Match background

SSC Napoli gained three points from their first home game in Group F and will be hoping to inflict a similar defeat on Olympique de Marseille having already won in France.

• Victors against Borussia Dortmund on matchday one, Napoli came unstuck in their second fixture, losing 2-0 at Arsenal FC, while Marseille began with a 2-1 home defeat against the Gunners and subsequently went down 3-0 in Germany. The French club made it three losses from three with a 2-1 defeat by Napoli last time out.

Previous meetings

- The sides had not met before the Stade Vélodrome game on 22 October.
- Napoli, in only their second UEFA Champions League group stage campaign, had not encountered French opponents since the 1992/93 UEFA Cup second round when a 2-0 home defeat against Paris Saint-Germain FC in which George Weah got both goals preceded a 0-0 draw away.
- Before the matchday three fixture, Napoli had scored only two goals in six contests with Ligue 1 clubs, winning 1-0 at home to Toulouse FC in the 1986/87 UEFA Cup first round first leg and by the same score at FC Girondins de Bordeaux in the third round of the same competition two years later. However, while the Italian club won by the same aggregate score in that 1988/89 tie, when they went on to lift the trophy, they lost 4-3 on penalties to Toulouse.
- Marseille took on FC Internazionale Milano in the 2011/12 UEFA Champions League round of 16, losing the away leg 2-1 but going through on away goals after a 1-0 win at home courtesy of an André Ayew goal in added time.
- It was OM's first defeat in Italy in four games; previously they had drawn 1-1 at AC Milan in the 2009/10 group stage and against SS Lazio in the 2005 Intertoto Cup semi-final. Before that they had won 1-0 away to Inter in the 2003/04 UEFA Cup guarter-final, going through 2-0 on aggregate.
- OM's overall results against Serie A sides are W7 D5 L7.
- Marseille beat Milan 1-0 in the 1993 UEFA Champions League final but lost 3-0 against Parma FC in the 1999 UEFA Cup final.

Match background

- Since returning to continental competition in 2008 after an absence of 13 years, Napoli had established a formidable home record and went unbeaten in 14 matches before PSV Eindhoven won 3-1 at the Stadio San Paolo in last season's UEFA Europa League group stage. It was the Serie A side's first home loss since a December 1994 defeat by Eintracht Frankfurt in the UEFA Cup third round.
- FC Viktoria Plzeň were also victorious in Naples last season, winning 3-0 in the round of 32 en route to a 5-0 aggregate triumph, meaning Napoli had lost their last two European home games before the matchday one success against Dortmund.
- Élie Baup's Marseille are in their ninth UEFA Champions League campaign with last season's absence ending a run of five successive years in the competition. The quarter-final appearance two years ago was their first since becoming the tournament's inaugural winners in 1993.
- They lost their last two away games in 2011/12, meaning they are on a three-match losing run on their travels in the UEFA Champions League.
- In last season's UEFA Europa League group stage, OM lost at VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach and AEL Limassol FC (0-3) and drew 2-2 at Fenerbahçe SK.

Team ties

- Rafael Benítez led Valencia CF to the 2003/04 UEFA Cup by beating OM 2-0 in the Gothenburg final.
- Benitez's Liverpool FC overcame Baup's Toulouse in the UEFA Champions League third qualifying round in 2007, winning 1-0 away and 4-0 at home.
- Mathieu Valbuena scored France's opening goal in a 2-1 friendly international win against an Italy side featuring Christian Maggio in Parma on 14 November 2012.
- Gonzalo Higuaín was born in Brest, France where his father Jorge was playing as a defender for Stade Brestois 29 in 1987/88. The Argentinian international striker has French citizenship.
- Abedi Pelé, the father of André and Jordan Ayew, played in Serie A with Torino FC between 1994 and 1996.
- · Gennaro Bracigliano's father was born in Campania, the region of Naples.

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Napoli are yet to lose in five home games in the competition, winning four.
- José Callejón has scored eight goals in 12 UEFA Champions League appearances, including seven in nine for previous club Real Madrid CF.

General information

- Napoli are unbeaten at home in the league in 2013, their last defeat at the Stadio San Paolo coming against Bologna FC on 12 December. Since then they have won 14 home top-flight matches out of 16.
- Marek Hamšík marked his 275th Napoli appearance with a goal on Saturday in a 2-0 win against Calcio Catania. He is now level with Bruno Gramaglia in sixth on the club's all-time list. Giuseppe Bruscolotti is top having played 511 games for the club between 1972 and 1988.
- Callejón was also on target against Catania, his sixth goal in 11 Serie A appearances equalling his record return for a league campaign set with RCD Espanyol in 2011/12.
- Dries Mertens scored his first goal for the club in the 2-1 win away to ACF Fiorentina on 30 October.
- Like last season under Walter Mazzarri, the Partenopei took maximum points from six of their first seven Serie A fixtures and, as with 2012/13, they lost in round eight to the leaders. They continued the pattern as they won next time out before deviating with victory in round ten: they were defeated at the same stage last term.
- Miguel Ángel Britos suffered a dislocated collarbone in the 2-0 defeat at AS Roma on 18 October. Camilo Zúñiga has not featured since suffering a knee injury ahead of that game while Giandomenico Mesto damaged ligaments in his right knee on Saturday.
- Lorenzo Insigne became the first Napoli player to appear for Italy at the Stadio San Paolo since Fernando De Napoli in 1990 when he took to the field for the Azzurri's 2-2 draw with Armenia on 15 October.
- Rafael Benítez has been shortlisted for the FIFA World Coach of the Year for Men's Football award, which will be announced on 13 January.

