paolo Maldini's goal 51 seconds into the 2005 showpiece is the fastest in a UEFA Champions League final.
- Jens Lehmann (2006) and Didier Drogba (2008) are the only players to be dismissed in a European Cup final.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) equalled.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United

(2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