Marseille

UEFA milestones and competition statistics

- Matchday four will be the 100th European Cup game for Marseille, who have scored 148 goals to date.
- Nicolas N'Koulou is a booking away from a suspension after picking up yellow cards on matchdays one and two.

General information

- Jordan Ayew scored his first league goal since 26 January and Steve Mandanda saved a 75th-minute Nélson Oliveira penalty as OM drew 1-1 at Stade Rennais FC on Saturday. It ended a run of five successive defeats, Marseille's worst sequence since suffering seven losses in a row in February/March 2012.
- Lucas Mendes has not featured since going off with an ankle injury in the 1-0 defeat at OGC Nice on 18 October. Rod Fanni has not played since matchday three because of an adductor problem.
- Florian Thauvin, a €15m summer signing, scored his first goal for Marseille against Stade de Reims on 26 October but a late Prince Oniangue effort earned the visitors a 3-2 win at the Stade Vélodrome.
- André-Pierre Gignac, who won his first cap since the 2010 FIFA World Cup in France's 0-0 draw with Georgia on 6 September, ended a run of eight games without a goal against Reims. He scored in OM's first three games this term, his best start to a season.
- OM lost 2-1 at home to Paris Saint-Germain FC on 6 October despite taking the lead from the spot after Thiago Motta was sent off for a challenge on Mathieu Valbuena.
- Of Marseille's 21 wins in Ligue 1 last season, 18 were by a single goal and 12 ended 1-0.

- Although he played as a midfielder for Real Madrid's reserve team and two other lower ranking sides, injury prompted an early move into coaching. Having coached at youth and B-team level with Madrid, Benítez struck out on his own with Valladolid, Osasuna, Extremadura and Tenerife before getting his big break in 2001 at Valencia.
- Guided Valencia to a first league title for 31 years in 2002 and added a second championship two years later, when they also won the UEFA Cup.
- Joined Liverpool in June 2004, winning the UEFA Champions League in his first season, with the Reds beating AC Milan on penalties having come from 3-0 down in the final. Also won the 2006 FA Cup final on penalties after his side had come from 2-0 down to draw 3-3 with West Ham United FC.
- Left Anfield after six years in summer 2010, stepping into José Mourinho's shoes at Inter. Guided his new charges to victory in the Italian Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup but left following the latter competition in December 2010.
- Returned to management in November 2012 when he took over at Chelsea for the remainder of the season following Roberto Di Matteo's dismissal. In a short but successful stay he led Chelsea to victory in the UEFA Europa League final as well as third place in the Premier League. Took on a new challenge in late May 2013 when accepting Napoli's offer to take over from Walter Mazzarri, signing a two-year contract.

- The Pyrenean-born Baup's promising career as a goalkeeper ended at the age of 20 when a car crash left him with two broken bones in his neck.
- Having gained formal coaching qualifications, Baup put his theory into practice with amateur side Castelnaudary, doing enough to attract the attention of Toulouse, who put him in charge of their youth academy in 1984; Fabien Barthez was among his discoveries, and he was to move to St-Étienne in a similar capacity in 1991, briefly taking command of the senior team in 1996.
- Hired by Bordeaux in 1997, Baup embarked on the most successful spell of his career, with his Girondins selection pipping Marseille to the 1998/99 French title then beating FC Lorient 3-0 in the 2001/02 League Cup final, a victory best remembered for a tremendous Pauleta bicycle kick.
- Having regularly led Bordeaux in Europe, Baup was to return to UEFA competitions in subsequent spells with St-Étienne (2004-06) and Toulouse (2006-08), but took time out after his Nantes side were relegated from Ligue 1 at the end of the 2008/09 campaign.
- Following a successful spell as a TV pundit, Baup returned to coaching, replacing Didier Deschamps at Marseille in July 2012; his side started the 2012/13 season with a record six straight Ligue 1 wins en route to qualifying for the UEFA Champions League group stage as runners-up to Paris Saint-Germain FC.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Last season Chelsea FC became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Ten players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Zlatan Ibrahimović for Paris Saint-Germain on matchday three this season.
- · Barcelona have finished as group winners on 14 occasions, one more than Manchester United.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently Villarreal CF, FC Otelul Galați and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record that was equalled by FC Nordsjælland last season. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
